A 9th Tour-level meeting for Heliovaara/Patten and Arevalo/Pavic. It is their 2nd meeting at a Grand Slam, their 3rd meeting on grass and their 3rd meeting in a final.

Heliovaara/Patten won the pairs' only previous meeting at a Grand Slam – in the quarterfinals here in 2024, en route to their first Grand Slam title. The pairs have contested one other match on grass, which Arevalo/Pavic won, in the final at Queen's last month.

The pairs are tied 1-1 in finals, with both of their meetings in finals coming this season – Heliovaara/Patten won in the final at Dubai in February before Arevalo/Pavic won in the final at Queen's in June.

This is the first time in the Open Era that both men's doubles finalists at Queen's have also reached the men's doubles final at Wimbledon. Arevalo/Pavic are bidding to become the 8th team in the Open Era to win the men's doubles titles at Queen's and Wimbledon in the same season.

In the Open Era, 4 other doubles teams have reached the men's doubles finals at both Queen's and Wimbledon in the same season – including Pavic and Nikola Pietrangeli, who won the title at Queen's in 2022 before finishing as runners-up at Wimbledon.

If Heliovaara/Patten win the title, they will become the 20th and 21st players in the Open Era to win multiple Wimbledon men's doubles titles – and the first active players to do so. If Arevalo/Pavic win, Pavic will become the 20th player in the Open Era to win multiple Wimbledon men's doubles titles – and the first active player to do so.

Heliovaara/Patten are bidding to win their 5th title this season and equal Theo Arribage/Albano Olivetti at the top of the list for most Tour-level men's doubles titles won in 2026. Arevalo/Pavic are bidding to win their 2nd title this season and become the 6th team to win multiple Tour-level men's doubles titles in 2026.

Heliovaara/Patten have contested final-set tiebreaks in 3 of their 5 matches here so far. Arevalo/Pavic have dropped 2 sets but are yet to contest a final-set tiebreak here this year.

- **HELIOVAARA/PATTEN** are bidding to win their 2nd Wimbledon titles and 3rd Grand Slam doubles titles – as individuals or a team. They won the men's doubles title here in 2024 (d. Max Purcell/Jordan Thompson) before winning their 2nd Grand Slam title at the 2025 Australian Open (d. Simone Bolelli/Andrea Vavassori).
- Heliovaara/Patten are bidding to become the **11th team in the Open Era to win multiple Wimbledon men's doubles titles** – and the first since Bob and Mike Bryan won their 2nd title here in 2011. They would become the 20th and 21st players in the Open Era to win multiple Wimbledon men's doubles titles.
- Heliovaara is bidding to extend his **all-time record for most Grand Slam men's doubles titles won by a Finnish player**. Henri Kontinen, who won the 2017 Australian Open men's doubles title alongside John Peers, is the only other Finnish player to have won a Grand Slam men's doubles title.
- Patten is bidding to become the **first British player in the Open Era to win the Wimbledon men's doubles title on multiple occasions**. He is one of 5 British players to have won the Wimbledon men's doubles title in the Open Era – alongside Jonathan Marray (who won the title alongside Frederik Nielsen in 2012), Neal Skupski (who won the title alongside Wesley Koolhof in 2023) and Julian Cash and Lloyd Glasspool, who won the title here last year.
- Patten is bidding to claim sole ownership of **2nd place on the Open Era list for most Grand Slam men's doubles titles won by a British player** – ahead of Jamie Murray, Neal Skupski and Roger Taylor. He is one of 5 active British players to have won a Grand Slam men's doubles title – alongside Cash, Glasspool, Salisbury and Skupski.

