2026 WIMBLEDON DAY 2 MEN'S NOTES Tuesday 30 June 1st Round – Bottom Half

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On court today...

- The men's match on Centre Court today sees Roland Garros champion Alexander Zverev against young Belgian Alexander Blockx. Zverev will come into this match confident having already faced and defeated Blockx in 2 meetings on clay this year, in the semifinals at Madrid-1000 and the 3rd round at Rome-1000. The German will also be only too aware of the chance of an upset though, having fallen in the 1st round here twice before, including last year to Arthur Rinderknech in a 5-set match played over 2 days. Blockx is looking to secure his first Tour-level win on grass on his Wimbledon debut, but will have to find his footing quickly on Centre Court if he is to do so.
- Taylor Fritz was due to face British star Jack Draper in the marquee men's singles match of day 2, but Draper withdrew on Monday due to an arm injury, meaning Fritz will now play lucky loser Dusan Lajovic on No. 1 Court. The American enters Wimbledon this year in good form, having reached the finals at both Stuttgart and Halle this month. He has also put in a series of excellent performances here in recent years – quarterfinal finishes in 2022 and 2024 before advancing to his first Wimbledon semifinal last year. Lajovic, who celebrates his 36th birthday today, is competing as a lucky loser at Wimbledon for the 2nd straight year – an upset victory would end his 6-match Grand Slam losing streak and see him through to the 2nd round at a major for the first time since 2024 Roland Garros.
- The final match of the day on No. 1 Court could mark the last Wimbledon appearance of 3-time Grand Slam champion Stan Wawrinka, who plans to retire at the end of this season. Wawrinka faces Matteo Berrettini – a tough proposition given that the Italian is a former Wimbledon finalist and enjoyed a return to form last month by reaching the quarterfinals at Roland Garros. But Wawrinka will be determined to bow out on a high at this event. He won 2 matches at the Australian Open in January, and should he record another Grand Slam match-win today, he will become the 5th man in the Open Era to reach the 2nd round at Wimbledon aged 41 or older – and the first to do so since 1972.
- The winners of the 2 biggest men's grass court tournaments prior to Wimbledon are in action today, with Halle champion Frances Tiafoe taking on French lefthander Terence Atmane, and Queen's champion Francisco Cerundolo up against Spain's Jaume Munar. Tiafoe will be confident of victory against Atmane, who is aiming to record his first Grand Slam match-win on his Wimbledon debut today. Cerundolo will hope to avoid the fate that his younger brother, Juan Manuel, suffered on Monday – the younger Cerundolo was beaten in straight sets by a Spanish opponent, the newly-crowned Mallorca champion Alejandro Davidovich Fokina.

A 3rd meeting between Zverev and Blockx – but their first at a Grand Slam or on grass. Their previous 2 meetings came earlier this year at consecutive Masters-1000 events on clay, with Zverev winning in straight sets on both occasions.

- **ZVEREV** is bidding to reach the 2nd round here for the 8th time. This is his 10th Wimbledon appearance and his 42nd Grand Slam overall.
- Zverev has **lost in the 1st round at a Grand Slam on 5 occasions** – including twice at Wimbledon. He lost in the 1st round here in 2019 (l. Jiri Vesely) and last year, when he fell to Arthur Rinderknech in 5 sets. He also lost in the 1st round at the 2015 US Open (l. Philipp Kohlschreiber), the 2016 Australian Open (l. Andy Murray) and 2017 Roland Garros (l. Fernando Verdasco).
- Zverev's **best Wimbledon result** is reaching the round of 16 on 3 occasions – in 2017 (l. Milos Raonic), 2021 (l. Felix Auger-Aliassime) and 2024 (l. Taylor Fritz).
- Zverev won his **first Grand Slam title** at Roland Garros this year, defeating Flavio Cobolli in 5 sets in the final. By winning his first Grand Slam title on his 41st appearance at a major, he went 2nd on the Open Era list for most Grand Slam men's singles appearances before winning a first title – after Goran Ivanisevic, who won the title here in 2001 on his 48th major appearance. He also became the first German player to win a Grand Slam men's singles title since Boris Becker at the 1996 Australian Open.
- Zverev has reached **3 other Grand Slam finals**. In addition to his title at Roland Garros this year, he finished runner-up at the 2020 US Open (l. Dominic Thiem), 2024 Roland Garros (l. Carlos Alcaraz) and the 2025 Australian Open (l. Sinner).
- Zverev is bidding to become the **3rd German man to win the Wimbledon title in the Open Era**, after Becker (1985-86, 1989) and Michael Stich (1991).
- Zverev is bidding to win his 2nd Grand Slam title on his first Grand Slam appearance since winning his first major title and set the **Open Era record for fewest attempts before winning a 2nd Grand Slam men's singles title**. In the Open Era, 7 players have won their 2nd Grand Slam men's singles titles on their 2nd appearances after winning their first – Alcaraz, Sergi Bruguera, Roger Federer, Jan Kodes, Murray, Stan Smith and Guillermo Vilas.
- Zverev is bidding to become the **14th man in history to win back-to-back Roland Garros and Wimbledon titles** – and the 7th in the Open Era after Rod Laver (1969*), Bjorn Borg (1978-80), Rafael Nadal (2008, 2010), Federer (2009), Novak Djokovic (2021) and Alcaraz (2024). (*NB Laver also achieved the feat prior to the Open Era, in 1962)
- If Zverev reaches the final here, he will become the **13th player in the Open Era to reach the men's singles final at all 4 Grand Slam tournaments** – and the 4th player in the Open Era to complete the set of Grand Slam final appearances at Wimbledon, after Ivan Lendl (1986), Jim Courier (1993) and Sinner (2025). He would also become the 3rd player to achieve the feat in the last 12 months, after Sinner at 2025 Wimbledon and Alcaraz at the Australian Open this year.

- **Elsewhere in Grand Slam play this year**, Zverev reached the semifinals at the Australian Open (l. Alcaraz).
- **Prior to Wimbledon this year**, Zverev reached the semifinals at Halle (l. Fritz).
- Zverev's **other highlights in 2026** are finishing runner-up at Madrid-1000 (l. Sinner) and reaching the semifinals at Indian Wells-1000 (l. Sinner), Miami-1000 (l. Sinner), Monte Carlo-1000 (l. Sinner) and Munich (l. Cobolli).
- Zverev has won 3 of the 8 **five-set matches** he has contested at Wimbledon. He has a 24-15 win-loss record in 5-set matches at Tour-level overall.
- Zverev has reached **3 Tour-level finals on grass** – at Halle in both 2016 (l. Florian Mayer) and 2017 (l. Roger Federer) and at Stuttgart last year (l. Fritz).
- Zverev reached a **career-high ranking** of No. 2 after reaching the semifinals at 2022 Roland Garros. He plays here at No. 3.
- Zverev **won Olympic singles gold for Germany** at the Tokyo 2020 Olympic Tennis Event in 2021, defeating Russian Olympic Committee's Karen Khachanov in the final. It was Germany's 3rd Olympic gold medal in tennis – after Steffi Graf in women's singles at Seoul 1988 and Becker/Stich in men's doubles at Barcelona 1992. He reached the quarterfinals on his title defence at the Paris 2024 Olympic Tennis Event (l. Musetti).
- Zverev was a **successful junior**. He won the boys' singles title at the 2014 Australian Open, defeating Stefan Kozlov in the final. He also finished runner-up in the boys' singles at 2013 Roland Garros (l. Christian Garin) and was named 2013 ITF Junior World Champion. He reached the 3rd round on his only appearance in the boys' singles here in 2013 (l. Kozlov).
- Zverev has played **Davis Cup** for Germany since 2016 and has an 11-6 overall win-loss record in the competition. Germany will play at home against Croatia in the 2026 Qualifiers 2nd Round in September.
- Zverev is coached by his father, Alexander Zverev Sr.
- **BLOCKX** is bidding to reach the 2nd round at a Grand Slam for the 2nd time on his Wimbledon debut. This is his 3rd Grand Slam appearance overall.
- **Last year here**, Blockx reached the final round of qualifying. As No. 29 seed in qualifying, he defeated Facundo Mena and Timofei Skatov before falling to wild card Oliver Tarvet in the final round of qualifying.
- Blockx recorded his **best Grand Slam result** by reaching the 2nd round on his Roland Garros debut this year. He defeated Coleman Wong before giving a walkover against Alex de Minaur in the 2nd round due to a right ankle injury.
- Blockx made his **Grand Slam debut** as a lucky loser at the Australian Open this year. He fell to Jaim Faria in the 1st round.
- Blockx's **best Tour-level result in 2026** is reaching the semifinals at Madrid-1000 (l. Zverev). He also reached the 3rd round as a qualifier at Monte Carlo-1000 (l. Alex de Minaur) and as a direct acceptance at Rome-1000 (l. Zverev).
- Blockx has also contested 4 Challenger-level events in 2026. His best result is winning his **4th Challenger-level title** at the Canberra Challenger (AUS) (d. Rafael Jodar). He also finished runner-up at the Lille Challenger (FRA) (l. Luca Van Assche) and reached the semifinals at the Cap Cana Challenger (DOM) (l. Mariano Navone).
- Blockx **finished runner-up at the 2025 Next Gen ATP Finals**, falling to Learner Tien in the final. He had recorded just 2 Tour-level match-wins prior to that event.
- Blockx is bidding to record his **first Tour-level match-win on grass**. He lost the only Tour-level match he has played on grass, as a qualifier in the 1st round at 's-Hertogenbosch last year (l. Zizou Bergs). He is one of 17 players in the men's singles draw not to compete on grass this season prior to Wimbledon.
- Blockx is **bidding to defeat a Top 5 player for the 2nd time**. He won the first match he played against a Top 5 player, defeating No. 5 Felix Auger-Aliassime in the 3rd round at Madrid-1000 this year. His 2 other matches against Top 5 players both came against No. 3 Zverev, to whom he lost in the semifinals at Madrid-1000 and the 3rd round at Rome-1000.
- Blockx broke the Top 100 for the first time in January and broke the Top 50 for the first time in May after reaching the semifinals at Madrid-1000, reaching at a **career-high ranking** of No. 36. He plays here at the same ranking.

- Blockx is a **former junior world No. 1 and Grand Slam champion**. He won the boys' singles title at the 2023 Australian Open (d. Tien) and reached the No. 1 ranking in May that year. He reached the 3rd round in his only appearance in the boys' singles here in 2022 (l. Kilian Feldbausch)
- Blockx made his **Davis Cup** debut for Belgium at the 2024 Finals group stage and has a 1-2 overall win-loss record in the competition, recording his first win in the competition by defeating Iliyan Radulov in Belgium's victory against Bulgaria in the Qualifiers 1st Round in February. Belgium will play away against Austria in the Qualifiers 2nd Round in September.
- Blockx is coached by Ruben Bemelmans.

