2026 WIMBLEDON DAY 6 MEN'S NOTES Saturday 4 July 3rd Round – Bottom Half

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On court today...

- No. 2 seed Alexander Zverev is scheduled 2nd on No. 1 Court today as he looks to equal his best Wimbledon result by defeating Marcos Giron and reaching the round of 16 here. If he downs the American he will become the 3rd German man in the Open Era to reach the round of 16 here on 4 or more occasions, after 3-time Wimbledon champion Boris Becker and 1991 Wimbledon champion Michael Stich. Meanwhile Giron is bidding to reach the last 16 at a Grand Slam for the first time here – but he will need to defeat a Top 5 player at a Grand Slam for the first time on his 4th attempt if he is to do so.
- The last men's match of the day on No. 1 Court is the first meeting between a pair of Top 20 players at Wimbledon this year, with Alexander Bublik up against Frances Tiafoe. Both men are looking to reach the round of 16 here for the 2nd time – and both have displayed strong grass court pedigree in recent years. Between them, Bublik and Tiafoe have won the title at Halle in 3 of the last 4 years, with Bublik winning in 2023 and 2025, and Tiafoe lifting the trophy this year. The duo are tied at 2-2 in their overall head-to-head and tied at 1-1 in their head-to-head in grass court matches, having contested a match at both Eastbourne and Wimbledon in 2022 – numbers which make it difficult to pick a favourite for today's match.
- Italian tennis has had an embarrassment of riches in recent years, and that could well continue today. Matteo Berrettini (who plays Grigor Dimitrov on Centre Court), Flavio Cobolli (who faces Karen Khachanov on No. 2 Court) and Lorenzo Sonego (who takes on Taylor Fritz on No. 2 Court) have all reached the round of 16 here before and will write another chapter in Italian tennis history if they all win here today. If all 3 men win and join defending champion Jannik Sinner in the last 16, it will be the 2nd time in history that 4 Italian men have reached the round of 16 at a major – after 1947 Roland Garros. If 2 of Berrettini, Cobolli and Sonego win today, it will be the 3rd consecutive major with 3 Italian men in the round of 16, and the 10th in history.
- Arthur Fery is the last Brit standing in either singles draw here this year. Last up on Court 18, the wild card will look to put in a strong performance against Zizou Bergs in an effort to reach the round of 16 at a Grand Slam for the first time here. Should he do so he would become only the 2nd British wild card to reach the men's singles round of 16 at a Grand Slam – after Andrew Foster, who reached the last 16 here as a wild card in 1993. If fellow wild card Dimitrov also defeats Berrettini on Centre Court, it will be the 4th time that 2 wild cards have reached the men's singles round of 16 at a Grand Slam – and the 2nd time at Wimbledon, after Pat Cash and Mark Woodforde both reached the last 16 here in 1990.

A 5th meeting for Zverev and Giron, their 3rd at a Grand Slam and 2nd at Wimbledon. Giron won the first set the pair played, but Zverev won that first encounter in 4 sets and has won their 3 subsequent matches in straight sets.

Zverev has lost Grand Slam matches to players ranked as low as No. 92 Giron on 4 occasions, including 3 times at Wimbledon – to No. 105 Denis Kudla in the 2nd round in 2015, to No. 138 Ernests Gulbis in the 3rd round in 2018 and to No. 124 Jiri Vesely in the 1st round in 2019. He also fell to No. 107 Michael Mmoh in the 2nd round at the 2023 Australian Open.

- Zverev is bidding to reach the round of 16 here for the 4th time and equal his best Wimbledon result. This is his 10th Wimbledon appearance and his 42nd Grand Slam overall.
- Zverev is bidding to become the **3rd German player in the Open Era to reach the men's singles round of 16 at Wimbledon on 4 or more occasions** – after Boris Becker (12 Wimbledon round of 16 appearances) and Michael Stich (5). He is one of 3 German men in the Open Era to have reached the round of 16 here 3 times – alongside Tommy Haas and Alexander Popp.
- Zverev is bidding to reach the round of 16 at a Grand Slam for the 25th time. He is in **2nd place on the Open Era list for most Grand Slam men's singles round of 16 appearances by a German player** – behind Becker, who reached the round of 16 at the Grand Slams on 31 occasions.
- If Zverev wins today and joins Jan-Lennard Struff in the round of 16, it will be the **first time that multiple German players have reached the men's singles round of 16 at Wimbledon since 2012**, when Philipp Kohlschreiber and Florian Mayer both reached the round of 16 here. It would also be the first time that multiple German players have reached the men's singles round of 16 at a Grand Slam since 2025 Roland Garros, when Zverev and Daniel Altmaier reached the round of 16.
- Zverev advanced to the 3rd round after defeating Alexander Blockx 64 67(8) 76(5) 76(0) and Valentin Royer 61 63 76(3) in the opening 2 rounds. His victory against Royer was his **50th Tour-level match-win on grass** – he is one of 8 active players to have recorded 50 Tour-level match-wins on grass.
- **Last year here**, Zverev fell to Arthur Rinderknech in 5 sets in the 1st round.
- Zverev's **best Wimbledon result** is reaching the round of 16 on 3 occasions – in 2017 (l. Milos Raonic), 2021 (l. Felix Auger-Aliassime) and 2024 (l. Taylor Fritz).
- Zverev won his **first Grand Slam title** at Roland Garros this year, defeating Flavio Cobolli in 5 sets in the final. By winning his first Grand Slam title on his 41st appearance at a major, he went 2nd on the Open Era list for most Grand Slam men's singles appearances before winning a first title – after Goran Ivanisevic, who won the title here in 2001 on

his 48th major appearance. He also became the first German player to win a Grand Slam men's singles title since Becker at the 1996 Australian Open.

- Zverev has reached **3 other Grand Slam finals**. In addition to his title at Roland Garros this year, he finished runner-up at the 2020 US Open (l. Dominic Thiem), 2024 Roland Garros (l. Carlos Alcaraz) and the 2025 Australian Open (l. Sinner).
- Zverev is bidding to become the **3rd German man to win the Wimbledon title in the Open Era**, after Becker (1985-86, 1989) and Stich (1991).
- Zverev is bidding to win his 2nd Grand Slam title on his first Grand Slam appearance since winning his first major title and set the **Open Era record for fewest attempts before winning a 2nd Grand Slam men's singles title**. In the Open Era, 7 players have won their 2nd Grand Slam men's singles titles on their 2nd appearances after winning their first – Alcaraz, Sergi Bruguera, Roger Federer, Jan Kodes, Murray, Stan Smith and Guillermo Vilas.
- Zverev is bidding to become the **14th man in history to win back-to-back Roland Garros and Wimbledon titles** – and the 7th in the Open Era after Rod Laver (1969*), Bjorn Borg (1978-80), Rafael Nadal (2008, 2010), Federer (2009), Novak Djokovic (2021) and Alcaraz (2024). (*NB Laver also achieved the feat prior to the Open Era, in 1962)
- If Zverev reaches the final here, he will become the **13th player in the Open Era to reach the men's singles final at all 4 Grand Slam tournaments** – and the 4th player in the Open Era to complete the set of Grand Slam final appearances at Wimbledon, after Ivan Lendl (1986), Jim Courier (1993) and Sinner (2025). He would also become the 3rd player to achieve the feat in the last 12 months, after Sinner at 2025 Wimbledon and Alcaraz at the Australian Open this year.
- **Elsewhere in Grand Slam play this year**, Zverev reached the semifinals at the Australian Open (l. Alcaraz).
- **Prior to Wimbledon this year**, Zverev reached the semifinals at Halle (l. Fritz).
- Zverev's **other highlights in 2026** are finishing runner-up at Madrid-1000 (l. Sinner) and reaching the semifinals at Indian Wells-1000 (l. Sinner), Miami-1000 (l. Sinner), Monte Carlo-1000 (l. Sinner) and Munich (l. Cobolli).
- Zverev has won 3 of the 8 **five-set matches** he has contested at Wimbledon. He has a 24-15 win-loss record in 5-set matches at Tour-level overall.
- Zverev has reached **3 Tour-level finals on grass** – at Halle in both 2016 (l. Florian Mayer) and 2017 (l. Roger Federer) and at Stuttgart last year (l. Fritz).
- Zverev reached a **career-high ranking** of No. 2 after reaching the semifinals at 2022 Roland Garros. He plays here at No. 3.
- Zverev **won Olympic singles gold for Germany** at the Tokyo 2020 Olympic Tennis Event in 2021, defeating Russian Olympic Committee's Karen Khachanov in the final. It was Germany's 3rd Olympic gold medal in tennis – after Steffi Graf in women's singles at Seoul 1988 and Becker/Stich in men's doubles at Barcelona 1992. He reached the quarterfinals on his title defence at the Paris 2024 Olympic Tennis Event (l. Musetti).
- Zverev was a **successful junior**. He won the boys' singles title at the 2014 Australian Open, defeating Stefan Kozlov in the final. He also finished runner-up in the boys' singles at 2013 Roland Garros (l. Christian Garin) and was named 2013 Junior World Champion. He reached the 3rd round on his only appearance in the boys' singles here in 2013 (l. Kozlov).
- Zverev has played **Davis Cup** for Germany since 2016 and has an 11-6 overall win-loss record in the competition. Germany will play at home against Croatia in the 2026 Qualifiers 2nd Round in September.
- Zverev is coached by his father, Alexander Zverev Sr.
- **GIRON** is bidding to reach the round of 16 at a Grand Slam for the first time. This is his 7th Wimbledon appearance and his 29th Grand Slam overall.
- Giron is bidding to become the **88th American player in the Open Era to reach the men's singles round of 16 at Wimbledon** – and the 8th active American man to do so. (NB fellow American Zachary Svajda is also bidding to reach the round of 16 here for the first time this year)

