On court today...

- Netherlands' No. 11 seed Thijs Boogaard faces Australia's Cruz Hewitt in the second match on Court 18 today. The 2 players have just one junior appearance between them this year prior to Wimbledon with both players competing predominantly at professional events in 2026. Boogaard is bidding to become the 2nd Dutch player to reach the boys' singles final here in the last 3 years, after Mees Rottgering finished runner-up in 2024. Meanwhile Hewitt, son of 2002 Wimbledon men's singles champion Lleyton, has already surpassed his father's best run at a junior Grand Slam by reaching the semifinals here. If he wins today and reaches Sunday's final, he will become the first Australian player to reach the boys' singles final here since 2016 runner-up Alex de Minaur, the current ATP world No. 6.
- In the third match on Court 12, Germany's Vincent Reisach faces American qualifier Jordan Lee. Both boys have competed strongly on the junior circuit in 2026, with both winning a J200 title earlier this year – Reisach at Siauliai in Lithuania and Lee at Sumer in the US. Reisach is bidding to become the first German player to reach the boys' singles final here for nearly 30 years, after Daniel Elsner finished runner-up here in 1997. On the other side of the net, Lee could become the 2nd American qualifier to reach the final here in consecutive years, after Ronit Karki fell in the final to Ivan Ivanov in the boys' singles here last year.

- **BOOGAARD** is bidding to reach his first Grand Slam boys' singles final and become the 4th Dutch player to reach a Wimbledon boys' singles final – after Robin Haase (2005 runner-up), Thiemo de Bakker (2006 champion) and Mees Rottgering (2024 runner-up).
- Boogaard is bidding to become the **7th Dutch player to reach a Wimbledon junior singles final** – after Fenny ten Bosch (1952 girls' singles champion), Judith Salome (1967 girls singles champion), Brenda Schultz (1988 girls singles champion), Haase, De Bakker and Rottgering.
- Boogaard is bidding to become the **7th Dutch player to reach a Grand Slam boys' singles final** – after Eric Wilborts (1980 US Open runner-up), Sjeng Schalken (1994 US Open champion), Antal Van Der Duim (2005 Roland Garros runner-up), Haase (2005 Wimbledon runner-up), De Bakker (2006 Wimbledon champion) and Rottgering (2024 Wimbledon runner-up).
- Boogaard is bidding to become the **12th Dutch player to reach a Grand Slam junior singles final**. In addition to the 6 Dutch players to have reached boys' singles finals at the Grand Slams, 5 Dutch players have reached Grand Slam girls' singles finals – Ten Bosch, Salome, Schultz, Michaella Krajicek (2003 US Open runner-up and 2004 US Open champion) and Arantxa Rus (2008 Australian Open champion).
- By reaching the semifinals here, Boogaard has recorded his **best Grand Slam result**. His previous best Grand Slam result was reaching the quarterfinals here last year (l. Alexander Vasilev). He is making his 6th junior Grand Slam appearance here.
- Boogaard is contesting his **2nd junior event of 2026**. He reached the quarterfinals at J300 Beaulieu-sur-Mer (FRA) (d. Matteo Gribaldo) in April in the only other junior event he has contested in 2026. He is contesting his first junior Grand Slam event since competing in the boys' event here last year.
- Boogaard is contesting his **4th junior event since competing at the boys' event at 2025 Wimbledon**. In December, he won the title at J500 Fort Lauderdale (USA) (d. Jack Kennedy) and reached the semifinals at J300 Bradenton (USA) (l. Jordan Lee) in the only junior events he contested in 2025 after Wimbledon.
- Boogaard won his **first professional title** at M25 Lourinha (POR) on 21 June, defeating Tiago Torres in the final.

