

# 2025 WIMBLEDON THE CHAMPIONSHIPS



# **Junior Tournament Preview**

In 1947, the first junior singles events were held at Wimbledon, with Denmark's Kurt Nielsen and Belgium's Geniveve Domken winning the inaugural tournaments. The boys' doubles and girls' doubles events were introduced in 1982. This is the 78th edition of the boys' singles and girls' singles tournaments here, and the 42nd editions of both the boys' doubles and girls' doubles tournaments. 2025 Wimbledon is the 138th staging of The Championships overall.

#### MCDONALD AND TAGGER BATTLE FOR PARIS-LONDON DOUBLE

Germany's Niels McDonald defeated compatriot Max Schoenhaus to win the boys' singles title at Roland Garros last month. McDonald, the No. 5 seed here, is bidding to become the 11th player to win the boys' singles titles at Roland Garros and Wimbledon in the same year – and the first since Tseng ChunHsin in 2018.

Austria's Lilli Tagger was victorious in the girls' singles at Roland Garros this year, defeating Hannah Klugman in the final. Tagger is the No. 3 seed here and will become the 9th player to win the girls' singles titles at Roland Garros and Wimbledon in the same year – and the first since Belinda Bencic in 2013 – if she also wins this event.

#### **GRAND SLAM CHAMPIONS IN THE DRAWS**

There are 3 Grand Slam junior singles champions competing here this year. In addition to McDonald and Tagger, 2024 US Open girls' singles champion Mika Stojsavljevic will also contest the girls' singles here.

There are 5 more Grand Slam boys' doubles champions playing at Wimbledon this year: Maxwell Exsted (2024 and 2025 Australian Open), Jan Kumstat (2025 Australian Open), Oskari Paldanius (2025 Roland Garros), Max Schoenhaus (2024 Wimbledon) and Alan Wazny (2025 Roland Garros)

There are also 4 more Grand Slam girls' doubles champions competing at Wimbledon this year: Eva Bennemann (2025 Roland Garros), Alena Kovackova (2023 Wimbledon), Kristina Penickova (2025 Australian Open) and Sonja Zhenikhova (2025 Roland Garros).

#### JONES BIDS FOR GRAND SLAM BREAKTHROUGH

Australia's Emerson Jones reached 2 Grand Slam girls' singles finals in 2024, falling to Renata Jamirchova at both the Australian Open and Wimbledon. She has entered the draw as No. 1 seed here this year – should she win the title, she will become the first Australian player to win the Wimbledon girls' singles title since Ashleigh Barty in 2011.

#### AT THE DOUBLE

The last player to win both junior singles and doubles titles at Wimbledon in the same year was Eugenie Bouchard, who won the girls' singles title and girls' doubles title (alongside Taylor Townsend) in 2012. The last player to win both boys' singles and boys' doubles titles at Wimbledon is Florin Mergea, who won the singles title and the doubles title (alongside Horia Tecau) in 2003.

#### **HOME CHAMPIONS**

Prior to 2023, Wimbledon had seen the longest wait for a home player to win the boys' singles title of the 4 Grand Slams – since 1962 when Stanley Matthews won the title. Henry Searle ended the drought by winning the 2023 boys' singles title.

Wimbledon has seen the 2nd-longest wait for a home player to win the girls' singles title of the 4 Grand Slams – Laura Robson was the most-recent British girls' singles champion at Wimbledon, winning the title here in 2008.

In total, there have been 7 British boys' singles champions and 7 British girls' singles champions (including 2-time champion Lorna Cornell) at Wimbledon since the competitions were established in 1947.

#### 2024 CHAMPIONS CONTINUE DEVELOPMENT

Aged 17, Renata Jamrichova remains eligible to compete at junior-level, but is currently focusing on her professional career and has not played any junior tournaments since winning the girls' singles title here last vear.

Jamrichova reached a career-high WTA ranking of No. 304 in March and is currently ranked at No. 327. She has contested women's singles qualifying at both the Australian Open and Wimbledon this year, reaching the 2nd round of qualifying at both events. She also competed in Billie Jean King Cup action for Slovakia (having made her debut in the competition in 2023), losing to USA's Hailey Baptiste in the Qualifiers Group C event in April. She has also made 3 appearances at WTA Tour events since winning the girls' singles title here last year, falling in the 1st round at Prague in July last year, and at Auckland and Merida earlier this year. Her best result in 2025 is reaching the semifinals at W75 Trnava in Slovakia in May.