- Giron is bidding to become the **146th American player in the Open Era to reach the men's singles round of 16 at a Grand Slam** – and the 14th active American man to do so. Giron is also bidding to reach the round of 16 at a Grand Slam for the first time here.
- Giron advanced to the 3rd round after defeating Corentin Moutet 46 64 75 64 and Quentin Halys 76(5) 63 64 in the opening 2 rounds.
- By reaching the 3rd round here, Giron has recorded his **best Wimbledon result**. His previous best result here was reaching the 2nd round for the last 5 years – 2021 (d. Emil Ruusuvuori, I. Hubert Hurkacz), 2022 (d. Holger Rune, I. Alex Molcan), 2023 (d. Hugo Dellien, I. Marton Fucsovics), 2024 (d. Henry Searle, I. Zverev) and 2025 (d. Camilo Ugo Carabelli, I. Jakub Mensik).
- By reaching the 3rd round here, Giron has equalled his **best Grand Slam result**. He has reached the 3rd round at a Grand Slam on 3 other occasions – at Roland Garros in 2021 (I. Cristian Garin) and 2023 (I. Nicolas Jarry), and at the 2025 Australian Open (I. Jannik Sinner).
- **In Grand Slam play this year**, Giron fell in the 1st round at both the Australian Open (I. Learner Tien) and Roland Garros (I. Wu Yibing).
- **Prior to Wimbledon this year**, Giron reached the 2nd round at Stuttgart (d. Roberto Bautista Agut, I. Ben Shelton) but fell in the 1st round as a lucky loser at both Queen's (I. Ignacio Buse) and Eastbourne (I. Jack Draper).
- Giron's **best results in 2026** are reaching the semifinals at Hong Kong (I. Alexander Bublik) and Auckland (I. Sebastian Baez). He fell in the 1st or 2nd round at the 12 other Tour-level events he contested this year prior to Wimbledon.
- Giron has also competed at **2 Challenger events in 2026**, finishing runner-up at the Phoenix Challenger (USA) (I. Ethan Quinn) and reaching the quarterfinals at the Cagliari Challenger (ITA) (I. Roman Andres Burruchaga).
- Giron has won **one Tour-level title** – on grass at 2024 Newport (d. Alex Michelsen). He is one of 27 players who began the men's singles here this year to have won a Tour-level title on grass.
- Giron is bidding to **defeat a Top 5 player at a Grand Slam for the first time**. He has lost all 3 matches he has played against Top 5 players at the Grand Slams – to No. 5 Rafael Nadal in the 1st round at the 2022 Australian Open, to No. 4 Zverev in the 2nd round at Wimbledon in 2024 and to No. 1 Sinner in the 1st round at the 2025 Australian Open. The highest-ranked player he has defeated at a Grand Slam is No. 17 Grigor Dimitrov in the 1st round at 2021 Roland Garros. The highest-ranked player he has defeated at Wimbledon is No. 29 Rune in the 1st round in 2022.
- Giron is bidding to **defeat a Top 5 player for at Tour-level for the 3rd time**. He lost the first 10 matches he played against Top 5 players before defeating No. 5 Casper Ruud in the 2nd round at 2025 Indian Wells-1000 and No. Taylor Fritz in the 2nd round at 2025 Rome-1000. He has a 2-13 win-loss record against Top 5 players at Tour-level overall.
- Giron has won 5 of the 8 **five-set matches** he has contested – including the only 5-set match he has contested at Wimbledon, against Ruusuvuori in the 1st round in 2021.
- Giron played **college tennis**. He represented UCLA between 2012 and 2014, winning the 2014 NCAA singles championship title before turning professional.
- Giron reached a **career-high ranking** of No. 37 in August 2024. He plays here at No. 92.
- Giron reached a **career-high junior ranking** of No. 18 and won the title at the 2011 Easter Bowl (d. Mac Styslinger). He reached the 3rd round on his only appearance in the boys' singles here in 2011 (I. Jason Kubler).
- Giron made his **Davis Cup** debut during USA's 2025 Qualifiers 1st Round victory against Chinese Taipei in February last year, defeating Tseng Chun Hsin in the only match he has contested in the competition to date. USA will play away against Czechia in the Qualifiers 2nd Round in September.
- Giron is coached by Maxime Tabatruong and Karue Sell.

- **DE MINAUR** is bidding to reach the round of 16 here for the 4th time. This is his 8th Wimbledon appearance and his 36th Grand Slam overall.
- De Minaur is bidding to become the **12th Australian player in the Open Era to reach the men's singles round of 16 at Wimbledon on 4 or more occasions** – and the 2nd active Australian player to do so, after Nick Kyrgios, who reached the round of 16 here in 2014-16 and 2022.
- De Minaur is bidding to reach the round of 16 at a Grand Slam for the 15th time and claim sole ownership of **6th place on the Open Era list for most Grand Slam men's singles round of 16 appearances by an Australian player**, ahead of Pat Cash and Mark Philippoussis. Lleyton Hewitt (30 Grand Slam round of 16 appearances), John Newcombe (21*), Ken Rosewall (19*), Tony Roche (17*) and John Alexander (16) are the only Australian men in the Open Era to have reached the round of 16 at the Grand Slams more often than De Minaur. (*NB Newcombe, Roche and Rosewall also recorded Grand Slam round of 16 appearances prior to the Open Era)
- De Minaur advanced to the 3rd round after defeating Roman Andres Burruchaga 76(5) 61 60 and Adrian Mannarino 63 62 62 in the opening 2 rounds.
- **Last year here**, De Minaur reached the round of 16. He defeated Roberto Carballes Baena, Arthur Cazaux and August Holmgren before falling to Novak Djokovic.
- De Minaur's **best Wimbledon result** is reaching the quarterfinals in 2024, when he withdrew ahead of his last 8 match against Djokovic due to a hip injury.
- De Minaur's **best Grand Slam result** is reaching the quarterfinals on 7 occasions. In addition to his quarterfinal finish here in 2024, he has also reached the quarterfinals at the US Open in 2020 (l. Dominic Thiem), 2024 (l. Jack Draper) and 2025 (l. Felix Auger-Aliassime), at 2024 Roland Garros (l. Alexander Zverev) and at the Australian Open in 2025 (l. Jannik Sinner) and 2026 (l. Carlos Alcaraz). He is one of 3 players to have reached 7 or more Grand Slam men's singles quarterfinals without advancing to a semifinal – alongside Andrey Rublev (10 Grand Slam quarterfinal appearances) and Tommy Robredo (7).
- **Elsewhere in Grand Slam play this year**, De Minaur reached the 3rd round at Roland Garros. He defeated Toby Samuel and received a walkover against Alexander Blockx before falling to Jakub Mensik. His match against Mensik was his 100th Grand Slam match.
- **Prior to Wimbledon this year**, De Minaur finished runner-up at 's-Hertogenbosch (l. Kamil Majchrzak) and reached the quarterfinals at Queen's (l. Brandon Nakashima).
- De Minaur's best result in 2026 is winning his **11th Tour-level title** at Rotterdam (d. Auger-Aliassime). He also reached the semifinals at Hamburg (l. Tommy Paul) and the quarterfinals at Monte Carlo-1000 (l. Valentin Vacherot).
- De Minaur has **won 2 Tour-level titles on grass** – at 2021 Eastbourne (d. Lorenzo Sonego) and 2024 's-Hertogenbosch (d. Sebastian Korda). He is one of 11 players who began the men's singles draw here this year to have won multiple Tour-level titles on grass.