NO. 4 BEN SHELTON (USA) v (Q) OTTO VIRTANEN (FIN)

Head-to-head: first meeting

Shelton has never lost a Grand Slam match to a player ranked as low as No. 140 Virtanen. The lowest-ranked player to have defeated Shelton at a Grand Slam is No. 104 Nuno Borges in the 1st round at the 2022 US Open. The lowest-ranked player to have defeated Shelton at Wimbledon is No. 60 Laslo Djere in the 2nd round in 2023.

Shelton has lost a Tour-level match to a player ranked as low as No. 140 Virtanen on 4 occasions – including once on grass, when he fell to No. 289 Paul Jubb in the quarterfinals at 2024 Mallorca. He also fell to No. 156 Shang Juncheng in the 1st round at 2023 Atlanta, to No. 149 Shang in the 2nd round at 2023 Washington and to No. 182 Coleman Wong in the 2nd round at 2025 Miami-1000.

Shelton has won 7 of the 8 matches he has contested against qualifiers at the Grand Slams – including all 3 matches he has played against qualifiers at Wimbledon, defeating Mattia Bellucci and Lloyd Harris in the opening 2 rounds in 2024 and defeating Alex Bolt in the 1st round last year. His only defeat to a qualifier at the Grand Slams came against Borges in the 1st round at the 2022 US Open. He has a 20-9 win-loss record against qualifiers at Tour-level overall.

Virtanen won the only match he has played against a lefthanded player at Tour-level – he defeated India's Prajnesh Gunneswaran in a 2021 Davis Cup World Group I tie.

- Lefthander **SHELTON** is bidding to maintain his record of always reaching the 2nd round here. This is his 4th Wimbledon appearance and his 16th Grand Slam overall.
- Shelton has **lost in the 1st round at a Grand Slam on 2 occasions** – as a wild card on his Grand Slam debut at the 2022 US Open (l. Nuno Borges) and as No. 30 seed at 2023 Roland Garros (l. Lorenzo Sonego).
- Last year here, Shelton recorded his **best Wimbledon result** by reaching the quarterfinals. He defeated Alex Bolt, Rinky Hijikata, Marton Fucsovics and Sonego before falling to Jannik Sinner.
- Shelton's **best Grand Slam result** is reaching the semifinals on 2 occasions – at the 2023 US Open (l. Novak Djokovic) and at the 2025 Australian Open (l. Sinner).
- **In Grand Slam play this year**, Shelton reached the quarterfinals at the Australian Open (l. Sinner) but fell in the 2nd round at Roland Garros (d. Daniel Merida, l. Raphael Collignon).
- Prior to Wimbledon this year, Shelton won his **first Tour-level title on grass** at Stuttgart (d. Taylor Fritz). He also reached the quarterfinals at Halle (l. Fritz).
- Shelton has **won 3 Tour-level titles in 2026**. In addition to his title at Stuttgart, he also won the titles at Dallas (d. Fritz) and Munich (d. Flavio Cobolli). His other highlights this year are reaching the quarterfinals at Auckland (l. Sebastian Baez) and Houston (l. Thiago Agustin Tirante).
- Shelton has won all 4 **five-set matches** he has contested at Wimbledon. He recorded a 5-set victory against Taro Daniel in the 1st round in 2023 and recorded 5-set victories against Mattia Bellucci, Lloyd Harris and Denis Shapovalov in the opening 3 rounds here in 2024. He has a 7-3 win-loss record in 5-set matches at Tour-level overall.

- Shelton reached a **career-high ranking** of No. 5 in November last year. He plays here at the same ranking.
- Shelton is one of **15 lefthanders** to begin the men's main draw here this year. Rafael Nadal is the last lefthanded player to win the men's title here in 2010.
- Shelton is the highest-ranked of the **18 American men competing at Wimbledon this year** – the most since 1995, when 21 Americans contested the men's singles draw here. USA has more players and more seeded players (6) in the men's singles draw here this year than any other nation.
- Shelton **played college tennis**. He represented the University of Florida for 2 seasons, compiling a 65-10 win-loss record in singles and winning the 2021 NCAA team title and the 2022 NCAA singles title.
- Shelton **contested just 4 tournaments as a junior player**, all of which came in his home country. His best result was reaching the 3rd round as a wild card at 2020 JA Plantation (USA) (also known as the Orange Bowl), falling to Jack Pinnington Jones.
- Shelton's father, Bryan Shelton, reached a career-high ranking of No. 55 in March 1992. He made 6 appearances at Wimbledon, reaching the round of 16 in 1994.
- Shelton is coached by his father, Bryan Shelton, and Dean Goldfine.
- Qualifier **VIRTANEN** is bidding to reach the 2nd round here for the 2nd time and equal his best Grand Slam result. This is his 2nd Wimbledon appearance and 6th Grand Slam main draw appearance overall.
- Virtanen defeated No. 19 seed Pedro Martinez (ESP) 64 16 61, Luca Nardi (ITA) 64 64 and No. 8 seed Nicolai Budkov Kjaer (NOR) 46 64 64 75 in the 3 rounds of **Wimbledon qualifying last week**. It was the 2nd time he has successfully qualified here on his 3rd attempt. It was the 4th time he has successfully qualified at a Grand Slam on his 13th attempt.
- Virtanen's **best Grand Slam result** is reaching the 2nd round as a qualifier on 2 occasions – including on his only previous appearance in the main draw here in 2024 (d. Max Purcell, l. Tommy Paul). He also reached the 2nd round at the 2024 US Open (d. Quentin Halys, l. Alex de Minaur). He withdrew from Wimbledon qualifying in 2025 due to a left knee injury.
- **In Grand Slam play this year**, Virtanen fell in the 1st round of qualifying at both the Australian Open (l. Nicolas Mejia) and Roland Garros (l. August Holmgren).
- **Prior to competing in Wimbledon qualifying**, Virtanen competed at 3 grass court events. At Tour-level, he fell in the 1st round as a wild card at 's-Hertogenbosch (l. Kamil Majchrzak). At Challenger-level, he finished runner-up at both the Birmingham Challenger (GBR) (l. Bu Yunchaokete) and the Nottingham 2 Challenger (GBR) (l. Christopher O'Connell).
- Virtanen has contested **5 events at Challenger-level in 2026**. In addition to his runner-up finishes at Birmingham (GBR) and Nottingham (GBR), he also reached the semifinals at the Manama Challenger (BRN) (l. Nardi) and the Thionville Challenger (FRA) (l. Budkov Kjaer).
- Virtanen is bidding to record his **3rd Tour-level match-win in 2026**. His only Tour-level match-wins this year came against Hong Kong's Siu Chi Nicholas Cheng and Coleman Wong in the Davis Cup World Group I Play-offs in February. He fell in the 1st round at the 4 other Tour-level events he has contested in 2026 – as a qualifier at Dubai (l. Tallon Griekspoor), as an alternate at Bucharest (l. Daniel Merida), as a qualifier at Barcelona (l. Carlos Alcaraz) and as a wild card at 's-Hertogenbosch.
- Virtanen is bidding to record his **3rd Tour-level victory on grass**. His only previous Tour-level match-wins on grass came in 2nd round finishes as a qualifier here in 2024 and as a wild card at 2025 's-Hertogenbosch, where he defeated Tomas Martin Etcheverry before giving a walkover against Nuno Borges.
- Virtanen is **facing a Top 5 player for the 2nd time**. The highest-ranked player he has previously faced is No. 2 Alcaraz in the 1st round at Barcelona this year. The highest-ranked player he has defeated is No. 23 Sebastian Korda in the 1st round at 2025 Marseille.
- Virtanen reached a **career-high ranking** of No. 91 in November 2024. He plays here at No. 140.

- Virtanen was a **good junior**. He reached a career-high junior ranking of No. 6 in December 2018 after winning the title at JA Plantation (USA) (also known as the Orange Bowl) (d. Zane Khan). His best result in the boys' singles at Wimbledon was reaching the 3rd round in 2018 (l. Anton Matusevich).
- Virtanen made his **Davis Cup** debut for Finland in 2020 and has a 13-12 win-loss record in the competition. Finland will play at home against Monaco in a World Group I tie in September.
- Virtanen is currently without a permanent coach.

- **DE MINAUR** is bidding to reach the 2nd round here for the 7th time. This is his 8th Wimbledon appearance and his 36th Grand Slam overall.
- De Minaur has **lost in the 1st round at Wimbledon** once before – in 2021, when he fell to Sebastian Korda in 4 sets.
- **Last year here**, De Minaur reached the round of 16. He defeated Roberto Carballes Baena, Arthur Cazaux and August Holmgren before falling to Novak Djokovic.
- De Minaur's **best Wimbledon result** is reaching the quarterfinals in 2024, when he withdrew ahead of his last 8 match against Djokovic due to a hip injury.
- De Minaur's **best Grand Slam result** is reaching the quarterfinals on 7 occasions. In addition to his quarterfinal finish here in 2024, he has also reached the quarterfinals at the US Open in 2020 (l. Dominic Thiem), 2024 (l. Jack Draper) and 2025 (l. Felix Auger-Aliassime), at 2024 Roland Garros (l. Alexander Zverev) and at the Australian Open in 2025 (l. Jannik Sinner) and 2026 (l. Carlos Alcaraz). He is one of 3 players to have reached 7 or more Grand Slam men's singles quarterfinals without advancing to a semifinal – alongside Andrey Rublev (10 Grand Slam quarterfinal appearances) and Tommy Robredo (7).
- **Elsewhere in Grand Slam play this year**, De Minaur reached the 3rd round at Roland Garros. He defeated Toby Samuel and received a walkover against Alexander Blockx before falling to Jakub Mensik. His match against Mensik was his 100th Grand Slam match.
- **Prior to Wimbledon this year**, De Minaur finished runner-up at 's-Hertogenbosch (l. Kamil Majchrzak) and reached the quarterfinals at Queen's (l. Brandon Nakashima).
- De Minaur's best result in 2026 is winning his **11th Tour-level title** at Rotterdam (d. Auger-Aliassime). He also reached the semifinals at Hamburg (l. Tommy Paul) and the quarterfinals at Monte Carlo-1000 (l. Valentin Vacherot).
- De Minaur has **won 2 Tour-level titles on grass** – at 2021 Eastbourne (d. Lorenzo Sonego) and 2024 's-Hertogenbosch (d. Sebastian Korda). He is one of 11 players who began the men's singles draw here this year to have won multiple Tour-level titles on grass.
- De Minaur has lost both **5-set matches** he has contested at Wimbledon – falling to Steve Johnson in 5 sets in the 2nd round in 2019 and to Cristian Garin in the round of 16 in 2022, despite holding a 2-0 lead. He has a 3-7 win-loss record in 5-set matches at Tour-level overall.
- De Minaur **broke the Top 10 for the first time** in January 2024 and reached a career-high ranking of No. 6 in July 2024 following his quarterfinal finish at Wimbledon. He plays here at the same ranking.
- De Minaur is a **former Wimbledon boys' singles finalist**. He reached the boys' singles final here in 2016 (l. Denis Shapovalov). He reached a career-high junior ranking of No. 2 in February 2016 and also reached the semifinals of the boys' singles at the 2015 US Open (l. Tommy Paul) and the 2016 Australian Open (l. Jurabek Karimov).