Eighteen-year-old Nicolai Budkov Kjaer, who defeated Mees Rottgering in the boys' singles final here last year, played the boys' singles at the US Open last year following his triumph in London, finishing runner-up to Spain's Rafael Jodar at Flushing Meadows, before ending his junior career.

Budkov Kjaer reached a career-high ATP ranking of No. 287 in March and is currently ranked at No. 303. His best result in 2025 is winning his first Challenger-level title at the Glasgow Challenger (GBR) this year. He contested qualifying at a Masters-1000 event for the first time, falling to Bu Yunchaokete in the 1st round of qualifying at Monte Carlo-1000 and also reached the 2nd round of men's singles qualifying at Wimbledon this year. Having also made his international competition debut in 2023, he contested further Davis Cup matches in February this year, falling to both Tomas Martin Etcheverry and Mariano Navone in Norway's 2-3 defeat to Argentina in the 2025 Qualifiers 1st round in January.

#### **GRAND SLAM PREPARATION**

The Grand Slams are the pinnacle of the ITF World Tennis Tour Juniors, with J500 events representing the next-most prestigious level of tournament. There have been 4 events at J500-level in 2025 so far, with 4 different players claiming the girls' singles titles, while Italy's Jacopo Vasami and Spain's Andres Santamarta Roig have split the boys' singles titles with 2 each.

#### **GRASS COURT CHAMPIONS**

The J300 tournament at Roehampton is the only junior grass court event to have taken place prior to Wimbledon this year. Great Britain's Oliver Bonding overcame Bulgaria's Alexander Vasilev to win the boys' singles title, while USA's Julieta Pareja defeated Bulgaria's Elizara Yaneva in the girls' singles final.

J300 Roehampton champion Pareja leads the Tour for most girls' singles matches won at J300-level and above, ahead of Brazil's Victoria Luiza Barros.

#### **FUTURE GREATNESS**

2011 girls' singles champion Ashleigh Barty became the 4th player to win both the junior singles title and the women's singles titles at Wimbledon, with her victory here in 2021. There have also been 4 players who have won the boys' singles title and the men's singles title here – most recently 1998 boys' singles champion Roger Federer, who went on to win 8 men's singles titles here.

#### YOUNGEST AND OLDEST

The youngest players in the boys' singles and girls' singles tournaments here this year are British wild cards Aran Selvaraasan (14 years 248 days) and Megan Knight (14 years 162 days), respectively.

The oldest players in the boys' singles and girls' singles tournaments here this year are the Czech pair of Jan Kumstat (18 years 192 days) and Sarah Melany Fajmanova (18 years 126 days), respectively.

In the boys' draw there is one fourteen-year-old, one fifteen-year-old, 12 sixteen-year-olds, 25 seventeen-year-olds and 25 eighteen-year-olds. (NB all ages calculated on the last day of the tournament)

In the girls' draw there are 3 fourteen-year-olds, 8 fifteen-year-olds, 11 sixteen-year-olds, 26 seventeen-year-olds and 16 eighteen-year-olds. (NB all ages calculated on the last day of the tournament)

#### WILD CARDS

British players received all of the 8 available wild cards in the boys' singles draw: Conor Brady, Mark Ceban, Dyland Davies, Benjamin Gusic-Wan, Rhys Lawlow, Eric Lorimer, William Moxon and Aran Selvaraasan.

In the girls' singles draw, all of the 8 available wild cards also went to British players: Brooke Black, Daniella Britton, Ruby Cooling, Flora Johnson, Megan Knight, Allegra Korpanec Davies, Daniela Piani and Hollie Smart.

# **COUNTRY COUNTDOWN**

A total of 38 countries are represented in the junior singles draws at 2025 Wimbledon, with Great Britain having the most players competing in the girls' singles draw and overall, and USA having the most players competing in the boys' singles draw.