- De Minaur has lost both **5-set matches** he has contested at Wimbledon – falling to Steve Johnson in 5 sets in the 2nd round in 2019 and to Cristian Garin in the round of 16 in 2022, despite holding a 2-0 lead. He has a 3-7 win-loss record in 5-set matches at Tour-level overall.
- De Minaur **broke the Top 10 for the first time** in January 2024 and reached a career-high ranking of No. 6 in July 2024 following his quarterfinal finish at Wimbledon. He plays here at the same ranking.
- De Minaur is a **former Wimbledon boys' singles finalist**. He reached the boys' singles final here in 2016 (l. Denis Shapovalov). He reached a career-high junior ranking of No. 2 in February 2016 and also reached the semifinals of the boys' singles at the 2015 US Open (l. Tommy Paul) and the 2016 Australian Open (l. Jurabek Karimov).
- De Minaur led Australia to **back-to-back Davis Cup finals in 2022-23**, the team's first appearances in the Davis Cup final since 2003. The team finished as runners-up to Canada in 2022 and to Italy in 2023. De Minaur won 10 out of 13 Davis Cup matches he contested in 2022-23 and has a 17-11 win-loss record in the competition overall since making his debut in 2018. Australia will play at home against Poland in a 2026 World Group I tie in September.
- De Minaur is coached by Adolfo Gutierrez and Matt Reid.
- **SVAJDA** is bidding to reach the round of 16 at a Grand Slam for the 2nd time and equal his best Grand Slam result. This is his Wimbledon debut and his 8th Grand Slam appearance overall.
- Svajda is bidding to become the **88th American player in the Open Era to reach the men's singles round of 16 at Wimbledon** – and the 8th active American man to do so. (NB fellow American Marcos Giron is also bidding to reach the round of 16 here for the first time this year)
- Svajda is bidding to reach the round of 16 at a Grand Slam for the 2nd time and become the **86th American player in the Open Era to reach the men's singles round of 16 at the Grand Slams on multiple occasions** – and the 9th active American man to do so.
- Svajda advanced to the 3rd round after defeating lucky loser Pablo Llamas Ruiz 61 62 64 and Kamil Majchrzak 26 62 67(5) 64 63 for his **first Tour-level match-wins on grass** in the opening 2 rounds.
- **Last year here**, Svajda reached the 2nd round of qualifying (d. Lukas Neumayer, l. Marton Fucsovics). He also fell in qualifying here in 2023-24.
- Svajda recorded his **best Grand Slam result** by reaching the round of 16 at Roland Garros this year. He defeated Alexei Popyrin, Adam Walton and Francisco Cerundolo before falling to Flavio Cobolli.
- **Elsewhere in Grand Slam play this year**, Svajda qualified for the main draw at the Australian Open but fell to Yannick Hanfmann in the 1st round. He has made his main draw debuts at the Australian Open, Roland Garros and Wimbledon this year, with his 5 other Grand Slam appearances all having come at the US Open.
- Svajda is bidding to record his **9th Tour-level match-win in 2026**. He has recorded 5 victories at the Grand Slams so far this year, with his 3 other Tour-level match-wins coming in 2nd round finishes as a qualifier at Delray Beach (d. Aleksandar Kovacevic, l. Frances Tiafoe), as a wild card at Indian Wells-1000 (d. Marin Cilic, l. Alejandro Davidovich Fokina) and as a direct acceptance at Rome-1000 (d. Marco Trungelliti, l. Casper Ruud).
- **Prior to Wimbledon this year**, Svajda fell in the 1st round as a lucky loser at Queen's (l. Tommy Paul). He also fell in qualifying at Mallorca. His only Tour-level appearance on grass prior to this season came at 2024 Newport, where he fell to Benoit Paire in the 1st round.
- Svajda has **won 7 titles at Challenger-level** – including one on grass, at the 2025 Newport Challenger (USA) (d. Adrian Mannarino). He has contested 2 Challenger-level events in 2026 – he won the title at the San Diego Challenger (USA) (d. Sebastian Korda) but fell in the 1st round at the Cagliari Challenger (ITA) (l. Hubert Hurkacz).
- Svajda is bidding to **defeat a Top 10 player for the first time**. He has lost both previous matches he has contested against Top 10 players – he fell to No. 9 Taylor Fritz in the 2nd round at 2023 Washington and to No. 7 Novak Djokovic in the 2nd round at the 2025 US Open. The highest-ranked player he has defeated is No. 26 Francisco Cerundolo in the 3rd round at Roland Garros this year.
- Svajda broke the Top 100 for the first time in February this year and reached a **career-high ranking** of No. 62 in June. He plays here at No. 66.
- Svajda is coached by Ray Sarmiento.

A 9th Tour-level meeting for Fritz and Sonego – and their 10th at all levels. The pair's first 2 meetings both came during the British grass court season in 2018 – Fritz defeated Sonego in qualifying at Queen's and then in the 1st round here a fortnight later.

Sonego won the pair's only other match at the Grand Slams, in the 3rd round at 2020 Roland Garros. At 36 points, the 3rd-set tiebreak in that match is the joint-2nd longest tiebreak in a men's singles match in Grand Slam history – after the 38-point tiebreak between Jo-Wilfried Tsonga and Andy Roddick at the 2007 Australian Open, and alongside the 36-point tiebreak between John Isner and Jarkko Nieminen at 2014 Wimbledon.

Of the pair's previous 9 meetings at all levels, Fritz has won the 5 matches on hard courts and both matches on grass courts, while Sonego has won both matches on clay courts.

- Fritz is bidding to become **17th American player in the Open Era to reach the men's singles round of 16 at Wimbledon on 4 or more occasions** – and the first active player to do so.
- Fritz is bidding to reach the round of 16 at a Grand Slam for the 11th time and become the **19th American player in the Open Era to reach the men's singles round of 16 at a Grand Slam on 11 or more occasions**. He is in first place on the list for most Grand Slam round of 16 appearances by active American male players.

- Fritz advanced to the 3rd round after defeating lucky loser Dusan Lajovic 63 64 64 and Patrick Kypson 62 62 75 in the opening 2 rounds.

- Last year here, Fritz recorded his **best Wimbledon result** by reaching the semifinals. He defeated Giovanni Mpetshi Perricard, Gabriel Diallo, Alejandro Davidovich Fokina, Jordan Thompson and Karen Khachanov before falling to Carlos Alcaraz. He has reached the quarterfinals or better here in 3 of the last 4 years – he reached the quarterfinals in 2022 (l. Rafael Nadal) and 2024 (l. Lorenzo Musetti) but fell in the 2nd round in 2023 (l. Mikael Ymer).
- Fritz reached his **first Grand Slam final** at the 2024 US Open, where he fell to Jannik Sinner in straight sets. He became the first American player to reach the US Open men's singles final since Andy Roddick finished runner-up in 2006 and the first American player to reach a Grand Slam men's singles final since Roddick finished runner-up at 2009 Wimbledon.
- If Fritz wins his first major title on his 40th Grand Slam appearance, he will go **3rd on the Open Era list for most attempts before winning a first Grand Slam men's singles title** – behind Goran Ivanisevic, who won his only major title at 2001 Wimbledon on his 48th Grand Slam appearance and Alexander Zverev, who won his first major title at Roland Garros this year on his 41st Grand Slam appearance.
- **At the Grand Slams this year**, Fritz reached the round of 16 at the Australian Open, where he defeated Valentin Royer, Vit Kopriwa and Stan Wawrinka before falling to Musetti, but fell in the 1st round at Roland Garros (l. Nishesh Basavareddy).
- **Prior to Wimbledon this year**, Fritz finished runner-up at both Stuttgart (l. Ben Shelton) and Halle (l. Frances Tiafoe). He withdrew from Eastbourne. It was the 2nd straight year that he has reached 2 Tour-level finals on grass prior to Wimbledon – he won the titles at both Stuttgart (d. Zverev) and Eastbourne (d. Jenson Brooksby) in 2025.
- Fritz has **won 5 Tour-level titles on grass**, putting him in 2nd place on the list for most Tour-level men's singles titles total among active players – behind Novak Djokovic, who has won 8 Tour-level titles on grass. In addition to his titles at Stuttgart and Eastbourne last year, he has won 3 other titles at Eastbourne – in 2019 (d. Sam Querrey), 2022 (d. Maxime Cressy) and 2024 (d. Max Purcell).
- Fritz's **other highlights in 2026** are finishing runner-up at Dallas (l. Shelton), reaching the quarterfinals at Delray Beach (l. Tommy Paul) and the round of 16 at Miami-1000 (l. Jiri Lehecka).
- Fritz has won 5 of the 9 **five-set matches** he has contested at Wimbledon, including his wins against Mpetshi Perricard and Diallo in the opening 2 rounds last year. He has a 14-11 win-loss record in 5-set matches at Tour-level overall.
- Fritz reached a **career-high ranking** of No. 4 in November 2024. He plays here at No. 7.
- Fritz is a **former junior world No. 1**. He was named 2015 Junior World Champion after winning the boys' singles title at the 2015 US Open (d. Paul). He also finished as runner-up in the boys' singles at 2015 Roland Garros (l. Paul). His best result in the boys' singles here was reaching the semifinals in 2015 (l. Reilly Opelka).
- Fritz made his **Davis Cup** debut in 2019 and has an 8-4 win-loss record in the competition. USA will play away against Czechia in the 2026 Qualifiers 2nd Round in September.
- Both of Fritz's parents were professional tennis players. His mother, Kathy May, is a former Top 10 player.
- Fritz is coached by Michael Russell and Paul Annacone.
- **SONEGO** is bidding to reach the round of 16 here for the 3rd time and equal his best Wimbledon result. This is his 8th Wimbledon appearance and his 32nd Grand Slam overall.
- Sonego is bidding to become the **4th Italian player in history to reach the men's singles round of 16 at Wimbledon on 3 or more occasions** – after Matteo Berrettini, Nicola Pietrangeli and Jannik Sinner.