- De Minaur led Australia to **back-to-back Davis Cup finals in 2022-23**, the team's first appearances in the Davis Cup final since 2003. The team finished as runners-up to Canada in 2022 and to Italy in 2023. De Minaur won 10 out of 13 Davis Cup matches he contested in 2022-23 and has a 17-11 win-loss record in the competition overall since making his debut in 2018. Australia will play at home against Poland in a 2026 World Group I tie in September.
- De Minaur is coached by Adolfo Gutierrez and Matt Reid.
- **BURRUCHAGA** is bidding to reach the 2nd round at a Grand Slam for the 2nd time on his Wimbledon main draw debut. This is his 3rd Grand Slam appearance overall.
- **Last year here**, Burruchaga reached the 2nd round of qualifying (d. Dmitry Popko, l. James McCabe). On his only other appearance in the qualifying draw here, in 2024, he reached the final round of qualifying – he defeated Gustavo Heide and Stefano Napolitano before falling to Otto Virtanen.
- Burruchaga's **best Grand Slam result** is reaching the 2nd round at Roland Garros this year. He defeated Sebastian Baez in the 1st round for his first Grand Slam match-win before falling to Felix Auger-Aliassime. On his only other Grand Slam main draw appearance, as a qualifier at 2024 Roland Garros, he fell to Jan-Lennard Struff in the 1st round.
- **Elsewhere in Grand Slam play this year**, Burruchaga reached the 2nd round of qualifying at the Australian Open (d. Ryan Peniston, l. Arthur Gea).
- **Prior to Wimbledon this year**, Burruchaga competed at Eastbourne, falling to Arthur Fery in the 1st round in his first Tour-level match on grass. His appearances in qualifying here in 2024-25 and at Eastbourne last week are his only appearances at professional grass court events at any level.
- Burruchaga's best result in 2026 is reaching his **first Tour-level final** at Houston, where he finished runner-up to Tommy Paul. He has lost in the 1st or 2nd round at the 7 other Tour-level events he has contested this season.
- Burruchaga's has contested 5 Challenger-level events in 2026. His best result is winning his **4th Challenger-level title** at the Sao Paolo Challenger (BRA) (d. Jaime Faria). He also finished runner-up at the Rosario Challenger (ARG) (l. Camilo Ugo Carabelli) and reached the semifinals at the Cagliari Challenger (ITA) (l. Hubert Hurkacz).
- Burruchaga is **facing a Top 10 player for the 2nd time**. He lost the only match he has previously contested against a Top 10 player – to No. 6 Auger-Aliassime in the 2nd round at Roland Garros this year. The highest-ranked player he has defeated is No. 22 Learner Tien in the quarterfinals at Houston this year.
- Burruchaga broke the Top 100 for the first time in February this year and reached a **career-high ranking** of No. 56 in May. He plays here at No. 65.
- Burruchaga had a **good junior career**, reaching a career-high junior ranking of No. 18 in February 2020. He reached the 2nd round as a qualifier on his only appearance in the boys' singles at Wimbledon (d. Pablo Llamas Ruiz, l. Shintaro Mochizuki).
- Burruchaga's father, Jorge Burruchaga, is a former professional football player who was a member of the Argentinian team which won the 1986 FIFA World Cup and scored the winning goal in their 3-2 victory against West Germany in the final.
- Burruchaga is coached by Leonardo Mayer, who reached the round of 16 here in 2014.

Fritz has lost a Grand Slam match to a players ranked as low as No. 153 Lajovic once before – to No. 303 Brandon Holt in the 1st round at the 2022 US Open. The lowest-ranked player to have defeated Fritz at Wimbledon is No. 59 Mikael Ymer in the 2nd round in 2023.

Fritz has won all 7 matches he has played against lucky losers at Tour-level, including 2 matches against lucky losers at the Grand Slams – against Lorenzo Sonego in the 1st round at Wimbledon 2018 and Hugo Gaston in the 2nd round at the 2024 Australian Open.

- **FRITZ** is bidding to reach the 2nd round here for the 8th consecutive time. This is his 10th Wimbledon appearance and his 40th Grand Slam overall.
- Fritz has **lost in the 1st round here twice before** – on his first 2 Wimbledon appearances, as a direct acceptance in 2016 (l. Stan Wawrinka) and as a qualifier in 2017 (l. John Isner).
- Last year here, Fritz recorded his **best Wimbledon result** by reaching the semifinals. He defeated Giovanni Mpetshi Perricard, Gabriel Diallo, Alejandro Davidovich Fokina, Jordan Thompson and Karen Khachanov before falling to Carlos Alcaraz. He has reached the quarterfinals or better here in 3 of the last 4 years – he reached the quarterfinals in 2022 (l. Rafael Nadal) and 2024 (l. Lorenzo Musetti) but fell in the 2nd round in 2023 (l. Mikael Ymer).
- Fritz reached his **first Grand Slam final** at the 2024 US Open, where he fell to Jannik Sinner in straight sets. He became the first American player to reach the US Open men’s singles final since Andy Roddick finished runner-up in 2006 and the first American player to reach a Grand Slam men’s singles final since Roddick finished runner-up at 2009 Wimbledon.
- If Fritz wins his first major title on his 40th Grand Slam appearance, he will go **3rd on the Open Era list for most attempts before winning a first Grand Slam men’s singles title** – behind Goran Ivanisevic, who won his only major title at 2001 Wimbledon on his 48th Grand Slam appearance and Alexander Zverev, who won his first major title at Roland Garros this year on his 41st Grand Slam appearance.
- **At the Grand Slams this year**, Fritz reached the round of 16 at the Australian Open, where he defeated Valentin Royer, Vit Kopriwa and Stan Wawrinka before falling to Musetti, but fell in the 1st round at Roland Garros (l. Nishesh Basavareddy).
- **Prior to Wimbledon this year**, Fritz finished runner-up at both Stuttgart (l. Ben Shelton) and Halle (l. Frances Tiafoe). He withdrew from Eastbourne. It was the 2nd straight year that he has reached 2 Tour-level finals on grass prior to Wimbledon – he won the titles at both Stuttgart (d. Zverev) and Eastbourne (d. Jenson Brooksby) in 2025.

- Fritz has **won 5 Tour-level titles on grass**, putting him in 2nd place on the list for most Tour-level men's singles titles total among active players – behind Novak Djokovic, who has won 8 Tour-level titles on grass. In addition to his titles at Stuttgart and Eastbourne last year, he has won 3 other titles at Eastbourne – in 2019 (d. Sam Querrey), 2022 (d. Maxime Cressy) and 2024 (d. Max Purcell).
- Fritz's **other highlights in 2026** are finishing runner-up at Dallas (l. Shelton), reaching the quarterfinals at Delray Beach (l. Tommy Paul) and the round of 16 at Miami-1000 (l. Jiri Lehecka).
- Fritz is one of **18 American men competing at Wimbledon this year** – the most since 1995, when 21 Americans contested the men's singles draw here. USA has more players and more seeded players (6) in the men's singles draw here this year than any other nation.
- Fritz has won 5 of the 9 **five-set matches** he has contested at Wimbledon, including his wins against Mpetshi Perricard and Diallo in the opening 2 rounds last year. He has a 14-11 win-loss record in 5-set matches at Tour-level overall.
- Fritz reached a **career-high ranking** of No. 4 in November 2024. He plays here at No. 7.
- Fritz is a **former junior world No. 1**. He was named 2015 ITF Junior World Champion after winning the boys' singles title at the 2015 US Open (d. Tommy Paul). He also finished as runner-up in the boys' singles at 2015 Roland Garros (l. Paul). His best result in the boys' singles here was reaching the semifinals in 2015 (l. Reilly Opelka).
- Fritz made his **Davis Cup** debut in 2019 and has an 8-4 win-loss record in the competition. USA will play away against Czechia in the 2026 Qualifiers 2nd Round in September.
- Both of Fritz's parents were professional tennis players. His mother, Kathy May, is a former Top 10 player.
- Fritz is coached by Michael Russell and Paul Annacone.
- Lucky loser **LAJOVIC** is bidding to reach the 2nd round here for the 5th time and equal his best Wimbledon result. This is his 12th Wimbledon appearance and his 46th Grand Slam overall.
- As No. 22 seed in **Wimbledon qualifying last week**, Lajovic defeated Lukas Neumayer (AUT) 64 64 and Chris Rodesch (LUX) 62 64 before falling to No. 14 seed Vilius Gaubas (LTU) 63 46 63 36 46. He gained a place in the main draw after Jack Draper withdrew due to an arm injury on Monday.
- **Last year here**, Lajovic fell in the 1st round as a lucky loser to Billy Harris. He has fallen in the 1st round here on 6 other occasions, including in 2023 (l. Jan Choinski) and 2024 (l. Grigor Dimitrov).
- Lajovic's **best Wimbledon result** is reaching the 2nd round on 4 occasions – in 2014 (d. Guillermo Garcia-Lopez, l. Lukasz Kubot), 2017 (d. Stefanos Tsitsipas, l. Roger Federer), 2021 (d. Gilles Simon, l. Dan Evnas) and 2022 (d. Pablo Carreno Busta, l. Alexander Bublik).
- Lajovic's **best Grand Slam result** is reaching the round of 16 on 2 occasions – on his Roland Garros debut in 2014 (l. Rafael Nadal) and at the 2021 US Open (l. Alexander Zverev).
- **In Grand Slam play this year**, Lajovic reached the final round of qualifying at the Australian Open (l. Francesco Maestrelli) but fell in the 1st round of qualifying at Roland Garros (l. Jurij Rodionov).
- Lajovic is bidding to end a **6-match Grand Slam main draw losing streak**. He has not recorded a Grand Slam match-win since reaching the 2nd round at 2024 Roland Garros, when he defeated Roman Safiullin before falling to Taylor Fritz. He lost in the 1st round of the main draw at all 5 Grand Slam tournaments from 2024 Wimbledon to 2025 Wimbledon.
- Lajovic is bidding to record his **7th Tour-level match-win on grass**. In addition to his four 2nd round finishes at Wimbledon, his only Tour-level grass court match-wins came in 2nd round finishes at 2017 Eastbourne (d. Jeremy Chardy, l. John Isner) and 2018 Antalya (d. Filip Horansky, l. Nikoloz Basilashvili). He did not compete on grass this season prior to Wimbledon qualifying.
- Lajovic is bidding to record his **3rd Tour-level match-win in 2026**. His only Tour-level match-wins this year have come in 2nd round finishes as a lucky loser at Rio de Janeiro (d. Daniel Altmaier, l. Matteo Berrettini) and as a qualifier at Madrid-1000 (d. Lorenzo Sonego, l. Arthur Rinderknech). He lost the 3 other Tour-level matches he has contested this year, falling to Chile's Tomas Barrios Vera in the Davis Cup Qualifiers 1st Round and falling in the 1st round at Santiago (l. Yannick Hanfmann) and as a qualifier at Marrakech (l. Rafael Jodar).

