



2025 WIMBLEDON QUAD WHEELCHAIR SINGLES FINAL NOTES Sunday 13 July

NO. 1 NIELS VINK (NED) v NO. 2 SAM SCHRODER (NED)

Head-to-head: Vink leads 25-13

A 39th meeting for Vink and Schroder, their 10th at a Grand Slam and 3rd at Wimbledon. The pair have split their 2 previous meetings at Wimbledon – Schroder defeated Vink in the final in 2022, before Vink defeated Schroder in the final last year. Vink leads both the overall head-to-head (25-13) and their head-to-head at the Grand Slams (5-4).

This is the pair's 5th meeting on grass. Vink leads their head-to-head on grass 3-1 – since falling to Schroder in the final here in 2022, he defeated Schroder in the final at both the British Open Roehampton (GBR) and Wimbledon in 2024, and again in the final at the British Open Roehampton (GBR) this year.

Of the pair's 38 previous meetings, 33 have come in the final of a tournament. Vink leads their head-to-head in finals 22-11 and has won 2 of the 3 finals they have contested in 2025. Schroder won the pair's final at the Australian Open, but Vink has won their meetings in the finals at Iizuka Fukuoka (JPN) and the British Open Roehampton (GBR) since then. The pair's last 25 meetings have come in the finals at tournaments.

Vink and Schroder have dominated the quad division since Dylan Alcott's retirement at the 2022 Australian Open, with one of the pair winning the title at 11 of the 13 Grand Slam tournaments since then. Schroder has won 6 Grand Slam titles in that time and Vink has won 5 titles.

Vink and Schroder are both former Wimbledon champions. Vink is bidding to become the 2nd player to win 3 or more Wimbledon wheelchair singles titles – after Diede de Groot, who has won the women's singles title here on 6 occasions. He would also become the first player to win 3 Wimbledon quad wheelchair singles titles, claiming sole ownership of the record for most titles here ahead of 2-time quad champion Dylan Alcott.

Schroder is bidding to equal Alcott and Vink's record of 2 quad wheelchair singles titles here. He will become one of 6 players to win multiple Wimbledon wheelchair singles titles if he wins today – alongside De Groot, Alcott, Vink, Stefan Olsson and the winner of today's men's wheelchair singles final between Tokito Oda and Alfie Hewett. Schroder is bidding to win his 8th Grand Slam title and close the gap on Alcott on the all-time list for most Grand Slam quad wheelchair singles titles. Vink is bidding to win his 6th Grand Slam title and equal Peter Norfolk and David Wagner in 2nd place on the list.

- VINK** is bidding to win his 3rd Wimbledon title on his 4th appearance at Wimbledon. He is making his 16th Grand Slam appearance overall.
- Vink is bidding to win his **7th Grand Slam singles title**. He has won titles at Roland Garros in 2022 (d. Schroder) and 2023 (d. Schroder), at Wimbledon in 2023 (d. Heath Davidson) and 2024 (d. Schroder), and at the 2022 US Open (d. Schroder).