- Sonego is bidding to reach the round of 16 at a Grand Slam for the 6th time and become the **11th Italian player in history to reach the men's singles round of 16 at the Grand Slams on 6 or more occasions** – and the 4th active player to do so, after Sinner (who has reached the round of 16 at a Grand Slam for the 20th time here), Berrettini (who is bidding to reach the round of 16 at a Grand Slam for the 12th time today) and Lorenzo Musetti (6 Grand Slam round of 16 appearances).
- Sonego is one of 3 Italian men competing in the 3rd round today, alongside Berrettini and Flavio Cobolli. If all 3 Italians win today and join Sinner in the round of 16, it will be the **2nd time in history that 4 Italian players have reached the men's singles round of 16 at a Grand Slam** – after 1947 Roland Garros, when Mario Belardinelli, Giovanni Cucelli, Ferruccio Quintavalle and Carlo Sada all reached the round of 16.
- If just 2 of Sonego, Berrettini and Cobolli win today, it will be the **2nd time in history that 3 Italian players have reached the men's singles round of 16 at Wimbledon** – after 2025, when Cobolli, Sinner and Sonego all reached the round of 16 here.
- If just 2 of Sonego, Berrettini and Cobolli win today, it will be the **10th time in history that 3 Italian players have reached the men's singles round of 16 at a Grand Slam**. It will also be the 3rd consecutive Grand Slam tournament with 3 Italian men in the round of 16 – after Luciano Darderi, Musetti and Sinner all reached the round of 16 at the Australian Open this year, and Matteo Arnaldi, Berrettini and Cobolli all reached the round of 16 at Roland Garros this year.
- Sonego advanced to the 3rd round after defeating No. 29 seed Tomas Martin Etcheverry 64 64 67(2) 76(4) and Gabriel Diallo 76(4) 46 76(4) 67(6) 62 in the opening 2 rounds.
- Sonego's **best Wimbledon result** is reaching the round of 16 on 2 occasions – in 2021, when he defeated Pedro Sousa, Daniel Elahi Galan and James Duckworth before falling to Roger Federer, and last year, when he defeated Jaime Faria, Nikoloz Basilashvili and Brandon Nakashima before falling to Ben Shelton.
- Sonego recorded his **best Grand Slam result** by reaching the quarterfinals at the 2025 Australian Open. He defeated Stan Wawrinka, Joao Fonseca, Fabian Marozsan and Learner Tien before falling to Shelton.
- **In Grand Slam play this year**, Sonego reached the 2nd round at both the Australian Open (d. Carlos Taberner, I. Musetti) and Roland Garros (d. Pierre-Hugues Herbert, I. Tommy Paul).
- **Prior to Wimbledon this year**, Sonego reached the 2nd round at Mallorca (d. Mariano Navone, I. Miomir Kecmanovic) but fell in the 1st round as a lucky loser at Halle (I. Shelton).
- Sonego is bidding to record his **8th Tour-level match-win in 2026**. Before winning his opening 2 matches here, he had recorded 5 match-wins at Tour-level this season – in 2nd round finishes at Hong Kong (d. Rei Sakamoto, I. Shang Juncheng), the Australian Open, Barcelona (d. Pedro Martinez, I. Andrey Rublev), Roland Garros and Mallorca. He missed nearly 3 months on Tour due to a wrist injury – he did not compete between the Australian Open in January and Barcelona in April.
- Sonego's **best grass court performance** is winning the title at 2019 Antalya (d. Miomir Kecmanovic). He also finished runner-up at 2021 Eastbourne (I. Alex de Minaur). He is one of 4 Italian men to win a Tour-level title on grass – alongside Berrettini (4 Tour-level grass court titles), Sinner (2) and Andreas Seppi (one) – and is one of 27 players who began the men's singles draw here to have won a Tour-level title on grass.
- Sonego has won his all 3 **five-set matches** he has contested at Wimbledon, including his 5-set victory against Diallo in the 2nd round here. He also defeated Denis Kudla in 5 sets in the 1st round here in 2022 and defeated Nakashima in 5 sets in the 3rd round here last year. He has an 8-6 Tour-level record in 5-set matches overall.
- Sonego reached a **career-high ranking** of No. 21 in October 2021. He plays here at No. 69.
- Sonego was a member of the **Italian team that won their 2nd Davis Cup title in 2023 and their 4th Davis Cup title in 2025**. He won 5 of the 6 Davis Cup matches he played in 2023 and was nominated for the team in 2025 but did not contest a match. He did not compete in Davis Cup in 2024, when Italy also won the title. - Cobolli is bidding to reach the round of 16 at a Grand Slam for the 3rd time and become the **17th Italian player in history to reach the men’s singles round of 16 at the Grand Slams on 3 or more occasions** – and the 5th active player to do so, after Sinner (who has reached the round of 16 at a Grand Slam for the 20th time here), Berrettini (who is bidding to reach the round of 16 at a Grand Slam for the 12th time today), Lorenzo Musetti (6 Grand Slam round of 16 appearances), Sonego (who is bidding to reach the round of 16 at a Grand Slam for the 6th time today) and Matteo Arnaldi (3).
- Cobolli is one of 3 Italian men competing in the 3rd round today, alongside Berrettini and Sonego. If all 3 Italians win today and join Sinner in the round of 16, it will be the **2nd time in history that 4 Italian players have reached the men’s singles round of 16 at a Grand Slam** – after 1947 Roland Garros, when Mario Belardinelli, Giovanni Cucelli, Ferruccio Quintavalle and Carlo Sada all reached the round of 16.

- If just 2 of Cobolli, Berrettini and Sonego win today, it will be the **10th time in history that 3 Italian players have reached the men’s singles round of 16 at a Grand Slam**. It will also be the 3rd consecutive Grand Slam tournament with 3 Italian men in the round of 16 – after Luciano Darderi, Musetti and Sinner all reached the round of 16 at the Australian Open this year, and Arnaldi, Berrettini and Cobolli all reached the round of 16 at Roland Garros this year.

- Cobolli advanced to the 3rd round after defeating Mariano Navone 16 76(5) 63 76(8) and James Duckworth 76(4) 36 76(3) 61 in the opening 2 rounds. His win against Duckworth was his **100th Tour-level match-win**.
- **Last year here**, Cobolli reached his first Grand Slam quarterfinal. He defeated Beibit Zhukayev, Jack Pinnington Jones, Jakub Mensik and Marin Cilic before falling to Novak Djokovic. On his only other main draw appearance here, in 2024, he reached the 2nd round (d. Rinky Hijikata, l. Alejandro Tabilo).
- Cobolli reached his **first Grand Slam final** at Roland Garros this year, falling to Alexander Zverev in 5 sets. He became the 6th Italian player in history to reach a Grand Slam men's singles final – after Sinner (6 Grand Slam final appearances), Pietrangeli (4), and Berrettini, Giorgio de Stefani and Adriano Panatta (one).
- **Elsewhere in Grand Slam play this year**, Cobolli fell in the 1st round at the Australian Open (l. Arthur Fery).
- Cobolli's other highlight in 2026 is winning his **3rd Tour-level title** at Acapulco (d. Frances Tiafoe). He also finished runner-up at Munich (l. Ben Shelton), reached the semifinals at Delray Beach (l. Sebastian Korda) and reached the quarterfinals at Madrid-1000 (l. Zverev).
- **Prior to Wimbledon this year**, Cobolli competed at Halle but fell to Tiafoe in the 1st round.
- Cobolli lost the only **5-set match** he has contested at Wimbledon. He fell to Tabilo in 5 sets in the 2nd round here in 2024. He has a 3-3 win-loss record in 5-set matches at Tour-level overall.
- Cobolli reached a **career-high ranking** of No. 10 earlier this month after his runner-up finish at Roland Garros. He plays here at the same ranking.
- Cobolli was a **good junior**. He reached a career-high junior ranking of No. 8 in January 2020 and finished his junior career by winning the boys' doubles title at 2020 Roland Garros alongside Dominic Stricker. - **KHACHANOV** is bidding to reach the round of 16 here for the 4th time. This is his 7th Wimbledon appearance and his 37th Grand Slam overall.
- Khachanov is bidding to **reach the round of 16 at the Grand Slams for the 13th time**. He has reached the round of 16 or better at all 4 Grand Slam tournaments. - Khachanov's **best Grand Slam result** is reaching the semifinals on 2 occasions – at the 2022 US Open (l. Casper Ruud) and the 2023 Australian Open (l. Stefanos Tsitsipas).
- **In Grand Slam play this year**, Khachanov reached the 3rd round at both the Australian Open (l. Luciano Darderi) and Roland Garros (l. Jesper de Jong).
- **Prior to Wimbledon this year**, Khachanov competed at Halle but fell to Ethan Quinn in the 1st round.
- Khachanov's **best results in 2026** are reaching the quarterfinals at Doha (l. Carlos Alcaraz) and Rome-1000 (l. Ruud).
- Khachanov is bidding to **defeat a Top 10 player at Wimbledon for the first time**. He has lost both matches he has contested against Top 10 players here – against No. 2 Rafael Nadal in the 3rd round in 2017 and No. 5 Fritz in the quarterfinals last year. The highest-ranked players he has defeated here are No. 37 David Ferrer in the 1st round in 2018 and No. 37 Borges in the 3rd round last year.

- Khachanov is bidding to **defeat a Top 10 player at a Grand Slam for the 2nd time**. He has a 1-16 win-loss record against Top 10 players at the Grand Slams, with his only victory coming against No. 9 Juan Martin del Potro in the round of 16 at 2019 Roland Garros. He has lost all 10 matches he has played against Top 10 players at the Grand Slams since then.
- Khachanov has **won one of the 8 matches he has contested against Top 10 players since the start of the 2025 season**. His only victory against a Top 10 player in that time came against No. 3 Alexander Zverev in the semifinals at Toronto-1000 last year. He has a 16-59 win-loss record against Top 10 players at Tour-level overall.
- Khachanov has won 6 of the 8 **five-set matches** he has contested at Wimbledon with his only defeats in a 5-set match here coming against Shapovalov in the quarterfinals in 2021 and against Halys in the 2nd round in 2024. He has a 13-14 win-loss record in 5-set matches at Tour-level overall.
- Khachanov **broke the Top 10 for the first time** in June 2019 and reached a career-high ranking of No. 8 the following month. He plays here at No. 22.
- Khachanov **won the men's singles silver medal at the Tokyo 2020 Olympic Tennis Event** in 2021, falling to Alexander Zverev in the gold medal match. Along with Andrey Rublev, who won mixed doubles gold, he became the first tennis player to win medals at both the Youth Olympic Games and the Olympic Games. - Khachanov won the **boys' doubles silver medal** alongside Rublev at the 2014 Youth Olympic Tennis Event in Nanjing, China. The pair fell to Orlando Luz/Marcelo Zormann in the gold medal match. He reached the 2nd round in his only appearance in the boys' singles here in 2013 (d. Marcelo Zormann, I. Laslo Djere).
- Khachanov is coached by Vedran Martic and Evgeny Donskoy.

A 5th meeting for Bublik and Tiafoe, their 3rd on a grass court and their 2nd at Wimbledon. They have split their head-to-head on grass, with both meetings on the surface coming in 2022.