- Boogaard has competed **predominantly at professional-level in 2026**. He has competed at 10 professional events in 2026. He made his Challenger-level debut at Soma Bay (EGY), falling in the 1st round as a qualifier. On the World Tennis Tour, in addition to winning his first professional title at M25 Lourinha (POR), he reached the semifinals at M15 The Hague (NED) (l. Anton Matusевич) in February and reached the quarterfinals at M25 Heraklion (GRE) in April (l. Michael Geerts) and M25 Hurghada (EGY) in May (l. Aaron Funk).
- Boogaard has competed in the main draw **2 ATP Tour-level events** – reaching the 2nd round as a wild card at 's-Hertogenbosch last month (Wu Yibing, l. Daniil Medvedev) but falling in the 1st round as a lucky loser at Rotterdam earlier this year (l. Stan Wawrinka). He also fell in qualifying as a wild card at Rotterdam in 2024 and 2025, at 2025 Miami-1000 and at 2025 's-Hertogenbosch.
- Boogaard reached a **career-high junior ranking** of No. 9 in January and plays here at No. 50. He is currently at a career-high ATP ranking of No. 525.
- **HEWITT** is bidding to reach his first Grand Slam boys' singles final and become the first Australian player to reach the boys' singles final at Wimbledon since 2016, when Alex de Minaur finished runner-up.
- Hewitt is bidding to become the 15th Australian player to reach the boys' singles final here, and the **6th Australian player to do so since 2000** – after 2002 champion Todd Reid, 2003 runner-up Chris Guccione, 2010 runner-up Benjamin Mitchell, Luke Saville, who won the title in 2011 and finished runner-up in 2012, and De Minaur.
- Hewitt is bidding to become the **8th Australian player, boy or girl, to reach a Wimbledon junior singles final since 2000** – Reid, Guccione, Mitchell, 2010 girls' singles champion Ashleigh Barty, Saville, De Minaur and 2024 girls' singles runner-up Emerson Jones.
- Hewitt is bidding to become the **first Australian player to reach a Grand Slam boys' singles final since 2017 Roland Garros** – when Alexei Popyrin defeated Nicola Pietrangeli to win the title.
- By reaching the semifinals here, Hewitt has recorded his **best Grand Slam result**. His previous best Grand Slam result was reaching the 2nd round at the 2025 Australian Open (d. Kim Moo-Been, l. Jan Kumstat) and at 2025 Wimbledon (d. Savva Rybkin, l. Oskari Paldanius). He is making his 6th junior Grand Slam appearance here.
- Hewitt is contesting his **first junior event of 2026**. He fell in the 1st round of the boys' singles at the US Open last year (l. Benjamin Willwerth) in the only junior event he has contested since competing in the boys' event here last year.
- Hewitt has reached **2 professional finals**. He finished runner-up as a qualifier at M25 Launceston (AUS) (l. Jason Kubler) in March 2025 and as a wild card at M15 Wodonga (AUS) (l. Colin Sinclair) in March this year.
- Prior to competing in the boys' event here, Hewitt has competed **exclusively at professional-level in 2026**. He has competed at 15 professional events in 2026. He reached his first Challenger-level quarterfinal as a wild card at the Brisbane 1 Challenger (AUS) (l. Dane Sweeny) in February. On the World Tennis Tour, he finished runner-up at M15 Wodonga (AUS), reached the semifinals at M15 Swan Hill (AUS) in March (l. Pavle Marinkov) and M15 Singapore (SGP) in April (l. Koki Matsuda) and reached the quarterfinals at 3 other World Tennis Tour events.
- Hewitt has competed in qualifying at **3 ATP Tour-level events**. He fell in the 1st round of qualifying as a wild card at the Australian Open in 2025 (l. Nikoloz Basilashvili) and this year (l. Michael Zheng), and at Brisbane this year (l. Kamil Majchrzak).
- Hewitt reached a **career-high junior ranking** of No. 38 in January and plays here at No. 517. He is currently at a career-high ATP ranking of No. 606.
- Hewitt is the son of **2-time Grand Slam champion and former ATP world No. 1** Lleyton Hewitt, who won the men's singles title at the 2001 US Open and 2002 Wimbledon. His best junior Grand Slam result was reaching the boys' singles quarterfinals at the 1997 Australian Open (l. Arnaud di Pasquale). He reached the boys' singles 3rd round on his only appearance at the junior event here in 1997 (l. Julien Jeanpierre).