- By reaching the final here, Heliovaara/Patten have become the **first players, as a team or individuals, to reach the men's doubles finals at Roland Garros and Wimbledon in the same year since 2013**, when Bob and Mike Bryan won both titles. Heliovaara/Patten fell in the Roland Garros final last month to Marcel Granollers/Horacio Zeballos.
- By reaching the final here, Heliovaara has become the **2nd Finnish player in history to reach multiple Wimbledon finals**. Kontinen reached 2 Wimbledon mixed doubles finals alongside Heather Watson, winning the title in 2016 and finishing as runners-up in 2017.
- By reaching his 5th Grand Slam final here, Heliovaara has **claimed sole ownership of the all-time record for most Grand Slam doubles finals reached by a Finnish player**, ahead of Kontinen.
- By reaching the final here, Patten has become the **first British player in the Open Era to reach multiple Wimbledon men's doubles finals**. He is one of 6 British players in the Open Era to reach the men's doubles final here – alongside Cash and Glasspool (2025 champions), Marray (2012 champion), Jamie Murray (2015 runner-up) and Skupski (2023 champion).
- Heliovaara/Patten are **competing as a team at Wimbledon for the 3rd time**. In addition to winning the title here in 2024, they reached the quarterfinals last year, where they fell to Cash/Glasspool despite having 3 match points.
- Heliovaara/Patten are **competing as a team at a Grand Slam for the 10th time**. They have contested every Grand Slam tournament together since teaming up prior to 2024 Roland Garros.
- **In Grand Slam play this year**, in addition to their runner-up finish at Roland Garros, Heliovaara/Patten reaching the 3rd round at the Australian Open (I. Petr Nouza/Patrik Rikl).
- Heliovaara is contesting his **20th Grand Slam doubles event with his 4th different partner**. He made his Grand Slam debut alongside Glasspool as a wild card at 2021 Wimbledon. This is his 5th Wimbledon appearance.
- Patten is contesting his **15th Grand Slam doubles event with his 3rd different partner**. He made his Grand Slam debut alongside Cash as a wild card at 2022 Wimbledon. This is his 4th Wimbledon appearance.
- **Prior to Wimbledon**, Heliovaara/Patten finished runner-up at Queen's (I. Arevalo/Pavic). It was the only grass court event they contested prior to Wimbledon this year.
- Heliovaara/Patten **have won 12 Tour-level titles as a team**, including 4 in 2026 – at Adelaide (d. Kevin Krawietz/Tim Puetz), Doha (d. Cash/Glaspool), Dubai (d. Arevalo/Pavic) and Madrid-1000 (d. Guido Andreozzi/Manuel Guinard). They also finished runner-up at Miami-1000 (I. Bolelli/Vavassori), Roland Garros and Queen's this year.
- Heliovaara is bidding to win his **17th Tour-level doubles title**. In addition to his 12 Tour-level titles alongside Patten, he also won 3 Tour-level titles alongside Lloyd Glasspool and one alongside Matwe Middelkoop.
- Patten is bidding to win his **13th Tour-level doubles title**. He had not won a title at Tour-level prior to partnering Heliovaara in 2024.
- Heliovaara and Patten are **both world No. 1s in doubles**. They both reached the No. 1 ranking for the first time in June following their runner-up finish at Roland Garros. They will be ranked No. 1s on Monday regardless of today's result.
- Heliovaara is a **Grand Slam mixed doubles champion**. He won the mixed doubles title at the 2023 US Open alongside Anna Danilina (d. Jessica Pegula/Austin Krajicek). He is one of 2 Finnish players to have won a Grand Slam mixed doubles title, alongside Kontinen, who won the mixed doubles title here with Watson in 2016.
- Patten entered the **mixed doubles here** with Olivia Nicholls. As No. 4 seeds, they fell to Gabriela Dabrowski/Evan King in the 1st round. Heliovaara did not compete in mixed doubles here.
- Heliovaara was part of the **Finnish Davis Cup team that reached the semifinals of the competition for the first time in 2023**. He won 3 of the 5 doubles matches he played in the competition in 2023. He made his debut in the competition in 2008, has played 31 ties, and has a 23-24 Davis Cup win-loss record. Finland will play Monaco at home in a 2026 World Group I tie in September.