This is the first meeting between Top 20 players in the men's singles draw here this year. Bublik is bidding to defeat a Top 20 player at Wimbledon for the first time. He has lost all 4 matches he has played against Top 20 players here – to No. 1 Andy Murray in the 1st round in 2017, No. 18 Hubert Hrkacz in the 3rd round in 2021, No. 7 Andrey Rublev in the round of 16 in 2023 and No. 13 Tommy Paul in the 3rd round in 2024. The highest-ranked player he has defeated at Wimbledon is No. 21 Grigor Dimitrov in the 2nd round in 2021. He has a 5-11 win-loss record against Top 20 players at the Grand Slams.

Bublik has won one of the last 6 matches he has played against Top 20 players, with his only victory against a Top 20 player in that time coming against No. 13 Jiri Lehecka in the round of 16 at Monte Carlo-1000 this year. He has a 29-57 win-loss record against Top 20 players at Tour-level overall.

Tiafoe is bidding to defeat a Top 20 player at Wimbledon for the 2nd time. He has won one of the 4 matches he has played against Top 20 players here, defeating No. 4 Stefanos Tsitsipas in the 1st round in 2021 but falling to No. 12 Alexander Zverev in the 2nd round in 2017, No. 10 Fabio Fognini in the 1st round in 2019 and No. 3 Carlos Alcaraz in the 3rd round in 2024. He has an 8-17 win-loss record against Top 20 players at the Grand Slams and a 35-76 win-loss record against Top 20 players at Tour-level overall.

Bublik and Tiafoe have, collectively, won the title at Halle in 3 of the last 4 years. Bublik won the title at Halle in both 2023, defeating Rublev in the final, and 2025 defeating Daniil Medvedev in the final. Tiafoe won the title at Halle this year, defeating Taylor Fritz final. - Bublik is bidding to become the **first Kazakhstani player to reach the men's singles round of 16 at Wimbledon on multiple occasions**. Mikhail Kukushkin, who reached the round of 16 here in 2019, is the only other Kazakhstani man to have reached the round of 16 here.
- Bublik is bidding to become the **4th Kazakhstani player, man or woman, to reach the singles round of 16 at Wimbledon on multiple occasions** – after Elena Rybakina, who is bidding to reach the round of 16 here for the 5th time today, and Yaroslava Shevdova (3 Wimbledon round of 16 appearances) and Zarina Diyas (2).

- Bublik's **best Wimbledon result** is reaching the round of 16 in 2023. He defeated Mackenzie McDonald, JJ Wolf and Maximilian Marterer before falling to Andrey Rublev.
- Bublik's **best Grand Slam result** is reaching the quarterfinals at Roland Garros last year. He defeated James Duckworth, Alex de Minaur, Henrique Rocha and Jack Draper before falling to Jannik Sinner. He became the first Kazakhstani player to reach the men's singles quarterfinals at a Grand Slam.
- **In Grand Slam play this year**, Bublik reached the round of 16 at the Australian Open (l. Alex de Minaur) but fell in the 1st round at Roland Garros (l. Jan-Lennard Struff).
- **Prior to Wimbledon this year**, Bublik reached the semifinals at Stuttgart (l. Taylor Fritz) but fell in the 1st round at Halle (l. Mattia Bellucci).
- Bublik's best result in 2026 is winning his **9th Tour-level title** at Hong Kong (d. Lorenzo Musetti). He also reached the semifinals at Rotterdam (l. Felix Auger-Aliassime), Geneva (l. Learner Tien) and Stuttgart and the quarterfinals at Monte Carlo-1000 (l. Carlos Alcaraz).
- Bublik has won **2 Tour-level titles on grass** – at Halle in both 2023 (d. Andrey Rublev) and 2025 (d. Daniil Medvedev). He is one of 11 players who started the men's singles main draw here this year to have won multiple Tour-level titles on grass.
- Bublik has won 2 of the 4 **five-set matches** he has contested in the main draw at Wimbledon – including his 5-set victory against Kokkinakis in the 1st round here this year. He also recovered from 0-2 down to defeat Jakub Mensik in 5 sets in the 1st round in 2024, but lost 5-set matches to Rublev in the round of 16 in 2023 and to Munar in the 1st round last year. He also lost a 5-set match to Daniel Brands in the final round of Wimbledon qualifying in 2017. He has a 6-6 win-loss record in 5-set matches at Tour-level overall.
- Of Bublik's 6 victories in 5-set matches, 3 have been **comebacks from 0-2 down**. In addition to his victory against Mensik in the 1st round here in 2024, he also recorded successful comebacks from 0-2 down against Thomas Fabbiano in the 2nd round at the 2019 US Open and against De Minaur in the 2nd round at 2025 Roland Garros.
- Bublik reached a **career-high ranking** of No. 10 in January after his title-victory at Hong Kong. He is the first Kazakhstani man in history to be ranked inside the Top 10. He plays here one place lower at No. 11.
- Bublik made his **Davis Cup** debut for Kazakhstan in 2019 and has a 15-14 overall win-loss record in the competition. Kazakhstan will play at home against Thailand in a 2026 World Group II tie in September.
- Bublik is coached by Artem Suprunov.
- **TIAFOE** is bidding to reach the round of 16 here for the 2nd time and equal his best Wimbledon result. This is his 9th Wimbledon appearance and his 41st Grand Slam overall.
- Tiafoe is bidding to become the **41st American player in the Open Era to reach the men's singles round of 16 at Wimbledon on multiple occasions** – and the 4th active American player to do so, after Taylor Fritz (who is bidding to reach the round of 16 for the 4th time here this year) and Tommy Paul and Ben Shelton (both 2 Wimbledon round of 16 appearances).

- Tiafoe is bidding to reach the round of 16 at a Grand Slam for the 11th time and become the **21st American player in the Open Era to reach the men's singles round of 16 at a Grand Slam on 10 or more occasions**. He is in 2nd place on the list for most Grand Slam round of 16 appearances by active American male players.

- Tiafoe advanced to the 3rd round after defeating Terence Atmane 76(6) 61 46 64 and Jan Choinski 46 62 75 62 in the opening 2 rounds.
- **Last year here**, Tiafoe reached the 2nd round (d. Elmer Moeller, l. Cameron Norrie).
- Tiafoe's **best Wimbledon result** is reaching the round of 16 in 2022. He defeated Andrea Vavassori, Maximilian Marterer and Alexander Bublik before falling to David Goffin.
- Tiafoe's **best Grand Slam result** is reaching the semifinals at the US Open on 2 occasions – in 2022 (l. Alcaraz) and 2024 (l. Taylor Fritz).
- Tiafoe is contesting his **39th consecutive Grand Slam tournament** here this year. It is the longest active streak of Grand Slam men's singles appearances. He has contested the main draw at every Grand Slam tournament since the 2016 US Open.
- **In Grand Slam play this year**, Tiafoe reached the round of 16 at Roland Garros (l. Matteo Arnaldi) and the 3rd round at the Australian Open (l. Alex de Minaur).
- Prior to Wimbledon this year, Tiafoe won his **2nd Tour-level title on grass** at Halle (d. Taylor Fritz), becoming the first American champion at the event. He also reached the quarterfinals at Stuttgart (l. Jiri Lehecka). His other grass court title came at Stuttgart in 2023 (d. Jan-Lennard Struff). He is one of 11 players who started the men's singles main draw here this year to have won multiple Tour-level titles on grass.
- Tiafoe's **other highlights in 2026** are finishing runner-up at Acapulco (l. Flavio Cobolli), reaching the semifinals at Houston (l. Tommy Paul), reaching the quarterfinals at Delray Beach (l. Learner Tien) and Miami-1000 (l. Jannik Sinner) and reaching the round of 16 at Indian Wells-1000 (l. Alexander Zverev).
- Tiafoe has won one of the 5 **five-set matches** he has contested at Wimbledon – against Matteo Arnaldi in the 1st round in 2024, when he recorded his first successful comeback from 0-2 down. He has a 10-16 win-loss record in 5-set matches at Tour-level overall.
- Tiafoe reached a **career-high ranking** of No. 10 in June 2023. He plays here at No. 19.
- Tiafoe had a **successful junior career**. Aged just 15, he won the 2013 Orange Bowl (d. Stefan Kozlov), becoming the youngest boys' singles winner in the event's history. He also reached the boys' singles semifinals at the 2014 US Open (l. Quentin Halys) and reached a career-high junior ranking of No. 2. - Tiafoe made his **Davis Cup** debut in September 2018 and has a 1-7 win-loss record in the competition. USA play away against Czechia in the Qualifiers 2nd Round in September.
- Tiafoe is coached by Mark Kovacs.

- **LEHECKA** is bidding to the round of 16 here for the 2nd time and equal his best Wimbledon result. This is his 4th Wimbledon appearance and his 17th Grand Slam overall.
- Lehecka is bidding to become the **7th Czech player in the Open Era to reach the men's singles round of 16 at Wimbledon on multiple occasions** – after Tomas Berdych and Ivan Lendl (both 9 Wimbledon round of 16 appearances), Petr Korda (4), Jan Kodes (3) and Radek Stepanek and Jiri Vesely (both 2).
- Lehecka is also bidding to become the **8th Czech player in the Open Era to reach the men's singles round of 16 at the Grand Slams on 5 or more occasions** – after Lendl (42 Grand Slam round of 16 appearances), Berdych (33), Kodes (16), Korda (10), Karel Novacek (6) and Jiri Novak and Tomas Smid (both 5).
- Lehecka advanced to the 3rd round after defeating Alexei Popyrin 64 62 64 and Alex Molcan 63 62 64 in the opening 2 rounds.
- **Last year here**, Lehecka reached the 2nd round (d. Hugo Dellien, l. Mattia Bellucci).
- Lehecka's **best Wimbledon result** is reaching the round of 16 in 2023. He defeated Sebastian Ofner, Francisco Cerundolo and Tommy Paul before retiring against Daniil Medvedev due to a right foot injury.
- Lehecka's **best Grand Slam result** is reaching the quarterfinals on 2 occasions – at the 2023 Australian Open (l. Stefanos Tsitsipas) and at the 2025 US Open (l. Carlos Alcaraz).
- **In Grand Slam play this year**, Lehecka fell in the 1st round at both the Australian Open (l. Arthur Gea) and Roland Garros (l. Pablo Carreno Busta).
- **Prior to Wimbledon this year**, Lehecka reached the semifinals at Stuttgart (l. Ben Shelton) and the 2nd round at Queen's (d. Kamil Majchrzak, l. Rinky Hijikata).
- Lehecka's best result in 2026 is reaching his **first Masters-1000 final** at Miami-1000 (l. Jannik Sinner). He also reached the semifinals at Stuttgart and the quarterfinals at Doha (l. Arthur Fils), Dubai (l. Felix Auger-Aliassime) and Madrid-1000 (l. Fils).
- Lehecka has reached **one Tour-level final on grass**, finishing runner-up at Queen's last year (l. Carlos Alcaraz).