- **REISACH** is bidding to reach his first Grand Slam boys' singles final and become the first German player to reach the Wimbledon boys' singles final since 1997 runner-up Daniel Elsner.
- Reisach is bidding to become the **6th German player to reach the Wimbledon boys' singles final** – after 1970 runner-up Frank Gebert, 1976 runner-up Peter Elter, 1980 runner-up Hans-Dieter Beutel, 1995 runner-up Nicolas Kiefer and 1997 runner-up Elsner.
- Reisach is also bidding to become the **9th German player to reach a Wimbledon junior singles final**. In addition to the 5 German players who have reached the boys' singles final here, 3 German players have reached the girls' singles final at Wimbledon – 1956 runner-up Ilsa Buding, 1991 champion Barbara Rittner and 2021 runner-up Nastasja Schunk.
- By reaching the semifinals here, Reisach has recorded his **best Grand Slam result**. He fell in the 1st round on his only other junior Grand Slam appearance, at Roland Garros this year (l. Arnav Paparkar).
- **Prior to Wimbledon this year**, Reisach fell in the 1st round at J300 Roehampton (GBR) (l. Damir Zhalgasbay). It was the first time he competed on grass.
- Reisach's **best result at junior-level in 2026** is winning the title at J200 Siauliai (LTU) (d. Michael Savano). He also reached the semifinals at J200 Oberhaching (GER) (l. Aleksander Blus) and the quarterfinals at J300 Cairo (EGY) (l. Tito Chavez) and J500 Cairo (EGY) (l. Kai Thompson).
- Reisach has competed at **4 professional events**, all in Germany. His best result at professional-level is reaching the quarterfinals as a wild card at M15 Cadolzburg (GER) in January this year (l. Karol Filar). He reached the 2nd round as a wild card at M15 Oberhaching (GER) in February this year (d. Michael Agwi, l. Mae Malige) but fell in the 1st round as a wild card at M15 Offenbach (GER) in October 2025 (l. Leonardo Rossi) and at M25 Nussloch (GER) in January this year (l. Oleg Prihodko).
- Reisach plays here at a **career-high junior ranking** of No. 23. He reached a career-high ATP ranking of No. 1562 in February this year and is currently ranked at No. 1613.
- Reisach entered the **boys' doubles here** alongside Jamie Mackenzie. As No. 4 seeds, they fell to Ryan Cozad/Gavin Goode in the 1st round.

- Qualifier **LEE** is bidding to become the 2nd qualifier to reach the boys' singles final at Wimbledon in consecutive years, after Ronit Karki finished runner-up here last year. He is making his junior Grand Slam debut at this event.
- Lee is bidding to become the **6th qualifier to reach the boys' singles final at Wimbledon** – after 2006 runner-up Marcin Gawron, 2009 runner-up Jordan Cox, 2010 runner-up Benjamin Mitchell, 2014 champion Noah Rubin and 2025 runner-up Karki.
- Lee is bidding to become the **2nd American player to reach the boys' singles final here in consecutive years**, after Karki's runner-up finish last year. He would also become the 24th American player to reach the boys' singles final here, and the 10th American player to do so since 2000 – after 2007 champion Donald Young, 2009 runner-up Cox, 2014 champion Rubin and runner-up Stefan Kozlov, 2015 champion Reilly Opelka, 2021 champion Samir Banerjee and runner-up Victor Lilov, 2022 runner-up Michael Zheng and 2025 runner-up Karki.
- If Lee and Janae Preston, who has reached the girls' singles semifinals here, both reach the finals here, it will be the **2nd consecutive year that USA has representatives in both junior singles finals at Wimbledon** – after Karki finished runner-up in the boys' singles and Julieta Pareja finished runner-up in the girls' singles here last year. If Lee and Preston win the titles here, it will be the first time that American players have won both junior singles titles at Wimbledon since 1981, when Zina Garrison won the girls' singles title and Matt Anger won the boys' singles title.
- **As No. 7 seed in qualifying**, Lee defeated Casey Drake (GBR) 62 61 and No. 13 seed Maxi Carrascosa Diaz (ESP) 61 64 to reach the main draw. It was the first time he has successfully qualified for the main draw at a junior Grand Slam on his first attempt.
- Aged 16 years 69 days, Lee was the **youngest player to begin the boys' singles draw here this year**. Ten 16-year-olds began the boys' singles draw here.
- **Prior to Wimbledon this year**, Lee reached the 3rd round at J300 Roehampton (GBR) (l. Luis Guto Miguel). It was the first time he had competed on grass.
- Lee's **best result at junior-level in 2026** is winning the title at J200 Sumter (USA) (d. Teodor Davidov). He also finished runner-up at J200 Marsa (TUN) (l. Alejandro Mateo Berge Nourescu) and J300 Charleroi-Marcinelle (BEL) (l. Dan Brand) and reached the quarterfinals at J200 Valencia (ESP) (l. Berge Nourescu).
- Lee has competed at **4 professional events**, all in the US. He made his professional debut at M15 Boca Raton, FL (USA) in November 2024, reaching the 2nd round of qualifying as a wild card. He also reached the 2nd round as a wild card at M15 Orlando, FL (USA) in November 2025 (d. Matthew Thomson, l. Matisse Farzam) and at M15 Vero Beach, FL (USA) in May this year (d. Jon Gamble, l. JJ Wolf), but fell in the 1st round as a wild card at M15 Naples, FL (USA) in February this year (l. Miguel Tobon).
- Lee plays here at a **career-high junior ranking** of No. 47. He reached a career-high ranking ATP ranking of No. 1757 in May and is currently ranked at No. 1768.
- Lee entered the **boys' doubles here** alongside Rhys Lawlor. The pair reached the 2nd round before giving a walkover to No. 6 seeds Yannick Theodor Alexandrescu/Ryo Tabata.