- Lajovic has competed at **9 Challenger-level events in 2026**. His best results at Challenger-level are reaching the quarterfinals at the Canberra Challenger (AUS) (l. Kyrian Jacquet) and as an alternate at the Valencia Challenger (ESP) (l. Alejandro Tabilo).
- Lajovic is bidding to **defeat a Top 10 player at a Grand Slam for the first time**. He has lost all 10 matches he has played against Top 10 players at the Grand Slams – including all 3 matches he has played against Top 10 players at Wimbledon. He fell to No. 5 Roger Federer in the 2nd round here in 2017, to No. 2 Federer in the 1st round in 2018 and to No. 10 Grigor Dimitrov in the 1st round in 2024. The highest-ranked player he has defeated at a Grand Slam is No. 20 Pablo Carreno Busta in the 1st round here in 2022, with Carreno Busta retiring due to a right leg injury.
- Lajovic is bidding to end a **6-match losing streak against Top 10 players at Tour-level**. He has not defeated a Top 10 player since defeating No. 6 Jannik Sinner in the 2nd round at 2023 Cincinnati-1000. He has a 10-31 win-loss record against Top 10 players at Tour-level overall.
- Lajovic reached a **career-high ranking** of No. 23 in April 2019. He plays here at No. 153.
- Lajovic has won 2 of the 3 **five-set matches** he has contested in the main draw at Wimbledon – he defeated Garcia-Lopez in the 1st round in 2014, fell to Dustin Brown in the 1st round in 2016 and defeated Simon in the 1st round in 2021. He has a 5-13 win-loss record in 5-set matches at Tour-level overall.
- Lajovic has played **Davis Cup** for Serbia since 2012 and has a 13-14 overall win-loss record in the competition. Serbia will play at home against Lithuania in a 2026 World Group I tie in September.
- Lajovic is coached by Ilija Bozoliac.

- **Last year here**, Cobolli reached his first Grand Slam quarterfinal. He defeated Beibit Zhukayev, Jack Pinnington Jones, Jakub Mensik and Marin Cilic before falling to Novak Djokovic. On his only other main draw appearance here, in 2024, he reached the 2nd round (d. Rinky Hijikata, I. Alejandro Tabilo).
- Cobolli reached his **first Grand Slam final** at Roland Garros this year, falling to Alexander Zverev in 5 sets. He became the 6th Italian player in history to reach a Grand Slam men's singles final – after Jannik Sinner (6 Grand Slam final appearances), Nicola Pietrangeli (4), and Matteo Berrettini, Giorgio de Stefani and Adriano Panatta (one).
- **Elsewhere in Grand Slam play this year**, Cobolli fell in the 1st round at the Australian Open (I. Arthur Fery). He has lost in the 1st round at a Grand Slam on 2 other occasions – as a qualifier on his Grand Slam debut at 2023 Roland Garros (I. Carlos Alcaraz) and as a direct acceptance at the 2025 Australian Open (I. Tomas Martin Etcheverry).
- Cobolli's other highlight in 2026 is winning his **3rd Tour-level title** at Acapulco (d. Frances Tiafoe). He also finished runner-up at Munich (I. Ben Shelton), reached the semifinals at Delray Beach (I. Sebastian Korda) and reached the quarterfinals at Madrid-1000 (I. Zverev).
- **Prior to Wimbledon this year**, Cobolli competed at Halle but fell to Tiafoe in the 1st round.
- Cobolli lost the only **5-set match** he has contested at Wimbledon. He fell to Tabilo in 5 sets in the 2nd round here in 2024. He has a 3-3 win-loss record in 5-set matches at Tour-level overall.
- Cobolli reached a **career-high ranking** of No. 10 earlier this month after his runner-up finish at Roland Garros. He plays here at the same ranking.
- Cobolli was a **good junior**. He reached a career-high junior ranking of No. 8 in January 2020 and finished his junior career by winning the boys' doubles title at 2020 Roland Garros alongside Dominic Stricker. He reached the 2nd round in his only appearance in the boys' singles here in 2019 (d. Sergey Fomin, I. Filip Cristian Jianu).
- Cobolli made his Davis Cup debut for Italy in 2024 and **competed in Italy's title-winning seasons in 2024 and 2025**, winning 4 of the 5 Davis Cup matches he has contested since making his debut. As hosts, Italy have received a wild card to the 2026 Davis Cup Final 8 Knockout Stage in Bologna in November.
- Cobolli is coached by his father, Stefano Cobolli.

- **NAVONE** is bidding to reach the 2nd round here for the 2nd time. This is his 3rd Wimbledon appearance and his 10th Grand Slam overall.
- **Last year here**, Navone reached the 2nd round. He defeated Denis Shapovalov for his first Wimbledon match-win before falling to Pedro Martinez. On his only other appearance in the main draw here, in 2024, he fell to Lorenzo Sonego in the 1st round.
- Navone's **best Grand Slam result** is reaching the 3rd round at 2025 Roland Garros. He defeated Brandon Nakashima and Reilly Opelka before falling to Lorenzo Musetti.
- **In Grand Slam play this year**, Navone reached the 2nd round at Roland Garros (d. Jenson Brooksby, l. Jakub Mensik) but fell in the 1st round at the Australian Open (l. Hamad Medjedovic).
- Navone best result in 2026 is winning his **first Tour-level title** at Bucharest (d. Daniel Merida). He also finished runner-up at Geneva (l. Learner Tien) and reached the 3rd round at Rome-1000 (l. Medjedovic), but has lost in the 1st or 2nd round at the 12 other Tour-level events he has contested.
- Navone has contested 2 events at Challenger-level this season. He won his **9th Challenger-level title** at the Cap Cana Challenger (DOM) (d. Mattia Bellucci) but lost his opening match at the Cagliari Challenger (ITA) (l. Matteo Berrettini).
- **Prior to Wimbledon this season**, Navone competed at Mallorca but fell to Lorenzo Sonego in the 1st round.
- Navone is bidding to **record his 2nd Tour-level match-win on grass**. His only previous Tour-level victory on grass came in his 2nd round finish here last year. He has lost the 5 other Tour-level matches he has contested on the surface.
- Navone **is bidding to defeat a Top 10 player for the 2nd time**. He has a 1-5 win-loss record against Top 10 players, losing the first 5 matches he contested before defeating No. 5 Felix Auger-Aliassime in the 2nd round at Rome-1000 this year.
- Navone is bidding to **defeat a Top 10 player at a Grand Slam for the first time**. He lost his only previous match against a Top 10 player at a Grand Slam – against No. 7 Musetti in the 3rd round at 2025 Roland Garros. The highest-ranked player he has defeated at a Grand Slam is No. 30 Shapovalov in the 1st round here last year.
- Navone has lost all 4 **five-set matches** he has contested – to Tomas Machac in the 2nd round at 2024 Roland Garros, to Jack Draper in the 1st round at the 2025 Australian Open, to Marcos Giron in the 1st round at the 2025 US Open and to Mensik in the 2nd round at Roland Garros this year.
- Navone reached a **career-high ranking** of No. 29 in June 2024. He plays here at No. 38.
- Navone **contested just one event at junior-level**, a Grade 5 event in Argentina in 2016. He made his professional debut in November 2017.
- Navone made his **Davis Cup** debut in 2025 and has won one of the 2 matches he has contested in the competition. Argentina will play at home against Turkiye in a World Group I tie in September.
- Navone is coached by Alberto Mancini and Dante Gennaro.

NO. 10 ALEXANDER BUBLIK (KAZ) v THANASI KOKKINAKIS (AUS)

A 2nd meeting for Bublik and Kokkinakis but their first at a Grand Slam or on grass. Kokkinakis won their only previous meeting more than 8 years ago, in the 1st round at 2018 Acapulco. Bublik was ranked at No. 142 and qualified for the main draw there, while Kokkinakis was ranked at No. 199 and entered as a wild card.

Bublik has never lost a Grand Slam match to a player ranked as low as No. 491 Kokkinakis. The lowest-ranked player to have defeated Bublik at a Grand Slam is No. 137 Sumit Nagal in the 1st round at the 2024 Australian Open. The lowest-ranked player to have defeated Bublik at Wimbledon is No. 116 Gregoire Barrere in the 1st round in 2019.

Bublik has never lost a Tour-level match to a player ranked as low as No. 491 Kokkinakis. The lowest-ranked player to have defeated Bublik at Tour-level is Korea Rep.'s No. 478 Soonwoo Kwon in a 2025 Davis Cup World Group I tie, when Bublik retired in the 2nd set. The lowest-ranked player to have defeated Bublik on grass is No. 309 Jack Draper in the 2nd round at 2021 Queen's.

- **BUBLIK** is bidding to reach the 2nd round here for the 5th time. This is his 8th Wimbledon appearance and his 31st Grand Slam overall.
- **Last year here**, Bublik fell in the 1st round to Jaume Munar in 5 sets. He has fallen in the 1st round here on 2 other occasions, on his first 2 main draw appearances here – as a lucky loser in 2017 (l. Andy Murray) and as a direct acceptance in 2019 (l. Gregoire Barrere). He has fallen in the 1st round at the Grand Slams on 13 occasions overall.
- Bublik's **best Wimbledon result** is reaching the round of 16 in 2023. He defeated Mackenzie McDonald, JJ Wolf and Maximilian Marterer before falling to Andrey Rublev. He became the 2nd Kazakhstani player to reach the men's singles round of 16 at a Grand Slam – after Mikhail Kukushkin, who reached the round of 16 at both the 2012 Australian Open and 2019 Wimbledon.
- Bublik's **best Grand Slam result** is reaching the quarterfinals at Roland Garros last year. He defeated James Duckworth, Alex de Minaur, Henrique Rocha and Jack Draper before falling to Jannik Sinner. He became the first Kazakhstani player to reach the men's singles quarterfinals at a Grand Slam.
- **In Grand Slam play this year**, Bublik reached the round of 16 at the Australian Open (l. Alex de Minaur) but fell in the 1st round at Roland Garros (l. Jan-Lennard Struff).
- **Prior to Wimbledon this year**, Bublik reached the semifinals at Stuttgart (l. Taylor Fritz) but fell in the 1st round at Halle (l. Mattia Bellucci).
- Bublik's best result in 2026 is winning his **9th Tour-level title** at Hong Kong (d. Lorenzo Musetti). He also reached the semifinals at Rotterdam (l. Felix Auger-Aliassime), Geneva (l. Learner Tien) and Stuttgart and the quarterfinals at Monte Carlo-1000 (l. Carlos Alcaraz).
- Bublik has won **2 Tour-level titles on grass** – at Halle in both 2023 (d. Andrey Rublev) and 2025 (d. Daniil Medvedev). He is one of 11 players who started the men's singles main draw here this year to have won multiple Tour-level titles on grass.