- Patten made his **Davis Cup debut for Great Britain** at the 2024 Finals Group Stage, partnering Neal Skupski to defeat Canada's Gabriel Diallo/Alexis Galarneau in the only match he has contested in the competition to date. Great Britain will play at home against Ecuador in the 2026 Qualifiers 2nd Round in September.
- Heliovaara is coached by Boris Chernov. Patten is coached by Calvin Betton.
- **AREVALO/PAVIC** are bidding to win their 2nd Grand Slam doubles title as a team. The pair won their first Grand Slam doubles title together at 2024 Roland Garros, defeating Simone Bolelli/Andrea Vavassori in the final.
- Arevalo is bidding to become the **first Salvadoran player to win the Wimbledon men's doubles title**. By winning the mixed doubles title here, he became the first Salvadoran player to win a Wimbledon title, in any event. He also became the first Salvadoran player to contest a Wimbledon final, in any event.
- Arevalo is bidding to win his **3rd Grand Slam men's doubles title**. In addition to his title with Pavic at 2024 Roland Garros, he also won the title with Jean-Julien Rojer at 2022 Roland Garros (d. Ivan Dodig/Austin Krajicek). He is the only Salvadoran player to have won a Grand Slam title, in any event.
- Pavic is bidding to win his 2nd Wimbledon men's doubles title and become the **first Croatian player to win multiple Wimbledon men's doubles titles**. He won his first title here alongside fellow Croatian Nikola Mektic in 2021 – he and Mektic are the only Croatian players to have won the Wimbledon men's doubles title.
- Pavic is bidding to win his 5th Grand Slam doubles title and extend his **record for most Grand Slam men's doubles titles won by a Croatian player**. In addition to his titles with Arevalo at 2024 Roland Garros and with Mektic at 2021 Wimbledon, he also won the titles alongside Oliver Marach at the 2018 Australian Open (d. Juan Sebastian Cabal/Robert Farah) and alongside Bruno Soares at the 2020 US Open (d. Wesley Koolhof/Mektic).

- Arevalo won the mixed doubles title here on Thursday with Jelena Ostapenko, defeating Storm Hunter/Marc Polmans in the final. He is bidding to become the **7th player in the Open Era to win the Wimbledon men's doubles and mixed doubles titles in the same year** – and the first since Leander Paes in 1999.

- Arevalo is bidding to become the **7th player to win the men's doubles and mixed doubles titles at a Grand Slam since 2000** – after Mike Bryan (2003 Roland Garros), Nenad Zimonjic (2010 Roland Garros), Bob Bryan (2010 US Open), Bruno Soares (2016 Australian Open), Pavic (2018 Australian Open) and Joe Salisbury (2021 US Open).
- Arevalo/Pavic are **competing as a team at Wimbledon for the 3rd time**. They reached the quarterfinals on their first appearance together in 2024 (l. Heliovaara/Patten) and reached the semifinals here last year (l. Rinky Hijikata/David Pel).
- Arevalo/Pavic are **competing as a team at a Grand Slam for the 11th time**. They have contested every Grand Slam tournament together since teaming up at the beginning of the 2024 season.