- Lehecka has won one of the 2 **five-set matches** he has contested at Wimbledon – he fell to Filip Krajinovic in 5 sets in the 1st round here in 2022 but defeated Paul in 5 sets in the 3rd round in 2023. He has a 4-1 win-loss record in 5-set matches overall.
- Lehecka reached a **career-high ranking** of No. 12 in May. He plays here 2 places lower at No. 14.
- Lehecka had a **good junior career**. He reached a career-high junior ranking of No. 10 in March 2019 and won the boys' doubles title here in 2019 alongside Jonas Foretjek (d. Liam Draxl/Govind Nanda). He reached the boys' singles quarterfinals at the 2019 Australian Open and the 2019 US Open, falling to Emilio Nava on both occasions. He reached the 2nd round on his only appearance in the boys' singles here in 2019 (d. Harry Wendelken, l. William Grant).
- Lehecka made his **Davis Cup** debut for Czechia in 2019 and has a 12-12 win-loss record in the competition. Czechia will play at home against USA in the Qualifiers 2nd Round in September.
- Lehecka is coached by Michal Navratil.
- **MUNAR** is bidding to reach the round of 16 here for the first time and equal his best Grand Slam result. This is his 7th Wimbledon appearance and his 31st Grand Slam overall.
- Munar is bidding to become the **16th Spanish player in the Open Era to reach the men's singles round of 16 at Wimbledon** – and the 3rd active Spanish player to do so, after Roberto Bautista Agut (5 Wimbledon round of 16 appearances), Carlos Alcaraz (4) and Alejandro Davidovich Fokina, who has reached the round of 16 here for the first time this year.
- Munar is bidding to reach the round of 16 at a Grand Slam for the 2nd time and become the **31st Spanish player in the Open Era to reach the men's singles round of 16 at the Grand Slams on multiple occasions** – and the 5th active Spanish man to do so, after Alcaraz (15 Grand Slam round of 16 appearances), Bautista Agut (14), Pablo Carreno Busta (10) and Alejandro Davidovich Fokina (who has reached the round of 16 at a Grand Slam for the 5th time here this year).
- Munar advanced to the 3rd round after defeating No. 18 seed Francisco Cerundolo 61 64 63 and wild card Jacob Fearnley 64 76(3) 64 in the opening 2 rounds. His victory against Cerundolo was his **first victory against a Top 30 player at a Grand Slam on his 20th attempt**.
- By reaching the 3rd round here, Munar has **equalled his best Wimbledon result**. He also reached the 3rd round here last year, defeating Alexander Bublik and Fabian Marozsan before falling to Marin Cilic.
- Munar's **best Grand Slam result** is reaching the round of 16 at the US Open last year. He defeated Jaime Faria, Gabriel Diallo and Zizou Bergs before falling to Lorenzo Musetti.
- **In Grand Slam play this year**, Munar reached the 2nd round at the Australian Open (d. Dalibor Svrčina, l. Casper Ruud) but fell in the 1st round at Roland Garros (l. Hubert Hurkacz).
- Munar's **best Tour-level results in 2026** are reaching the quarterfinals at Adelaide (l. Tomas Machac), Rotterdam (l. Bublik) and Geneva (l. Mariano Navone).
- **Prior to Wimbledon this year**, Munar fell in the 1st round at both 's-Hertogenbosch (l. Martin Damm) and Eastbourne (l. Bergs). His victory in the 1st round here ended a 4-match losing streak – he had previously not recorded a victory since reaching the quarterfinals at Geneva.
- Munar is bidding to **defeat a Top 20 player at a Grand Slam for the first time**. He has lost all 15 matches he has played against Top 20 players at the Grand Slams, including all 3 matches he has played against Top 20 players at Wimbledon – falling to No. 12 Cameron Norrie in the 2nd round in 2022, No. 16 Musetti in the 2nd round in 2023 and No. 9 Alex de Minaur in the 2nd round in 2024. The highest-ranked player he has defeated at the Grand Slams is No. 21 Francisco Cerundolo in the 1st round here this year. He has an 18-48 win-loss record against Top 20 players at Tour-level overall.
- Munar has won one of the 2 **five-set matches** he has contested at Wimbledon – falling to Norrie in 5 sets in the 2nd round in 2022 before defeating Bublik in 5 sets in the 1st round last year. He has a 4-7 win-loss record in 5-set matches at Tour-level.
- Munar **broke the Top 50 for the first time** in July last year and reached a career-high ranking of No. 33 in December last year. He plays here at No. 44.

- Munar was a **successful junior**, reaching a career-high junior ranking of No. 3 in January 2015. He reached the boys' singles final at Roland Garros in 2014 (l. Andrey Rublev) and was a member of the Spain team that won the 2013 Junior Davis Cup by beating Korea, Rep. 2-1 in the final. He reached the 2nd round on his only appearance in the boys' singles here in 2014 (d. Kang Ku Keon, l. Francisco Bahamonde Nicastro).
- Munar was a member of the **Spanish Davis Cup team that reached the final for the first time since 2019 last year**, falling to Italy in the final. He won 3 of the 6 matches he contested in the competition in 2025. He made his Davis Cup debut for Spain in 2017 and has a 3-4 win-loss record overall in the competition. As 2025 runners-up, Spain received a bye to the 2026 Qualifiers 2nd Round and will play away against Chile in September.
- Munar is coached by Javier Fernandez and Miguel Sanchez.

Berrettini is facing a wild card for the 2nd time here this year, having defeated Stan Wawrinka in the 1st round on Tuesday. He has won all 4 matches he has contested against wild cards at the Grand Slams – in addition to his victory against Wawrinka here this year, he defeated Marcos Baghdatis in the 2nd round at 2019 Wimbledon, Andrew Harris in the 1st round at the 2020 Australian Open and Stefan Kozlov in the 2nd round at the 2022 Australian Open.

Berrettini has lost a Grand Slam match to a player ranked as low as No. 146 Dimitrov once before – when he fell to No. 186 Daniel Altmaier in the 3rd round at 2020 Roland Garros. The lowest-ranked player to have defeated Berrettini at Wimbledon is No. 109 Kamil Majchrzak in the 1st round last year.

Dimitrov and Berrettini are both former champions at Queen's. Dimitrov won the title in 2014 and went on to reach the semifinals here that year. Berrettini won the title in 2021 before reaching his first Grand Slam final here that season. He retained the Queen's title in 2022 but withdrew from Wimbledon due to illness.

- Wild card **DIMITROV** is bidding to reach the round of 16 here for the 6th time. This is his 16th Wimbledon appearance and his 61st Grand Slam appearance overall.
- Dimitrov is bidding to extend his **all-time record for most Wimbledon round of 16 appearances by a Bulgarian player**, man or woman. He claimed sole ownership of the record, ahead of Katerina Maleeva and Magdalena Maleeva, by reaching the round of 16 for the 5th time here last year.
- Dimitrov is bidding to reach the round of 16 at a Grand Slam for the 19th time and extend his **all-time record for most Grand Slam round of 16 appearances by a Bulgarian player**, man or woman. He claimed sole ownership of the record, ahead of Katerina Maleeva, by reaching the round of 16 at a Grand Slam for the 18th time at Wimbledon last year.
- Dimitrov is bidding to become the **12th wild card to reach the men's singles round of 16 at Wimbledon** – after Pat Cash (in both 1986 and 1990), Mark Woodforde (1990), Andrew Foster (1993), Goran Ivanisevic (2001), Mark Philippoussis (2002), Jo-Wilfried Tsonga (2007), Juan Carlos Ferrero (2009), Nick Kyrgios (2014), Denis Kudla (2015) and Tim van Rijthoven (2022). (NB fellow wild card Arthur Fery is also bidding to reach the round of 16 here today)
- Dimitrov is bidding to become the **41st wild card to reach the men's singles round of 16 at a Grand Slam**. He would become the 8th wild card to achieve the feat in the last 10 years – after Juan Martin del Potro (2016 US Open), Denis Istomin (2017 Australian Open), Hugo Gaston (2020 Roland Garros), Jenson Brooksby (2021 US Open), Van Rijthoven (2022 Wimbledon), Rinky Hijikata (2023 US Open) and Arthur Cazaux (2024 Australian Open).