- Bublik has won one of the 3 **five-set matches** he has contested in the main draw at Wimbledon. He recovered from 0-2 down to defeat Jakub Mensik in 5 sets in the 1st round in 2024, but lost 5-set matches to Rublev in the round of 16 in 2023 and to Munar in the 1st round last year. He also lost a 5-set match to Daniel Brands in the final round of Wimbledon qualifying in 2017. He has a 5-6 win-loss record in 5-set matches at Tour-level overall.
- Of Bublik's 5 victories in 5-set matches, 3 have been **comebacks from 0-2 down**. In addition to his victory against Mensik in the 1st round here in 2024, he also recorded successful comebacks from 0-2 down against Thomas Fabbiano in the 2nd round at the 2019 US Open and against De Minaur in the 2nd round at 2025 Roland Garros.
- Bublik reached a **career-high ranking** of No. 10 in January after his title-victory at Hong Kong. He is the first Kazakhstani man in history to be ranked inside the Top 10. He plays here one place lower at No. 11.
- Bublik made his **Davis Cup** debut for Kazakhstan in 2019 and has a 15-14 overall win-loss record in the competition. Kazakhstan will play at home against Thailand in a 2026 World Group II tie in September.
- Bublik is coached by Artem Suprunov.
- **KOKKINAKIS** is bidding to reach the 2nd round here for the 3rd time and equal his best Wimbledon result. This is his 5th Wimbledon appearance and his 26th Grand Slam overall.
- Kokkinakis **not compete at any level for nearly a year** between January 2025 and January 2026 after undergoing pectoral surgery in February 2025, missing Roland Garros, Wimbledon and the US Open last year.
- On his most recent appearance here, in 2024, Kokkinakis equalled his **best Wimbledon result** by reaching the 2nd round. He recovered from 0-2 down to defeat Felix-Auger-Aliassime in 5 sets in the 1st round before retiring with a left knee injury against Lucas Pouille in the 2nd round. He also reached the 2nd round here in 2022 (d. Kamil Majchrzak, I. Novak Djokovic). He lost in the 1st round on his 2 other main draw appearance here – in 2015 (I. Leonardo Mayer) and 2017 (I. Juan Martin del Potro).
- Kokkinakis' **best Grand Slam result** is reaching the 3rd round at Roland Garros on 3 occasions – as a wild card in 2015 (I. Djokovic) and 2023 (I. Karen Khachanov), and as a direct acceptance in 2024 (I. Taylor Fritz).
- **In Grand Slam play this year**, Kokkinakis reached the 2nd round at Roland Garros, defeating Terence Atmane before retiring due to a shoulder injury against Pablo Carreno Busta. It was his first appearance at a Grand Slam since reaching the 2nd round at the 2025 Australian Open and just his 3rd appearance at any level since that event.
- **Prior to Wimbledon this year**, Kokkinakis competed at the Dublin Challenger (IRL). He defeated Harold Mayot and Ammar Elamin as a wild card in qualifying before falling to Jerome Kym in the 1st round of the main draw.
- Kokkinakis is bidding to record his **3rd Tour-level match-win in 2026**. In addition to his 2nd round finish at Roland Garros, he also reached the 2nd round at Adelaide, where he defeated Sebastian Korda before giving a walkover to Valentin Vacherot due to a right shoulder injury. They are the only Tour-level events he has contested this season.
- Kokkinakis is contesting his **6th event, at any level, this season**. In addition to his 2 Tour-level appearances, he has competed at 3 Challenger-level events – he reached the 2nd round at the Bratislava 1 Challenger (SVK), defeating Tomas Barrios Vera before retiring due to a right shoulder injury against Vitaliy Sachko, qualified at the Zagreb Challenger (CRO) before giving a walkover in the 1st round against Yannick Theodor Alexandrescou and fell in the 1st round as a qualifier at the Dublin Challenger (IRL).
- Kokkinakis is bidding to record his **6th Tour-level match-win on grass**. His only Tour-level match-wins on grass have come in 2nd round finishes as a wild card at Queen's in both 2015 (d. Jeremy Chardy, I. Gilles Simon) and 2017 (d. Milos Raonic, I. Daniil Medvedev), at 2017 's-Hertogenbosch (d. Mikhail Youzhny, I. Medvedev) and at Wimbledon in 2022 and 2024.
- Kokkinakis is bidding to **defeat a Top 20 player at Wimbledon for the 2nd time**. He has a 1-1 win-loss record against Top 20 players here, falling to No. 3 Djokovic in the 2nd round in 2022 but defeating No. 17 Auger-Aliassime in the 1st round in 2024. He has a 3-10 win-loss record against Top 20 players at the Grand Slams and an 8-30 win-loss record against Top 20 players at Tour-level overall.
- Kokkinakis won the only **5-set match** he has contested at Wimbledon, defeating Auger-Aliassime in the 1st round in 2024. He has a 9-7 win-loss record in 5-set matches at Tour-level overall.

- Kokkinakis has recorded **4 successful comebacks from 0-2 down** – against Lukas Rosol in a Davis Cup tie between Australia and Czechia in 2015, against Bernard Tomic in the 2nd round at 2015 Roland Garros, against Giulio Zeppieri in the 2nd round at the 2024 Australian Open and against Auger-Aliassime in the 1st round here in 2024.
- Kokkinakis reached a **career-high ranking** of No. 65 in November 2023. He dropped out of the Top 100 in April 2025 and fell as low as No. 892 in May this year, his lowest ranking since June 2017. He plays here at No. 491 and is the lowest-ranked player to begin the men's singles draw here this year. He entered the draw under a protected ranking of No. 84.
- Kokkinakis **won the 2022 Australian Open men's doubles title** alongside Nick Kyrgios. The pair defeated Matthew Ebden/Max Purcell in the first all-Australian Grand Slam men's doubles final since the 1980 Australian Open. They became the first all-Australian team to win a Grand Slam men's doubles title since Todd Woodbridge/Mark Woodforde at 2000 Wimbledon.
- Kokkinakis is a **former Australian Open boys' singles finalist**, falling to Kyrgios in 2013. He also reached the boys' singles final at the 2013 US Open (I. Borna Coric) and won the boys' doubles title at 2013 Wimbledon with Kyrgios. He reached the 3rd round in his only appearance in the boys' singles here in 2013 (I. Laslo Djere).
- Kokkinakis was a member of the **Australian team which reached the Davis Cup final for the first time since 2003** in 2022. He was also a member of the team at the 2023 Finals Group Stage, but missed the Final 8 Knockout Stage in Malaga, where the team also finished as runners-up, due to an ankle injury. He has an 8-8 win-loss record in the competition. Australia will play Poland at home in a 2026 World Group I tie in September.
- Kokkinakis is coached by Brandon Walkin.

- Lehecka's **best Grand Slam result** is reaching the quarterfinals on 2 occasions – at the 2023 Australian Open (l. Stefanos Tsitsipas) and at the 2025 US Open (l. Carlos Alcaraz).
- **In Grand Slam play this year**, Lehecka fell in the 1st round at both the Australian Open (l. Arthur Gea) and Roland Garros (l. Pablo Carreno Busta).

- Popyrin's **best Wimbledon result** is reaching the 3rd round in 2024. He defeated Thiago Monteiro and Tomas Martin Etcheverry before falling to Novak Djokovic.
- Popyrin's **best Grand Slam result** is reaching the round of 16 on 2 occasions – at the 2024 US Open (l. Frances Tiafoe) and at 2025 Roland Garros (l. Tommy Paul).
- **In Grand Slam play this year**, Popyrin fell in the 1st round at both the Australian Open (l. Alexandre Muller) and Roland Garros (l. Zachary Svajda).
- Popyrin's **best results in 2026** are reaching the quarterfinals at Houston (l. Frances Tiafoe) and Geneva (l. Casper Ruud).

- Popyrin is coached by Neville Godwin.

Mensik has lost Grand Slam matches to players ranked as low as No. 123 Samuel twice before – he fell to No. 200 Henrique Rocha in the 2nd round at 2025 Roland Garros and to No. 184 Ugo Blanchet in the 2nd round at the 2025 US Open.

Mensik has won both matches he has contested against wild cards at the Grand Slams. He defeated Tristan Schoolkate in the 2nd round at the 2024 US Open and defeated Titouan Droguet in the 1st round at Roland Garros this year.

Mensik is facing a British player at a Grand Slam for the first time. He has won all 4 matches he has contested against British players at Tour-level – including his only match against a British player at a British grass court event. He defeated Cameron Norrie in the 1st round at Queen's last year.

Mensik has won 2 of the 3 matches he has contested against players at their home Grand Slams. He fell to USA's Taylor Fritz in the 3rd round at the 2023 US Open but defeated France's Alexandre Muller in the 1st round at Roland Garros last year and defeated France's Droguet in the 1st round and Roland Garros this year.

- Samuel made his **Grand Slam and Tour-level debut** as a qualifier at Roland Garros this year. He defeated Martin Damm, David Goffin and Gonzalo Bueno to qualify before falling to Alex de Minaur in the 1st round of the main draw. His only other appearance at a Grand Slam, in the main draw or qualifying, came at 2023 Wimbledon – as a wild card, he reached the 2nd round of qualifying (d. Antoine Bellier, l. Sho Shimabukuro).
- Samuel reached his **first Tour-level semifinal** as a lucky loser at Eastbourne last week. He defeated Quentin Halys but fell to Matteo Arnaldi in qualifying and subsequently gained entry to the main draw when Francisco Cerundolo withdrew. He received a bye through the 1st round and defeated Thiago Agustín Tirante and Juan Manuel Cerundolo for his first Tour-level match-wins before falling to Zizou Bergs.

- Tiafoe has won one of the 5 **five-set matches** he has contested at Wimbledon – against Matteo Arnaldi in the 1st round in 2024, when he recorded his first successful comeback from 0-2 down. He has a 10-16 win-loss record in 5-set matches at Tour-level overall.
- Tiafoe is one of **18 American who began the men's singles at Wimbledon this year** – the most since 1995, when 21 Americans contested the men's singles draw here. USA has more players and more seeded players (6) in the men's singles draw here this year than any other nation.

