- Qualifier **LEE** is bidding to win his first Grand Slam boys' singles title and become the first qualifier to win the boys' singles title at a Grand Slam since Noah Rubin won the title here as a qualifier in 2014. Rubin is the only player to win the boys' singles title here as a qualifier. He is making his junior Grand Slam debut at this event.
- Lee is bidding to become the **first American player to win the boys' singles title here since 2021**, when Samir Banerjee defeated Victor Lilov in an all-American final. He would also become the 13th American player to win the boys' singles title here, and the 5th American player to do so since 2000 – after Donald Young (2007), Rubin (2014), Reilly Opelka (2015) and Banerjee.
- By reaching the final here, Lee has become the **6th qualifier to reach the boys' singles final at Wimbledon** – after 2006 runner-up Marcin Gawron, 2009 runner-up Jordan Cox, 2010 runner-up Benjamin Mitchell, 2014 champion Rubin and 2025 runner-up Ronit Karki.
- Lee is the **2nd American player to reach the boys' singles final here in consecutive years**, after Karki's runner-up finish last year. He is the 24th American player to reach the boys' singles final here, and the 10th American player to do so since 2000 – after 2007 champion Young, 2009 runner-up Cox, 2014 champion Rubin and runner-up Stefan Kozlov, 2015 champion Opelka, 2021 champion Banerjee and runner-up Lilov, 2022 runner-up Michael Zheng and 2025 runner-up Karki.
- **As No. 7 seed in qualifying**, Lee defeated Casey Drake (GBR) 62 61 and No. 13 seed Maxi Carrascosa Diaz (ESP) 61 64 to reach the main draw. It was the first time he has successfully qualified for the main draw at a junior Grand Slam on his first attempt.

- Aged 16 years 69 days, Lee was the **youngest player to begin the boys' singles draw here this year**. Ten 16-year-olds began the boys' singles draw here. He is the youngest player to reach the boys' singles final here since Shintaro Mochizuki won the title here aged 16 years 42 days in 2019.
- **Prior to Wimbledon this year**, Lee reached the 3rd round at J300 Roehampton (GBR) (l. Luis Guto Miguel). It was the first time he had competed on grass.
- Lee's **best result at junior-level in 2026** is winning the title at J200 Sumter (USA) (d. Teodor Davidov). He also finished runner-up at J200 Marsa (TUN) (l. Alejandro Mateo Berge Nourescu) and J300 Charleroi-Marcinelle (BEL) (l. Dan Brand) and reached the quarterfinals at J200 Valencia (ESP) (l. Berge Nourescu).
- Lee is bidding to win his **5th career junior singles title**. In addition to his title at Sumter this year, his biggest junior singles titles came in 2025 at J300 Bradenton (USA) (d. Dimitar Kisimov). He also won 2 titles in 2024 – at J100 Mostar (BIH) (Egor Shcherbakov) in September and J60 Rome (USA) (d. Navneet Raghuram) in October.
- Lee has competed at **4 professional events**, all on clay in the US. He made his professional debut at M15 Boca Raton, FL (USA) in November 2024, reaching the 2nd round of qualifying as a wild card. He also reached the 2nd round as a wild card at M15 Orlando, FL (USA) in November 2025 (d. Matthew Thomson, l. Matisse Farzam) and at M15 Vero Beach, FL (USA) in May this year (d. Jon Gamble, l. JJ Wolf), but fell in the 1st round as a wild card at M15 Naples, FL (USA) in February this year (l. Miguel Tobon).
- Lee plays here at a **career-high junior ranking** of No. 47. He reached a career-high ranking ATP ranking of No. 1757 in May and is currently ranked at No. 1768.
- Lee entered the **boys' doubles here** alongside Rhys Lawlor. The pair reached the 2nd round before giving a walkover to No. 6 seeds Yannick Theodor Alexandrescu/Ryo Tabata.
- **HEWITT** is bidding to win his first Grand Slam boys' singles title and become the first Australian player to win the boys' singles title at Wimbledon since Luke Saville in 2011.
- Hewitt is bidding to become the **5th Australian player to win the boys' singles title at Wimbledon** – after Pat Cash (1982), Mark Kratzmann (1984), Todd Reid (2002) and Saville (2011).
- Hewitt is bidding to become the **first Australian player, boy or girl, to win a Grand Slam junior singles title since 2017 Roland Garros**, when Alexei Popyrin defeated Nicola Kuhn to win the boys' singles title.
- By reaching the final, Hewitt has become the **first Australian player to reach the boys' singles final at Wimbledon since 2016**, when Alex de Minaur finished runner-up.
- By reaching the final, Hewitt has become the 15th Australian player to reach the boys' singles final here, and the **6th Australian player to do so since 2000** – after 2002 champion Reid, 2003 runner-up Chris Guccione, 2010 runner-up Benjamin Mitchell, Luke Saville, who won the title in 2011 and finished runner-up in 2012, and De Minaur.
- By reaching the final, Hewitt has become the **8th Australian player, boy or girl, to reach a Wimbledon junior singles final since 2000** – after Reid, Guccione, Mitchell, Saville, 2011 girls' singles champion Ashleigh Barty, De Minaur and 2024 girls' singles runner-up Emerson Jones.
- By reaching the final, Hewitt has become the **first Australian player to reach a Grand Slam boys' singles final since 2017 Roland Garros** – when Popyrin won the title.
- By reaching the final here, Hewitt has recorded his **best Grand Slam result**. His previous best Grand Slam result was reaching the 2nd round at the 2025 Australian Open (d. Kim Moo-Been, l. Jan Kumstat) and at 2025 Wimbledon (d. Savva Rybkin, l. Oskari Paldanius). He is making his 6th junior Grand Slam main draw appearance here.
- Hewitt is contesting his **first junior event of 2026**. He fell in the 1st round of the boys' singles at the US Open last year (l. Benjamin Willwerth) in the only junior event he has contested since competing in the boys' event here last year.

- Hewitt has reached **2 professional finals**. He finished runner-up as a qualifier at M25 Launceston (AUS) (l. Jason Kubler) in March 2025 and as a wild card at M15 Wodonga (AUS) (l. Colin Sinclair) in March this year.
- Prior to competing in the boys' event here, Hewitt has **competed exclusively at professional-level in 2026**. He has competed at 15 professional events in 2026. He reached his first Challenger-level quarterfinal as a wild card at the Brisbane 1 Challenger (AUS) (l. Dane Sweeny) in February. On the World Tennis Tour, he finished runner-up at M15 Wodonga (AUS), reached the semifinals at M15 Swan Hill (AUS) in March (l. Pavle Marinkov) and M15 Singapore (SGP) in April (l. Koki Matsuda) and reached the quarterfinals at 3 other World Tennis Tour events.
- Hewitt has competed in qualifying at **3 ATP Tour-level events**. He fell in the 1st round of qualifying as a wild card at the Australian Open in 2025 (l. Nikoloz Basilashvili) and this year (l. Michael Zheng), and at Brisbane this year (l. Kamil Majchrzak).
- Hewitt reached a **career-high junior ranking** of No. 38 in January and plays here at No. 517. He is currently at a career-high ATP ranking of No. 606.
- Hewitt is the **son of 2-time Grand Slam champion and former ATP world No. 1 Lleyton Hewitt**, who won the men's singles title at the 2001 US Open and 2002 Wimbledon. Lleyton Hewitt's best junior Grand Slam result was reaching the boys' singles quarterfinals at the 1997 Australian Open (l. Arnaud di Pasquale). He reached the boys' singles 3rd round on his only appearance at the junior event here in 1997 (l. Julien Jeanpierre).