- If Dimitrov and Fery both reach the round of 16 here, it will be the **4th time that 2 wild cards have reached the men's singles round of 16 at a Grand Slam** – after 1990 Wimbledon (when Cash and Woodforde both reached the round of 16 as wild cards), 1991 Roland Garros (Arnaud Boetsch and Alberto Mancini) and 2002 Roland Garros (Arnaud di Pasquale and Paul-Henri Mathieu).
- Dimitrov advanced to the 3rd round after defeating qualifier Dane Sweeny 76(4) 63 75 and No. 15 seed Jakub Mensik 76(5) 46 75 63 in the opening 2 rounds.
- **Last year here**, Dimitrov reached the round of 16, where he retired due to a pectoral injury while leading eventual champion Jannik Sinner 63 75 2-2. It was the 5th consecutive Grand Slam event where he retired from a match, having also retired against Daniil Medvedev in the round of 16 here in 2024 due to a knee injury, against Frances Tiafoe in the quarterfinals at the 2024 US Open due to a groin injury, against Francesco Passaro in the 1st round at the 2025 Australian Open due to a hip injury and against Ethan Quinn in the 1st round at 2025 Roland Garros due to a left thigh injury.
- Dimitrov's streak of **58 consecutive Grand Slam appearances** ended when he withdrew from the 2025 US Open due to ongoing recovery from the injury sustained at Wimbledon last year. He had previously contested the main draw at every Grand Slam tournament since the 2011 Australian Open – the 5th-longest streak of Grand Slam men's singles appearances in history.
- Dimitrov's **best Grand Slam result** is reaching the semifinals on 3 occasions – including once at Wimbledon, in 2014 (l. Novak Djokovic). He also reached the semifinals at the 2017 Australian Open (l. Rafael Nadal) and the 2019 US Open (l. Medvedev).
- **In Grand Slam play this year**, Dimitrov fell in the 1st round at the Australian Open (l. Tomas Machac). He also fell in the 1st round of qualifying at Roland Garros (l. Jaime Faria) in his first appearance in qualifying at a Grand Slam since the 2011 Australian Open.
- **Prior to Wimbledon this year**, Dimitrov reached the quarterfinals as a wild card at Mallorca. He defeated Marc Polmans and Abedallah Shelbayh before falling to Alejandro Davidovich Fokina. Elsewhere on grass this season, he reached the quarterfinals at the Dublin Challenger (IRL), where he defeated Chris Rodesch and Conor Gannon before falling to Kyrian Jaquet.
- Dimitrov is bidding to record his **7th Tour-level match-win in 2026**. In addition to his 2 victories here and his 2 victories at Mallorca last week, his only Tour-level match-wins this year came in 2nd round finishes at both Brisbane (d. Pablo Carreno Busta, l. Raphael Collignon) and Indian Wells-1000 (d. Terence Atmane, l. Carlos Alcaraz).
- Dimitrov has contested 3 events at Challenger-level this season – his **first appearances at Challenger-level since 2012**. In addition to his quarterfinal finish at the Dublin Challenger (IRL), he fell in the 1st round as a wild card at both the Aix En Provence Challenger (FRA) (l. Pol Martin Tiffon) and the Bordeaux Challenger (FRA) (l. Martin Damm).
- Dimitrov has **won one Tour-level title on grass** – at 2014 Queen's (d. Feliciano Lopez). He is one of 27 players who began the men's singles draw here this year who has won at least one Tour-level title on grass.
- Dimitrov has won 2 of the 4 **five-set matches** that he has contested at Wimbledon. He has a 13-9 win-loss record in 5-set matches overall.
- Dimitrov reached a **career-high ranking** of No. 3 after winning the title at the 2017 ATP Finals (d. David Goffin). He dropped out of the Top 100 for the first time since April 2012 in April this year after more than 14 consecutive years inside the Top 100. He plays here at No. 146.
- Dimitrov is **one of 4 former Wimbledon boys' singles champions** through to the 3rd round here from the 5 who began the men's singles event this year. He won the boys' singles titles here (d. Henri Kontinen) and at the US Open (d. Devin Britton) in 2008 and finished the year at No. 3 in the Junior Rankings.
- Dimitrov is coached by David Nalbandian, who finished as runner-up here in 2002, and Jamie Delgado.

- **BERRETTINI** is bidding to reach the round of 16 here for the 4th time. This is his 7th Wimbledon appearance and his 26th Grand Slam overall.
- Berrettini is bidding to become the **3rd Italian player to reach the men's singles round of 16 at Wimbledon on 4 or more occasions** – after Nicola Pietrangeli and Jannik Sinner.

- Berrettini is bidding to reach the round of 16 at a Grand Slam for the 12th time. He is in **3rd place on the all-time list for most Grand Slam men's singles round of 16 appearances by an Italian player** – behind Sinner (who has reached the round of 16 at a Grand Slam for the 20th time here) and Pietrangeli (16 Grand Slam round of 16 appearances).
- Berrettini is one of 3 Italian men competing in the 3rd round today, alongside Flavio Cobolli and Lorenzo Sonego. If all 3 Italians win today and join Sinner in the round of 16, it will be the **2nd time in history that 4 Italian players have reached the men's singles round of 16 at a Grand Slam** – after 1947 Roland Garros, when Mario Belardinelli, Giovanni Cucelli, Ferruccio Quintavalle and Carlo Sada all reached the round of 16.
- If just 2 of Berrettini, Cobolli and Sonego win today, it will be the **2nd time in history that 3 Italian players have reached the men's singles round of 16 at Wimbledon** – after 2025, when Cobolli, Sinner and Sonego all reached the round of 16 here.
- If just 2 of Berrettini, Cobolli and Sonego win today, it will be the **10th time in history that 3 Italian players have reached the men's singles round of 16 at a Grand Slam**. It will also be the 3rd consecutive Grand Slam tournament with 3 Italian men in the round of 16 – after Luciano Darderi, Musetti and Sinner all reached the round of 16 at the Australian Open this year, and Matteo Arnaldi, Berrettini and Cobolli all reached the round of 16 at Roland Garros this year.
- Berrettini advanced to the 3rd round after defeating wild card Stan Wawrinka 67(7) 76(16) 76(7) 76(5) and No. 20 seed Arthur Fils 64 75 36 63 in the opening 2 rounds.
- Berrettini's victory against Wawrinka in the 1st round here is **one of 3 matches in the men's singles at Wimbledon this year where 4 sets went to tiebreaks** – alongside Martin Damm's 76(5) 67(5) 76(2) 76(5) victory against Marco Trungelliti in the 1st round and Jan-Lennard Struff's 46 76(6) 76(5) 67(6) 76(7) victory against Brandon Nakashima in the 2nd round. Prior to this year, just 9 men's singles matches in Wimbledon history had 4 sets which went to tiebreaks.
- At 34 points, the 2nd set tiebreak in Berrettini's victory over Wawrinka in the 1st round here was the **2nd-longest tiebreak in a men's singles match at Wimbledon** – after the 36-point tiebreak in John Isner's 76(17) 76(3) 75 victory against Jarkko Nieminen in the 2nd round in 2014. It was the 4th-longest tiebreak in a men's singles match at the Grand Slams.
- **Last year here**, Berrettini fell to Kamil Majchrzak in 5 sets in the 1st round. It was the first time he had failed to reach the 2nd round here.
- Berrettini became the **first Italian man in history to contest the final at Wimbledon in 2021**, falling to Novak Djokovic in 4 sets. He also became the first Italian man to reach a Grand Slam final since Adriano Panatta at 1976 Roland Garros. He is one of 3 active Italian players to have reached a Grand Slam men's singles final, alongside Jannik Sinner (6 Grand Slam final appearances) and Flavio Cobolli (one).
- **In Grand Slam play this year**, Berrettini reached the quarterfinals at Roland Garros – the first time he has reached the quarterfinals at a Grand Slam since the 2022 US Open. He defeated Marton Fucsovics, Arthur Rinderknech, Francisco Comesana and Juan Manuel Cerundolo before retiring against Arnaldi due to a hip injury. He withdrew from the Australian Open due to an oblique injury.

- Berrettini's **other highlights in 2026** are reaching the quarterfinals at Rio de Janeiro (l. Ignacio Buse) and the 3rd round at Miami-1000 (l. Valentin Vacherot) and as a wild card at Monte Carlo-1000 (l. Joao Fonseca). He also reached the quarterfinals at the Cagliari Challenger (ITA) (l. Hubert Hurkacz) – one of his 2 appearances at Challenger-level this season.
- Berrettini **did not contest a grass court event prior to Wimbledon this year**. He is one of 17 players competing in the men's singles here to have not competed on grass at any level prior to Wimbledon this season.
- Berrettini has **won 4 Tour-level titles on grass** – at Stuttgart in 2019 (d. Felix Auger-Aliassime) and 2022 (d. Andy Murray), and at Queen's in 2021 (d. Cameron Norrie) and 2022 (d. Filip Krajinovic). He is one of 11 players competing here this year to have won multiple Tour-level titles on grass.
- Berrettini has won 2 of the 3 **five-set matches** he has contested at Wimbledon. He recorded 5-set victories against Jack Sock in the 1st round in 2018 and Diego Schwartzman in the 3rd round in 2019, but fell to Majchrzak in 5 sets in the 1st round last year. He has an 8-3 win-loss record in 5-set matches at Tour-level overall.
- Berrettini reached a **career-high ranking** of No. 6 in January 2022 after reaching the semifinals at the Australian Open. He plays here at No. 51.
- Berrettini was a member of the **Italian Davis Cup teams that won back-to-back titles in 2024-25**, winning all 9 Davis Cup matches across those 2 seasons. He did not compete during the 2023 season, when Italy also won the title. He made his competition debut in 2019 and has a 14-4 overall win-loss record in the competition. As hosts, Italy have received a wild card to the 2026 Davis Cup Final 8 Knockout Stage in Bologna in November.
- Berrettini is coached by Alessandro Bega and Umberto Rianna.