He also reached the boys' singles semifinals at the 2014 US Open (l. Quentin Halys) and achieved a career-high junior ranking of No. 2. He reached the 3rd round on his only appearance in the boys' singles here in 2014 (l. Noah Rubin).
- Tiafoe made his **Davis Cup** debut in September 2018 and has a 1-7 win-loss record in the competition. USA play away against Czechia in the Qualifiers 2nd Round in September.
- Tiafoe is coached by Mark Kovacs.
- Lefthander **ATMANE** is bidding to reach the 2nd round at a Grand Slam for the first time on his Wimbledon debut. This is his 6th Grand Slam appearance overall.
- Atmane has **lost in the 1st round on his previous 5 Grand Slam main draw appearances** – at the Australian Open as a qualifier in 2024 (l. Daniil Medvedev) and as a direct acceptance this year (l. - Atmane has **won one of the last 7 matches he has contested against Top 20 players**, with his only victory against a Top 20 player in that time coming against No. 8 Felix Auger-Aliassime in the 3rd round at Miami-1000 this year. He has a 3-10 win-loss record against Top 20 players at Tour-level overall.
- Atmane has lost all 3 **five-set matches** he has contested – to Ofner in the 1st round at 2024 Roland Garros, to Maestrelli in the 1st round at the Australian Open this year and to Kokkinakis in the 1st round at Roland Garros this year.
- Atmane **broke the Top 50 for the first time** in March and reached a career-high ranking of No. 41 in April. He plays here at No. 52.
- Atmane reached a **career-high junior ranking** of No. 20 in January 2020. He competed in boys' singles at 3 Grand Slam events, reaching the 2nd round at the 2020 Australian Open (d. - **CERUNDOLO** is bidding to reach the 2nd round here for the 2nd time and equal his best Wimbledon result. This is his 5th Wimbledon appearance and 19th Grand Slam overall.
- Cerundolo's **best Wimbledon result** is reaching the 2nd round in 2023 (d. Nuno Borges, l. Jiri Lehecka). He has lost in the 1st round on his 3 other appearances here – in 2022 (l. Rafael Nadal), 2024 (l. Roman Safiullin) and last year (l. Borges).
- Cerundolo's **best Grand Slam result** is reaching the round of 16 on 3 occasions – at Roland Garros in 2023 (l. Holger Rune) and 2024 (l. Novak Djokovic) and at the Australian Open this year (l. Alexander Zverev).
- **Elsewhere in Grand Slam play this year**, Cerundolo reached the 3rd round at Roland Garros, falling to Zachary Svajda in 5 sets.
- Cerundolo's best results in 2026 are winning his **4th and 5th Tour-level titles** – on clay at Buenos Aires (d. Luciano Darderi) and on grass at Queen's (d. Tommy Paul). He is one of 5 players to have won multiple Tour-level men's singles titles in 2026.
- Cerundolo's **other highlights in 2026** are reaching the semifinals at Santiago (l. Yannick Hanfmann) and the quarterfinals at Miami-1000 (l. Zverev) and Munich (l. Zverev).
- Cerundolo has **won 2 Tour-level titles on grass**. In addition to his title at Queen's this year, he also won the title at 2023 Eastbourne (d. Tommy Paul). He is one of 11 players who began the men's singles here this year who have won multiple Tour-level title on grass.

- Cerundolo has won 2 of the 9 **five-set matches** he has contested. His only victories in 5-set matches came against Dane Sweeny in the 1st round at the 2024 Australian Open and against Matteo Arnaldi in the 1st round at the 2025 US Open. He lost the only 5-set match he has contested at Wimbledon – to Safiullin in the 1st round here in 2024.
- Cerundolo broke the Top 20 for the first time in June 2023. He reached a **career-high ranking** of No. 18 in May 2025 and plays here 3 places lower at No. 21.
- Cerundolo **played one season of college tennis** at the University of South Carolina in 2017-18, recording a 6-3 singles win-loss record during the season.
- Cerundolo made his **Davis Cup** debut for Argentina in 2022 and has a 7-5 win-loss record in the competition. Argentina will play at home against Turkiye in a 2026 World Group I tie in September.
- Cerundolo's younger brother, Juan Manuel, is also a Top 50 player and is currently ranked at No. 42. He fell to No. 22 seed Alejandro Davidovich Fokina in the 1st round on Monday.

- **MUNAR** is bidding to reach the 2nd round here for the 5th consecutive year. This is his 7th Wimbledon appearance and his 31st Grand Slam overall.
- Last year here, Munar recorded his **best Wimbledon result** by reaching the 3rd round. He defeated Alexander Bublik and Fabian Marozsan before falling to Marin Cilic.
- Munar's **best Grand Slam result** is reaching the round of 16 at the US Open last year. He defeated Jaime Faria, Gabriel Diallo and Zizou Bergs before falling to Lorenzo Musetti.
- **In Grand Slam play this year**, Munar reached the 2nd round at the Australian Open (d. Dalibor Svrčina, l. Casper Ruud) but fell in the 1st round at Roland Garros (l. Hubert Hurkacz).
- Munar's **best Tour-level results in 2026** are reaching the quarterfinals at Adelaide (l. Tomas Machac), Rotterdam (l. Bublik) and Geneva (l. Mariano Navone).
- **Prior to Wimbledon this year**, fell in the 1st round at both 's-Hertogenbosch (l. Martin Damm) and Eastbourne (l. Bergs). He is bidding to end a 4-match losing streak, having not recorded a victory since reaching the quarterfinals at Geneva.
- Munar is bidding to **defeat a Top 30 player at a Grand Slam for the first time on his 20th attempt**. He has lost all 19 matches he has played against Top 30 players at the Grand Slams, including all 4 matches he has played against Top 30 players at Wimbledon. The highest-ranked player he has defeated at the Grand Slams is No. 31 Bublik in the 1st round here last year.
- Munar is bidding to **defeat a Top 30 player on grass for the first time on his 7th attempt**. He has lost all 6 matches he has played against Top 30 players on grass. The highest-ranked player he has defeated on grass is No. 31 Bublik in the 1st round here last year. He has a 23-68 win-loss record against Top 30 players at Tour-level overall.
- Munar has **won one of the 2 five-set matches** he has contested at Wimbledon – falling to Norrie in 5 sets in the 2nd round in 2022 before defeating Bublik in 5 sets in the 1st round last year. He has a 4-7 win-loss record in 5-set matches at Tour-level.
- Munar **broke the Top 50 for the first time** in July last year reached a career-high ranking of No. 33 in December last year. He plays here at No. 44.
- Munar was a **successful junior**, reaching a career-high junior ranking of No. 3. He reached the boys' singles final at Roland Garros in 2014 (l. Andrey Rublev) and was a member of the Spain team that won the 2013 Junior Davis Cup by beating Germany 2-0 in the final. He reached the 2nd round on his only appearance in the boys' singles here in 2014 (d. Kang Ku Keon, l. Francisco Bahamonde Nicastro).
- Munar was a member of the **Spanish Davis Cup team that reached the final for the first time since 2019 last year**, falling to Italy in the final. He won 3 of the 6 matches he contested in the competition in 2025. He made his Davis Cup debut for Spain in 2017 and has a 3-4 win-loss record overall in the competition. As 2025 runners-up, Spain received a bye to the 2026 Qualifiers 2nd Round and will play away against Chile in September.
- Munar is coached by Javier Fernandez and Miguel Sanchez.

Head-to-head: first meeting

Khachanov has lost Grand Slam matches to players ranked as low as No. 155 Harris on 3 occasions – including once at Wimbledon, when he fell to No. 220 Quentin Halys in the 2nd round in 2024. He also fell to No. 216 Vasek Pospisil in the 1st round at the 2019 US Open and to No. 184 Daniel Evans in the 1st round at the 2024 US Open.

Khachanov has won 10 of the 11 matches he has contested against qualifiers at the Grand Slams, with his only defeat coming against Halys in the 2nd round here in 2024. He has won the 3 other matches he has played against qualifiers at Wimbledon. He has a 45-14 win-loss record against qualifiers at Tour-level overall.

Khachanov is facing a British player at Wimbledon for the first time. He has a 2-2 win-loss record against British players at the Grand Slams and an 11-11 win-loss record against British players at Tour-level overall.

Khachanov has an 8-2 win-loss record against players at their home Grand Slams. He has won all 4 matches he has contested against French players at Roland Garros and has a 2-1 win-loss record against both Australian players at the Australian Open and American players at the US Open.

- **KHACHANOV** is bidding to maintain his record of always reaching the 2nd round here. This is his 7th Wimbledon appearance and his 37th Grand Slam overall.
- Last year here, Khachanov equalled his **best Wimbledon result** by reaching the quarterfinals. He defeated Mackenzie McDonald, Shintaro Mochizuki, Nuno Borges and Kamil Majchrzak before falling to Taylor Fritz. He also reached the quarterfinals here in 2021 (l. Denis Shapovalov).
- Khachanov's **best Grand Slam result** is reaching the semifinals on 2 occasions – at the 2022 US Open (l. Casper Ruud) and the 2023 Australian Open (l. Stefanos Tsitsipas).
- **In Grand Slam play this year**, Khachanov reached the 3rd round at both the Australian Open (l. Luciano Darderi) and Roland Garros (l. Jesper de Jong).
- **Prior to Wimbledon this year**, Khachanov competed at Halle but fell to Ethan Quinn in the 1st round.
- Khachanov's **best results in 2026** are reaching the quarterfinals at Doha (l. Carlos Alcaraz) and Rome-1000 (l. Ruud).
- Khachanov has won 6 of the 8 **five-set matches** he has contested at Wimbledon with his only defeats in a 5-set match here coming against Shapovalov in the quarterfinals in 2021 and against Halys in the 2nd round in 2024. He has a 13-14 win-loss record in 5-set matches at Tour-level overall.
- Khachanov **broke the Top 10 for the first time** in June 2019 and reached a career-high ranking of No. 8 the following month. He plays here at No. 22.
- Khachanov **won the men's singles silver medal at the Tokyo 2020 Olympic Tennis Event** in 2021, falling to Alexander Zverev in the gold medal match. Along with Andrey Rublev, who won mixed doubles gold, he became the first tennis player to win medals at both the Youth Olympic Games and the Olympic Games. He did not compete at the Paris 2024 Olympic Tennis Event.