- Vink is contesting his **12th Grand Slam singles final**. In addition to his 6 Grand Slam singles titles, he also reached the final at the US Open in 2021 (l. Alcott) and 2023 (l. Schroder), at 2022 Wimbledon (l. Schroder), at the Australian Open in 2023 and 2025 (l. Schroder), and at Roland Garros this year (l. Guy Sasson).
- Vink is bidding to win his **6th singles title of 2025**. He has won the title at the Melbourne Wheelchair Open (d. Sasson), the Cajun Classic (USA) (d. Ahmet Kaplan), Iizuka Fukuoka (JPN) (d. Schroder), Barcelona (ESP) (d. Sasson) and the British Open Roehampton (GBR) (d. Schroder).
- Vink is bidding to win his **52nd singles title** – and his 5th on grass, after his titles here in 2023 and 2024 and at the British Open Roehampton (GBR) in 2024 and 2025.
- Vink has **won 33 of the 35 matches he has contested in 2025**. His only defeats this season have come in the finals at the Australian Open and Roland Garros. In addition to the 5 individual singles titles he has won this year, he has also won 10 matches representing Netherlands at the Wheelchair World Team Cup.
- Vink has also **won 57 doubles titles** – including 11 Grand Slam doubles titles. He has won 9 Grand Slam doubles titles alongside Schroder, including at Wimbledon in 2022, 2023 and 2024. He has also won 2 Grand Slam doubles titles alongside Sasson – at both Roland Garros and Wimbledon this year.
- Vink won the **gold medal in quad singles at the Paris 2024 Paralympic Wheelchair Tennis Event**, where he defeated Schroder in the final to become the first Dutch player to win the quad singles gold medal at the Paralympics.
- Vink is a **4-time Paralympic medallist**. In addition to his gold medal in quad singles at Paris 2024, he also won the gold medal in quad doubles at Paris 2024 alongside Schroder. He also won the bronze medal in quad singles at Tokyo 2020, falling to Alcott in the semifinals before defeating Koji Sugeno in the bronze medal match, and partnered Schroder to win the gold medal in quad doubles at Tokyo 2020.
- Vink reached the **world No. 1 ranking** for the first time in December 2021. He has been ranked either No. 1 or No. 2 since March 2022. He began his latest spell as world No. 1 in January and will remain as world No. 1 on Monday regardless of the result in today's final.
- Vink is coached by Hans-Jurgen Striek.
- Lefthander **SCHRODER** is bidding to win his 2nd Wimbledon title on his 4th appearance in the final here.
- Schroder is bidding to win his **8th Grand Slam singles title**. He won his first title on his Grand Slam debut at the 2020 US Open (d. Dylan Alcott), when he became the first Dutch player to win a Grand Slam quad wheelchair singles title. He has since won the title at the Australian Open in 2022 (d. Alcott), 2023 (d. Vink), 2024 (d. Sasson) and 2025 (d. Vink), at 2022 Wimbledon (d. Vink) and at the 2023 US Open (d. Vink).
- Schroder is through to his **16th Grand Slam final**. In addition to his 7 Grand Slam title victories, he has also reached the final at the 2021 Australian Open (l. Alcott), at Roland Garros in 2021 (l. Alcott), 2022 and 2023 (l. Vink), and in 2024 (l. Sasson), at Wimbledon in 2021 (l. Alcott) and 2024 (l. Vink) and at the 2022 US Open (l. Vink).
- **Prior to Wimbledon this year**, Schroder finished runner-up at the British Open Roehampton (GBR) (l. Vink) but lost his opening match at Eastbourne (GBR) (l. Andy Lapthorne).
- Schroder is bidding to win his **3rd singles title of 2025**. In addition to his title at the Australian Open, he also won the title at Seoul (KOR) (d. Ahmet Kaplan). He also finished runner-up at Iizuka Fukuoka (JPN) (l. Vink) and reached the semifinals at the Melbourne Wheelchair Open (AUS) (l. Sasson) and the Cajun Classic (USA) (l. Kaplan).
- Schroder is bidding to win his **36th singles titles** – and his 2nd on grass, after winning the title here in 2022.
- Schroder has also **won 49 doubles titles** – including 11 Grand Slam doubles titles. He has won 3 Wimbledon doubles titles – alongside Vink in 2022, 2023 and 2024.
- Schroder won the **silver medal in quad singles at the Paralympic Tennis Event at Tokyo 2020 and Paris 2024**. He fell to Alcott in the final at Tokyo 2020 and to Vink in the final at Paris 2024.

- Schroder is a **4-time Paralympic medallist**. In addition to his 2 silver medals in quad singles, he also won the gold medal in quad doubles at Tokyo 2020 and Paris 2024, both alongside Vink.
- Schroder reached the **world No. 1 ranking** for the first time in February 2022. He has been ranked in the Top 2 since then and has been ranked at No. 2 since January this year. He will remain as world No. 2 on Monday regardless of the result in today's final.
- Schroder is coached by Robin van Beveren.