Tour-level head-to-head: first meeting

2020 M15 Bratislava (SVK) Hard (I) R16 Bergs 76(1) 61

A first Tour-level meeting for Bergs and Fery. Bergs won their only previous meeting at any level, more than 5 years ago at M15 Bratislava in Slovakia in November 2020. Bergs was ranked at No. 458 at the time, while Fery was ranked at No. 1167 and was contesting the 8th professional event of his career.

Bergs has lost a Grand Slam match to a player ranked as low as No. 114 Fery once before – when he fell to No. 320 Lloyd Harris in the 1st round here last year.

Bergs lost his only previous match against a British player at Wimbledon – he fell to Jack Draper in the 1st round here in 2022. He recorded 2 victories against British players en route to his first Tour-level title at Eastbourne last week, defeating Jan Choinski in the quarterfinals and Toby Samuel in the semifinals. He has a 3-3 win-loss record against British players at Tour-level overall.

- **BERGS** is bidding to reach the round of 16 at a Grand Slam for the first time. This is his 4th Wimbledon appearance and his 13th Grand Slam overall.
- Bergs is bidding to become the **5th Belgian player in the Open Era to reach the men's singles round of 16 at Wimbledon** – after Dick Norman (who reached the round of 16 here in 1995), Xavier Malisse (2002, 2004, 2011-12), Olivier Rochus (2003) and David Goffin (2015-16, 2019, 2022).
- Bergs is also bidding to become the **9th Belgian player in the Open Era to reach the men's singles round of 16 at a Grand Slam** – after Goffin (13 Grand Slam round of 16 appearances), Malisse (9), Olivier Rochus (3), Filip Dewulf (2) and Xavier Daufresne, Bernard Mignot, Norman and Christopher Rochus (all one).
- Bergs advanced to the 3rd round after defeating No. 27 seed Ugo Humbert 62 75 46 36 63 and qualifier Jaime Faria 76(6) 46 62 63 for his **first Wimbledon match-wins** in the opening 2 rounds.
- **Last year here**, Bergs fell to Lloyd Harris in the 1st round. He also fell in the 1st round here on his 2 other appearances in the main draw – as a wild card in 2022 (l. Jack Draper) and as a qualifier in 2024 (l. Arthur Cazaux).
- By reaching the 3rd round here, Bergs has equalled his best **Grand Slam result**. He also reached the 3rd round as a qualifier at 2024 Roland Garros (l. Grigor Dimitrov) and as a direct acceptance at the 2025 US Open (l. Jaume Munar).
- **Elsewhere in Grand Slam play this year**, Bergs fell in the 1st round at both the Australian Open (l. Hubert Hurkacz) and Roland Garros (l. Tomas Machac).
- Bergs' best result in 2026 is winning his **first Tour-level title** – on grass at Eastbourne last week (d. Ugo Humbert). He was also a member of the Belgian team which reached the semifinals at the United Cup. His victories en route to the title at Eastbourne ended a 6-match Tour-level winning streak – he had not previously recorded match-win at Tour-level since reaching the 3rd round at Monte Carlo-1000, where he defeated Adrian Mannarino and Andrey Rublev before falling to Alexander Zverev.

- **Elsewhere on grass this season**, Bergs fell in the 1st round at 's-Hertogenbosch (l. James McCabe) and Halle (l. Taylor Fritz). His victories at Eastbourne ended a 6-match Tour-level winning streak.
- Bergs has contested **2 events at Challenger-level in 2026** – he finished runner-up at the Aix En Provence Challenger (FRA) (l. Alejandro Tabilo) and reached the quarterfinals at the Valencia Challenger (ESP) (l. Daniel Vallejo).
- Bergs has also won **one Challenger title on grass** – as a qualifier at the 2022 Ilkley Challenger (GBR) (d. Jack Sock).
- Bergs has won one of the 2 **five-set matches** he has played at Wimbledon, falling to Cazaux in the 1st round in 2024 but defeating Humbert in the 1st round this year. He has a 2-2 win-loss record in 5-set matches at Tour-level overall, defeating Pavel Kotov in the 1st round at the 2024 US Open but falling to Facundo Diaz Acosta in the 1st round at the 2025 Australian Open.
- Bergs broke the Top 50 for the first time in March 2025. He plays here at a **new career-high ranking** of No. 37.
- Bergs was a **good junior**. He reached a career-high junior ranking of No. 12 in June 2017. He competed in the boys' singles at 5 Grand Slam events from the 2016 US Open to the 2017 US Open, falling in the 1st round on all 5 occasions, including at 2017 Wimbledon (l. Danny Thomas).
- Bergs made his **Davis Cup** debut for Belgium in 2021 and was a member of the Belgian team that reached the semifinals in 2025, their first appearance in the last 4 since finishing as runners-up in 2017. He has a 10-8 win-loss record in the competition. Belgium will play away against Austria in the 2026 Qualifiers 2nd Round in September.
- Bergs is coached by Jan de Witt.
- Wild card **FERY** is bidding to reach the round of 16 at a Grand Slam for the first time. This is his 4th Wimbledon appearance and his 5th Grand Slam overall.
- Fery is bidding to become the **13th British player in the Open Era to reach the men's singles round of 16 at Wimbledon** – and the 2nd active player to do so, after Cameron Norrie, who reached the round of 16 here in 2022 and 2025.
- Fery is bidding to become the **21st British player in the Open Era to reach the men's singles round of 16 at a Grand Slam** – and the 3rd active player to do so, after Norrie (5 Grand Slam round of 16 appearances) and Jack Draper (4).
- Fery is bidding to become the **2nd British wild card in the Open Era to reach the men's singles round of 16 at a Grand Slam** – after Andrew Foster, who reached the round of 16 as a wild card at 1993 Wimbledon.
- Fery is bidding to become the **12th wild card to reach the men's singles round of 16 at Wimbledon** – after Pat Cash (in both 1986 and 1990), Mark Woodforde (1990), Foster (1993), Goran Ivanisevic (2001), Mark Philippoussis (2002), Jo-Wilfried Tsonga (2007), Juan Carlos Ferrero (2009), Nick Kyrgios (2014), Denis Kudla (2015) and Tim van Rijthoven (2022). (NB fellow wild card Grigor Dimitrov is also bidding to reach the round of 16 here today)
- Fery is bidding to become the **41st wild card to reach the men's singles round of 16 at a Grand Slam**. He would become the 8th wild card to achieve the feat in the last 10 years – after Juan Martin del Potro (2016 US Open), Denis Istomin (2017 Australian Open), Hugo Gaston (2020 Roland Garros), Jenson Brooksby (2021 US Open), Van Rijthoven (2022 Wimbledon), Rinky Hijikata (2023 US Open) and Arthur Cazaux (2024 Australian Open).
- If Fery and Dimitrov both reach the round of 16 here, it will be the **4th time that 2 wild cards have reached the men's singles round of 16 at a Grand Slam** – after 1990 Wimbledon (when Cash and Woodforde both reached the round of 16 as wild cards), 1991 Roland Garros (Arnaud Boetsch and Alberto Mancini) and 2002 Roland Garros (Arnaud di Pasquale and Paul-Henri Mathieu).
- Fery advanced to the 3rd round after defeating Damir Dzumhur 36 62 62 61 and qualifier Otto Virtanen 57 76(3) 63 63 in the opening 2 rounds.
- By reaching the 3rd round here, Fery has become the **4th British wild card to reach the men's singles 3rd round at Wimbledon since 2000** – after Andy Murray (who achieved the feat in 2005 and 2021), James Ward (2015) and Liam Broady (2022 and 2023).

- By reaching the 3rd round here, Fery has recorded his **best Grand Slam result**. His previous best Grand Slam result was reaching the 2nd round on 2 occasions – as a wild card at Wimbledon last year (d. Alexei Popyrin, l. Luciano Darderi) and as a qualifier at the Australian Open this year (d. Flavio Cobolli, l. Tomas Martin Etcheverry).
- **Elsewhere in Grand Slam play this year**, Fery reached the 2nd round of qualifying at Roland Garros (d. Elias Ymer, l. Pedro Martinez).
- Fery's best result in 2026 is reaching his **first Tour-level quarterfinal** as a wild card at Queen's, defeating Toby Samuel and Adrian Mannarino before falling to Francisco Cerundolo. He also reached the 2nd round as a wild card at Eastbourne (d. Roman Andres Burruchaga, l. Juan Manuel Cerundolo).
- Fery has contested **4 events at Challenger-level in 2026**. His best results are reaching the semifinals on clay at the Zagreb Challenger (CRO) (l. Jan Choinski) and on grass at the Ilkley Challenger (GBR) (l. Bu Yunchaokete).
- Fery is bidding to **defeat a Top 40 player for the 3rd time**. He has a 2-2 win-loss record against Top 40 players at Tour-level, with his 2 victories coming against No. 22 Popyrin in the 1st round here last year and No. 22 Cobolli in the 1st round at the Australian Open this year.
- Fery broke the Top 200 for the first time in October 2025. He plays here at a **new career-high ranking** of No. 114.
- Fery **played college tennis** at Stanford University from 2020 to 2024, ending his college career with a 58-16 singles win-loss record. He was named an all-American in singles in both 2022 and 2023.
- Fery had a **good junior career**, reaching a career-high junior ranking of No. 12 in March 2020. He reached the 3rd round on his only appearance in the boys' singles here in 2019 (l. Shintaro Mochizuki).
- Fery made his **Davis Cup** debut for Great Britain in 2025, winning the only match he has contested in the competition to date. Great Britain will play at home against Ecuador in the Qualifiers 2nd Round in September.
- Fery is coached by Benoit Foucher and Jeroen Benard.