- Khachanov won the **boys' doubles silver medal** alongside Rublev at the 2014 Youth Olympic Tennis Event in Nanjing, China. The pair fell to Orlando Luz/Marcelo Zormann in the gold medal match. He reached the 2nd round in his only appearance in the boys' singles here in 2013 (d. Marcelo Zormann, I. Laslo Djere).
- Khachanov is coached by Vedran Martic and Evgeny Donskoy.
- Qualifier **HARRIS** is bidding to reach the 2nd round here for the 2nd time and equal his best Grand Slam result. This is his 3rd Wimbledon appearance and his 4th Grand Slam overall.
- As No. 23 seed, Harris defeated Stefano Napolitano (ITA) 62 62, Zsombor Piros (HUN) 64 64 and Zhou Yi (CHN) 16 76(2) 62 63 in the 3 rounds of **Wimbledon qualifying** last week. It is the first time he has successfully qualified at a Grand Slam on his 11th attempt. It was his 3rd appearance in qualifying at Wimbledon, having lost in qualifying here in both 2022 and 2023.
- Aged 31 years 168 days, Harris has become the **2nd-oldest British man to qualify at Wimbledon in the Open Era** – after John Paish, who qualified here aged 32 years 103 days in 1980. (NB ages calculated at the end of the tournament)
- Harris is one of 3 British men to qualify here, alongside Max Basing and Oliver Tarvet, both of whom lost in the 1st round on Monday. It is the **first time that multiple British men have successfully qualified at Wimbledon since 1999**, when Delgado, Arvind Parmar and Danny Sapsford all qualified here.
- Last year here, Harris recorded his **best Grand Slam result** by reaching the 2nd round. He defeated Dusan Lajovic for his first Grand Slam match-win before falling to Nuno Borges. He fell in the 1st round on his 2 other appearances in the main draw at a Grand Slam – as a wild card here in 2024 (I. Jaume Munar) and as a lucky loser at the 2025 US Open (I. Felix Auger-Aliassime).
- **In Grand Slam play this year**, Harris fell in the 1st round of qualifying at both the Australian Open (I. Chris Rodesch) and Roland Garros (I. Coleman Wong).
- **Prior to Wimbledon this year**, Harris reached the quarterfinals at the Nottingham 2 Challenger (GBR), defeating Wong and Arthur Gea before falling to Otto Virtanen. - Harris's **best result in 2026** is reaching the semifinals as an alternate at the Phoenix Challenger (USA) (I. Ethan Quinn). It is one of just 3 occasions in 2026, along with his quarterfinal finish at the Nottingham 2 Challenger and his appearance in qualifying here, where he has advanced beyond the 2nd round at an event.
- Harris is bidding to record his **10th Tour-level match-win on grass**. Nine of his 12 Tour-level match-wins have come on grass, with his 3 other Tour-level match-wins coming on hard courts – on his Tour-level debut as a qualifier at 2023 Sofia, where he reached the 2nd round (d. Marc-Andrea Huesler, I. Jan-Lennard Struff), against Virtanen at the 2024 Davis Cup Finals Group Stage and against Mochizuki at the United Cup this year.
- Harris is one of the 11 British players competing in the men's singles draw at Wimbledon this year. It is the **joint-2nd highest number of Brits in the men's singles draw here since 2000** – there were also 11 British men in the singles draw here in 2024. The highest number of British men in the singles draw at Wimbledon since 2000 is 13 last year.
- Harris reached a **career-high ranking** of No. 101 September 2024. He plays here at No. 155.
- Harris reached a **career-high junior ranking** of No. 139 in January 2013. He reached the 2nd round on his only appearance in the boys' singles here, as a wild card in 2013 (d. Jaime Ignacio Galleguillos, I. Filippo Baldi).
- Harris made his **Davis Cup** debut for Great Britain at the 2024 Finals Group Stage and has a 1-2 overall win-loss record in the competition. Great Britain will play at home against Ecuador in the 2026 Qualifiers 2nd Round in September.
- Harris is coached by his father, Geoff Harris, and Colin Beecher.

- **FILS** is bidding to reach the 2nd round here for the 2nd time. This is his 3rd Wimbledon appearance and his 10th Grand Slam overall.
- Fils is making his **first Grand Slam appearance since 2025 Roland Garros**, when he defeated Nicolas Jarry and Jaume Munar before giving a walkover to Andrey Rublev due to a back injury. He contested just one event in 2025 after Roland Garros, reaching the 3rd round at Toronto-1000 (l. Jiri Lehecka). He missed the Australian Open this year and began his 2026 season at Montpellier in February. He retired in his opening match at Rome-1000 due to a hip injury and has not played since then.
- Fils' **best Grand Slam result** is reaching the round of 16 on his most-recent Wimbledon appearance in 2024. He defeated Dominic Stricker, Hubert Hurkacz and Roman Safiullin before falling to Alex de Minaur. Aged 20 years 32 days, he became the youngest Frenchman to reach the round of 16 at Wimbledon since Richard Gasquet (19 years 15 days) in 2005.
- Fils' best result in 2026 is winning his **4th Tour-level title** at Barcelona (d. Andrey Rublev). He also finished runner-up at Doha (l. Carlos Alcaraz), reached the semifinals at Miami-1000 (l. Jiri Lehecka) and Madrid-1000 (l. Jannik Sinner) and reached the quarterfinals at Montpellier (l. Felix Auger-Aliassime) and Indian Wells-1000 (l. Alexander Zverev).
- Fils **did not contest a grass court event prior to Wimbledon this year**. He is one of 17 players competing in the men's singles here to have not competed on grass at any level prior to Wimbledon this season.
- Fils has won 3 of the 4 **five-set matches** he has contested, including the only 5-set match he has contested at Wimbledon – against Safiullin in the 3rd round in 2024. At the 2023 US Open, he defeated Tallon Griekspoor in the 1st round in 5 sets before falling to Matteo Arnaldi in the 2nd round, also in 5 sets. He also won his most-recent Grand Slam match in 5 sets, against Munar in the 2nd round at Roland Garros last year.
- Fils reached a **career-high ranking** of No. 14 in April last year. He dropped to No. 42 in January – his lowest-ranking since March 2024 – but plays here at No. 24.
- Fils was a **successful junior**. He reached a career-high ranking of No. 3 in July 2021, a month after finishing runner-up in the boys' singles at 2021 Roland Garros (l. Luca Van Assche). He also won the 2021 Roland Garros boys' doubles title alongside Giovanni Mpetshi Perricard. He reached the 2nd round on his only appearance in the boys' singles at Wimbledon in 2021 (d. Kokoro Isomura, l. Victor Lilov).

- Fils made his **Davis Cup** debut for France in 2023 and has a 2-3 win-loss record in the competition. France will play away against Canada in the Qualifiers 2nd Round in September.
- Fils is coached by Ivan Cinkus and 2001 Wimbledon champion Goran Ivanisevic.
- **COLLIGNON** is bidding to reach the 2nd round here for the first time. This is his 2nd Wimbledon appearance and his 5th Grand Slam overall.
- Last year here, **on his Grand Slam main draw debut**, Collignon fell to Marin Cilic in the 1st round.
- Collignon's **best Grand Slam result** is reaching the 3rd round on 2 occasions – at the 2025 US Open, where he defeated Daniel Elahi Galan and Casper Ruud before falling to Jiri Lehecka, and at Roland Garros this year, where he defeated Aleksandar Vukic and Ben Shelton before falling to Matteo Arnaldi.
- **Elsewhere in Grand Slam play this year**, Collignon fell in the 1st round at the Australian Open, retiring due to cramping in the 4th set of his match against Lorenzo Musetti.

- As No. 11 seed, Sweeny defeated Franco Roncadelli (URU) 64 62, Darwin Blanch (USA) 26 76(7) 4-0 ret. and No. 20 seed Tomas Barrios Vera (CHI) 46 64 76(5) 06 62 in the **3 rounds of qualifying** here last week. It is his 3rd time he has successfully qualified at a Grand Slam on his 12th attempt.
- Sweeny was **ranked too low to enter qualifying here in 2025**. He fell in the 1st round of qualifying on both of his previous appearances in Wimbledon qualifying – in 2023 (l. Dragos Nicolae Madaras) and 2024 (l. Bernabe Zapata Miralles).
- Sweeny recorded his **best Grand Slam result** by reaching the 2nd round as a qualifier at the Australian Open this year, defeating Gael Monfils for his first Grand Slam match-win before falling to Ben Shelton. His only other Grand Slam main draw appearance came as a qualifier at the 2024 Australian Open, falling to Francisco Cerundolo in 5 sets in the 1st round – the only Tour-level 5-set match he has contested to date.
- Elsewhere in Grand Slam play this year**, Sweeny fell in the 1st round of qualifying at Roland Garros (l. Jay Clarke).
- Prior to Wimbledon qualifying this year**, Sweeny reached the semifinals at the Ilkley Challenger (GBR) (l. Bu Yunchaokete) but fell in the 1st round at the Nottingham 2 Challenger (GBR) (l. Jacob Fearnley). He is making his Tour-level grass court debut today.
- Sweeny's best result in 2026 is winning his **first Challenger-level title**, at the Brisbane 1 Challenger (AUS) (d. Tristan Schoolkate). He also reached the quarterfinals the Brisbane 2 Challenger (AUS) (l. Hiroki Moriya) and the Wuxi Challenger (CHN) (l. Mark Lajal).
- Sweeny **competed mainly on the World Tennis Tour in 2025**. He contested 23 events at World Tennis Tour-level last season and won 8 titles.
- Sweeny is bidding to record his **4th Tour-level match-win**. His 3 Tour-level match-wins have come in 2nd round finishes as a wild card at 2021 Melbourne 1 (d. Nam Jisung, l. Aljaz Bedene), as a qualifier at 2023 Shanghai-1000 (d. Taro Daniel, l. Sebastian Baez) and as a qualifier at the Australian Open this year. He fell in the 1st round at the 3 other Tour-level events he has contested – as a qualifier at 2023 Zhuhai (l. Marc Polmans), the 2024 Australian Open and 2026 Brisbane (l. Reilly Opelka).

- Sweeny reached a **career-high ranking** of No. 126 earlier this month and plays here one place lower at No. 127.
- Sweeny reached a **career-high junior ranking** of No. 21 in May 2019. He lost in the 1st round on his only appearance in the boys' singles here in 2019 (l. Harold Mayot).
- Sweeny is coached by his father, Clay Sweeny.
- **DIMITROV** is bidding to reach the 2nd round here for the 12th time. This is his 16th Wimbledon appearance and his 61st Grand Slam appearance overall.
- **Last year here**, Dimitrov reached the round of 16, where he retired due to a pectoral injury while leading eventual champion Jannik Sinner 63 75 2-2. It was the 5th consecutive Grand Slam event where he retired from a match, having also retired against Daniil Medvedev in the round of 16 here in 2024 due to a knee injury, against Frances Tiafoe in the quarterfinals at the 2024 US Open due to a groin injury, against Francesco Passaro in the 1st round at the 2025 Australian Open due to a hip injury and against Ethan Quinn in the 1st round at 2025 Roland Garros due to a left thigh injury.
- Dimitrov's streak of **58 consecutive Grand Slam appearances** ended when he withdrew from the 2025 US Open due to ongoing recovery from the injury sustained at Wimbledon last year. He had previously contested the main draw at every Grand Slam tournament since the 2011 Australian Open. It was the 5th-longest streak of Grand Slam men's singles appearances in history.
- Dimitrov's **best Grand Slam result** is reaching the semifinals on 3 occasions – including once at Wimbledon, in 2014 (l. Novak Djokovic). He also reached the semifinals at the 2017 Australian Open (l. Rafael Nadal) and the 2019 US Open (l. Daniil Medvedev).
- **In Grand Slam play this year**, Dimitrov fell in the 1st round at the Australian Open (l. Tomas Machac). He also fell in the 1st round of qualifying at Roland Garros (l. Jaime Faria) in his first appearance in qualifying at a Grand Slam since the 2011 Australian Open.
- **Prior to Wimbledon this year**, Dimitrov reached the quarterfinals as a wild card at Mallorca. He defeated Marc Polmans and Abedallah Shelbayh before falling to Alejandro Davidovich Fokina. Elsewhere on grass this season, he reached the quarterfinals at the Dublin Challenger (IRL), where he defeated Chris Rodesch and Conor Gannon before falling to Kyrian Jacquet.
- Dimitrov is bidding to record his **5th Tour-level match-win in 2026**. In addition to his 2 victories at Mallorca last week, he recorded 2nd round finishes at both Brisbane (d. Pablo Carreno Busta, l. Raphael Collignon) and Indian Wells-1000 (d. Terence Atmane, l. Carlos Alcaraz).
- Dimitrov has contested 3 events at Challenger-level this season – his **first appearances at Challenger-level since 2012**. In addition to his quarterfinal finish at the Dublin Challenger, he fell in the 1st round as a wild card at both the Aix En Provence Challenger (FRA) (l. Pol Martin Tiffon) and the Bordeaux Challenger (FRA) (l. Martin Damm).
- Dimitrov has **won one Tour-level title on grass** – at 2014 Queen's (d. Feliciano Lopez). He is one of 27 players to begin the men's singles draw here this year who has won at least one Tour-level title on grass.
- Dimitrov has won 2 of the 4 **five-set matches** that he has contested at Wimbledon. He has a 13-9 win-loss record in 5-set matches overall.
- Dimitrov reached a **career-high ranking** of No. 3 after winning the title at the 2017 ATP Finals (d. David Goffin). He dropped out of the Top 100 for the first time since April 2012 in April this year after more than 14 consecutive years inside the Top 100. He plays here at No. 146.
- Dimitrov is **one of 5 former Wimbledon boys' singles champions** to begin the men's main draw here this year. He won the boys' singles titles here (d. Henri Kontinen) and at the US Open (d. Devin Britton) in 2008 and finished the year at No. 3 in the Junior Rankings.
- Dimitrov is coached by David Nalbandian, who finished as runner-up here in 2002, and Jamie Delgado.