- **In Grand Slam play this year**, Arevalo/Pavic reached the quarterfinals at the Australian Open (l. Luke Johnson/Jan Zielinski) and the 3rd round at Roland Garros (l. Sander Arends/Pel).
- Arevalo/Pavic's **best result in 2026** is winning their 8th Tour-level title as a team at Queen's (d. Heliovaara/Patten). They also finished runner-up at Dubai (l. Heliovaara/Patten) and Monte Carlo-1000 (l. Kevin Krawietz/Tim Puetz).
- Arevalo/Pavic are bidding to win their **9th Tour-level title as a team**. In addition to their titles at 2024 Roland Garros and Queen's this year, they also won the titles at Hong Kong, Geneva and Cincinnati-1000 in 2024, and at Indian Wells-1000, Miami-1000 and Rome-1000 in 2025.
- Arevalo/Pavic are bidding to extend a **9-match winning streak**. They have not lost since falling to Arends/Pel in the 3rd round at Roland Garros. They have recorded winning streaks of 10 or more matches as a pair on 2 previous occasions – in May-June 2024, when they won 12 consecutive matches by winning the titles at Geneva and Roland Garros and reaching the semifinals at Queen's (l. Taylor Fritz/Karen Khachanov), and in March-April 2025, when they won 12 consecutive matches by winning the titles at Indian Wells-1000 and Miami-1000 and reaching the semifinals at Monte Carlo-1000 (l. Julian Cash/Lloyd Glasspool).
- Arevalo is contesting his **33rd Grand Slam doubles event with his 8th different partner**. He made his Grand Slam debut alongside Roberto Maytin at 2016 Wimbledon. This is his 8th Wimbledon appearance.
- Pavic is contesting his **49th Grand Slam doubles event with his 9th different partner**. He made his Grand Slam debut alongside Marin Draganja at the 2014 Australian Open and made his Wimbledon debut alongside Andre Sa in 2014. This is his 12th Wimbledon appearance.
- Arevalo is bidding to win his **18th Tour-level doubles title**. He has won 17 Tour-level doubles titles with 4 different partners, including one grass court title – alongside Pavic at Queen's this year.
- Pavic is bidding to win his **44th Tour-level doubles title**. He has won 43 Tour-level doubles titles with 9 different partners – including 9 titles on grass. In addition to his title at Queen's alongside Arevalo this year, he won 6 titles on grass alongside Mektic and one title on grass alongside each of Hubert Hurkacz and Michael Venus.
- Arevalo and Pavic are both **former world No. 1s in doubles**. Pavic reached the No. 1 ranking for the first time in May 2018 and plays here at No. 11. Arevalo reached the No. 1 ranking for the first time in November 2024 and plays here at No. 10.
- Arevalo became a **Grand Slam mixed doubles champion for the first time** by winning the mixed doubles title alongside Ostapenko here this year. His previous best Grand Slam mixed doubles result was finishing runner-up alongside Giuliana Olmos at the 2021 US Open (l. Desirae Krawczyk/Salisbury).
- Pavic is a **3-time Grand Slam mixed doubles champion**. He won the mixed doubles titles alongside Laura Siegemund at the 2016 US Open (d. Coco Vandeweghe/Ram), alongside Gabriela Dabrowski at the 2018 Australian Open (d. Timea Babos/ Rohan Bopanna) and alongside Lyudmyla Kichenok at 2023 Wimbledon (d. Xu Yifan/Joran Vliegen). He and Dabrowski also finished runner-up in mixed doubles at Roland Garros in 2018 and 2019, falling to Latisha Chan/Ivan Dodig on both occasions.
- Pavic entered the **mixed doubles here** with Fanny Stollar. The pair reached the semifinals before falling to Hunter/Polmans.
- Pavic won the **Olympic gold medal in men's doubles** alongside Mektic at the Tokyo 2020 Olympic Tennis Event in 2021. The pair defeated Marin Cilic/Dodig in an all-Croatian final. They were Croatia's first Olympic gold and silver medals in tennis.
- Arevalo has **contested 39 Davis Cup ties for El Salvador** since making his debut in 2005 and has a 61-35 overall win-loss record. El Salvador will play at home against Portugal in a 2026 World Group II tie in September.
- Pavic made his **Davis Cup debut for Croatia in 2013** and has a 12-11 win-loss record in the competition. He was also a member of the Croatian teams which won the title in 2018 (d. France) and finished as runners-up in 2021 (l. Russian Tennis Federation). Croatia will play away against Germany in the 2026 Qualifiers 2nd Round in September.
- Arevalo is coached by Yari Bernardo and Carlos Teixeira. Pavic is coached by Nadja Pavic.