(WC) STAN WAWRINKA (SUI) v MATTEO BERRETTINI (ITA)

Head-to-head: first meeting

Berrettini has won all 3 matches he has contested against wild cards at the Grand Slams – he defeated Marcos Baghdatis in the 2nd round at 2019 Wimbledon, Andrew Harris in the 1st round at the 2020 Australian Open and Stefan Kozlov in the 2nd round at the 2022 Australian Open.

Berrettini is facing the world No. 109 in the 1st round at Wimbledon for the 2nd consecutive year, having fallen to No. 109 Kamil Majchrzak in 5 sets in the opening round here in 2025. He has lost one other Grand Slam match to a player ranked as low as No. 109 Wawrinka – when he fell to No. 186 Daniel Altmaier in the 3rd round at 2020 Roland Garros.

- Wild card **WAWRINKA** is bidding to reach the 2nd round here for the 12th time. Having announced his intention to retire from professional tennis at the end of the 2026 season, this will be his final Wimbledon appearance.
- At 41 years 106 days, Wawrinka is bidding to become the **5th man in the Open Era to reach the 2nd round at Wimbledon aged 41 or older** – after Pancho Gonzales, who reached the 2nd round at Wimbledon on 3 occasions after turning 41 (1969, 1971 and 1972), Torben Ulrich (1970 and 1972), Bob Howe (1968) and Frank Sedgman (1971). Wawrinka is the oldest player to begin the men's singles draw here this year. (NB ages calculated at end of the tournament)
- Wawrinka is bidding to become the **oldest man to reach the 2nd round at a Grand Slam since the 1978 Australian Open**, when Ken Rosewall reached the 3rd round aged 44 years 62 days.
- Wawrinka is the **8th man in the Open Era to compete in the men's singles draw here after turning 41** – and the first since 1975, when Neale Fraser fell in the 1st round aged 41 years 275 days. (NB ages calculated at the end of the tournament)
- Wawrinka is also the **oldest player to compete in the men's singles at a Grand Slam since the 2021 US Open**, when Ivo Karlovic fell in the 1st round aged 42 years 196 days.
- Wawrinka is making his **19th Wimbledon appearance**. He is in joint-5th place on the Open Era list for most Wimbledon men's singles appearances, alongside Fernando Verdasco – behind Roger Federer (22 Wimbledon men's singles appearances), Novak Djokovic (who is making his 21st appearance here this year), and Jimmy Connors and Feliciano Lopez (both 20 appearances here).
- Wawrinka is making his **77th Grand Slam appearance**. He is in 4th place on the Open Era list for most Grand Slam men's singles appearances – behind Djokovic (who is making his 83rd appearance at a Grand Slam here), and Federer and Lopez (both 81 Grand Slam appearances).
- Wawrinka **has not competed on grass since his last appearance here in 2024**, when he reached the 2nd round (d. Charles Broom, l. Gael Monfils). He has lost in the 1st round here on 7 occasions – in 2005 (l. Fabrice Santoro), 2007 (l. Michael Llodra), 2010 (l. Denis Istomin), 2012 (l. Jurgen Melzer), 2013 (l. Lleyton Hewitt), 2017 (l. Daniil Medvedev) and 2022 (l. Jannik Sinner).

- Wawrinka's **best Wimbledon result** is reaching the quarterfinals on 2 occasions – in 2014 (l. Roger Federer) and 2015 (l. Richard Gasquet).
- Wawrinka is a **3-time Grand Slam champion**. He won his first Grand Slam title at the 2014 Australian Open (d. Rafael Nadal) and also won the titles at 2015 Roland Garros and the 2016 US Open, defeating Djokovic on both occasions. He defeated both the No. 1 and No. 2 seeds en route to his first 2 Grand Slam title victories and is the only player to have achieved the feat en route to winning a Grand Slam since Sergi Bruguera won the title at 1993 Roland Garros. He is one of 6 Grand Slam champions to start the main draw here.
- In Grand Slam play this year**, Wawrinka reached the 3rd round as a wild card at the Australian Open, where he defeated Laslo Djere and Arthur Gea before falling to Taylor Fritz. He became the first man to reach the 3rd round at a Grand Slam aged 40 or older since Rosewall at the 1978 Australian Open. He fell to Jesper de Jong in the 1st round as a direct acceptance at Roland Garros. (NB ages calculated at the end of the tournament)
- Wawrinka is bidding to record his **8th Tour-level match-win of 2026**. Apart from his 2 victories in his 3rd round finish at the Australian Open, his only victories at Tour-level so far this season have come at the United Cup, where he defeated France's Arthur Rinderknech, and in 2nd round finishes as a wild card at Montpellier (d. Hamad Medjedovic, l. Felix Auger-Aliassime), Rotterdam (d. Thijs Boogaard, l. Alex de Minaur), Dubai (d. Benjamin Hassan, l. Daniil Medvedev) and Geneva (d. Raul Brancaccio, l. Alex Michelsen). He has lost in the 1st round at the 3 other Tour-level events he has contested this season.
- Wawrinka's **best Tour-level grass court result** is finishing runner-up at 2013 's-Hertogenbosch (l. Nicolas Mahut). He is one of 17 players competing in the men's singles who has not played a grass court event this season, at any level, prior to Wimbledon this year.
- Wawrinka has won one of the 6 **five-set matches** he has contested at Wimbledon, with his only victory in a 5-set match here coming against Karlovic in the 1st round in 2006. He has a 31-27 win-loss record in 5-set matches at Tour-level overall.
- Having contested 49 five-set matches at the Grand Slams, Wawrinka jointly holds the **Open Era record for most 5-set matches played at the Grand Slams**, alongside Djokovic*.

- Having contested 58 five-set matches at Tour-level, Wawrinka jointly holds the **Open Era record for most 5-set matches played at Tour-level** with Ivan Lendl.

- Wimbledon is Wawrinka's **least successful Grand Slam** in terms of matches won. He has a 23-18 win-loss record here, compared with 46-20 at Roland Garros, 46-16 at the US Open and 45-19 at the Australian Open.
- Wawrinka reached a **career-high ranking** of No. 3 in January 2014 after winning his first Grand Slam title at the Australian Open. He plays here at No. 109.
- Wawrinka was the 2003 **Roland Garros junior champion** (d. Brian Baker) – the only junior Grand Slam event he contested.

- Wawrinka was a member of the Switzerland team which defeated France to win the 2014 **Davis Cup** title. He made his Davis Cup debut in 2004 and has a 28-30 win-loss record in the competition. Switzerland will play away against Brazil in a World Group I tie in September.
- Wawrinka is coached by former world No. 2 Magnus Norman.
- **BERRETTINI** is bidding to reach the 2nd round here for the 6th time. This is his 7th Wimbledon appearance and his 26th Grand Slam overall.
- **Last year here**, Berrettini fell to Kamil Majchrzak in 5 sets in the 1st round. It was the first time he had failed to reach the 2nd round here.
- Berrettini became the **first Italian man in history to contest the final at Wimbledon in 2021**, falling to Novak Djokovic in 4 sets. He also became the first Italian man to reach a Grand Slam final since Adriano Panatta at 1976 Roland Garros. He is one of 3 active Italian players to have reached a Grand Slam men's singles final, alongside Jannik Sinner (6 Grand Slam final appearances) and Flavio Cobolli (one).
- **In Grand Slam play this year**, Berrettini reached the quarterfinals at Roland Garros – the first time he has reached the quarterfinals at a Grand Slam since the 2022 US Open. He defeated Marton Fucsovics, Arthur Rinderknech, Francisco Comesana and Juan Manuel Cerundolo before retiring against Matteo Arnaldi due to a hip injury. He withdrew from the Australian Open due to an oblique injury.
- Berrettini's **other highlights in 2026** are reaching the quarterfinals at Rio de Janeiro (l. Ignacio Buse) and the 3rd round at Miami-1000 (l. Valentin Vacherot) and as a wild card at Monte Carlo-1000 (l. Joao Fonseca). He also reached the quarterfinals at the Cagliari Challenger (ITA) (l. Hubert Hurkacz) – one of his 2 appearances at Challenger-level this season.
- Berrettini **did not contest a grass court event prior to Wimbledon this year**. He is one of 17 players competing in the men's singles here to have not competed on grass at any level prior to Wimbledon this season.
- Berrettini has **won 4 Tour-level titles on grass** – at Stuttgart in 2019 (d. Felix Auger-Aliassime) and 2022 (d. Andy Murray), and at Queen's in 2021 (d. Cameron Norrie) and 2022 (d. Filip Krajinovic). He is one of 11 players competing here this year to have won multiple Tour-level titles on grass.
- Berrettini has won 2 of the 3 **five-set matches** he has contested at Wimbledon. He recorded 5-set victories against Jack Sock in the 1st round in 2018 and Diego Schwartzman in the 3rd round in 2019, but fell to Majchrzak in 5 sets in the 1st round last year. He has an 8-3 win-loss record in 5-set matches at Tour-level overall.
- Berrettini reached a **career-high ranking** of No. 6 in January 2022 after reaching the semifinals at the Australian Open. He plays here at No. 51.
- Berrettini was a member of the **Italian Davis Cup teams that won back-to-back titles in 2024-25**, winning all 9 Davis Cup matches across the 2 seasons. He did not compete during the 2023 season, when Italy also won the title. He made his competition debut in 2019 and has a 14-4 overall win-loss record in the competition. As hosts, Italy have received a wild card to the 2026 Davis Cup Final 8 Knockout Stage in Bologna in November.
- Berrettini is coached by Alessandro Bega and Umberto Rianna.
