NO. 1 SUN XINRAN (CHN) v NO. 14 ANNA PUSHKAREVA

Junior head-to-head: Sun leads 1-0

2026 J500 Milan (ITA) Clay (O) R16 Sun 75 64

A 2nd meeting at junior-level for Sun and Pushkareva. Sun defeated Pushkareva in the 3rd round at J500 Milan in Italy in May, en route to her 2nd title of the season.

Sun also won the pair's one previous meeting at professional-level, recording a 61 26 62 victory in the final at W15 Sharm El Sheikh in Egypt in November last year. Sun claimed her first professional title by defeating Pushkareva that day, while Pushkareva was contesting her first professional event there.

- **SUN** is bidding to become the first Chinese player to win a Wimbledon junior singles title. By reaching the final here, Sun has become the first Chinese player to reach a Wimbledon junior singles final.
- Sun is bidding to become the **3rd Chinese player to win a Grand Slam junior singles title** – after 2017 US Open boys' singles champion Wu Yibing and 2018 US Open girls' singles champions Wang Xiyu.
- Sun is bidding to become **first Wimbledon girls' singles champion from an Asian nation since 2009**, when Thailand's Noppawan Lertcheewakarn won the title here.
- By reaching the final, Sun has become the **first Chinese player to reach multiple Grand Slam junior singles finals**. She is one of 4 Chinese players to have reached a Grand Slam junior singles final – alongside Wu, Wang and Shang Juncheng (2021 US Open boys' singles runner-up).

- Sun reached her **first Grand Slam final** at Roland Garros this year, finishing runner-up to Alisa Oktiabreva. Elsewhere in Grand Slam play this year, she reached the quarterfinals at the Australian Open (I. Ekaterina Tupityсна).
- Sun is making her **2nd Wimbledon girls' singles appearance and her 6th Grand Slam girls' singles appearance**. She fell in the 1st round here last year (I. Lilli Tagger).
- Sun is bidding to win her **4th junior title this year**. She won the titles on hard courts at J300 Traralgon (AUS) (d. Ksenia Efremova) and on clay at both J300 Plovdiv (BUL) (d. Anastasija Cvetkovic) and J500 Milan (ITA) (d. Mariia Makarova). Her only other appearances at junior-level – and her only 2 defeats at junior-level – this season came at the Australian Open and Roland Garros.
- Sun is bidding to win her **11th career junior singles title**. In addition to her 3 titles this year, her biggest junior singles titles came in 2025 at J500 Fort Lauderdale (USA) (d. Kristina Liutova) in December and J300 Nonthaburi (THA) (d. Wang Yuhua) in March.
- Sun has contested 9 professional events, including winning her **first 2 professional titles** at back-to-back W15 events at Sharm El Sheikh (EGY) in October-November 2025, defeating Valeriia Artemeva to win the first and Pushkareva to win the 2nd.
- **Elsewhere at professional level in 2026**, Sun reached the semifinals at W35 Monastir (TUN) in February (I. Oktiabreva) and the quarterfinals at W35 Bol (CRO) in May (I. Valentina Ivanov).
- Sun became **junior world No. 1** after reaching the final at Roland Garros last month and plays here at the same ranking. She reached a career-high WTA ranking of No. 612 in June and is currently ranked at No. 620.
- Sun entered the **girls' doubles here** alongside Zhang Ruichen. As No. 4 seeds, the pair fell to Jordyn Hazelitt/Welles Newman in the 1st round.
- **PUSHKAREVA** is bidding to win her first Grand Slam title.
- By reaching the final here, Pushkareva has recorded her **best Grand Slam result**. Her previous best result at the Grand Slams was reaching the 3rd round on her Grand Slam debut at the Australian Open this year, where she defeated Maaya Rajeshwaran Revathi and Aishi Das before falling Shao Yushan.
- Pushkareva is making her **junior Wimbledon debut**. She is contesting her 3rd junior Grand Slam event overall – in addition to her 3rd round finish at the Australian Open this year, she reached the 2nd round at Roland Garros last month (d. Lea Nilsson, I. Maia Ilinca Burcescu).
- **Prior to Wimbledon this year**, Pushkareva competed at J300 Roehampton (GBR), falling to Chukwumelije Clarke in the 1st round.
- Pushkareva's **other highlights in 2026** are reaching the quarterfinals at J200 Kuala Lumpur (MAS) (I. Sakino Miyazawa) and J500 Offenbach (GER) (I. Anastasija Cvetkovic).
- Pushkareva has **won one title at junior-level** – at 2025 J200 Castricum (NED) (d. Paola Pinera Celorio).
- Pushkareva **made her professional debut in October 2025**, reaching the final at her first professional event at W15 Sharm El Sheikh (EGY) (I. Sun Xinran). She has contested a total of 7 professional events and has won one main draw match across the 4 professional events she has contested this year, reaching the 2nd round at W15 Maanshaan (CHN) (d. Zhao Xichen, I. Anastasia Lizunova).
- Pushkareva reached **career-high junior ranking** of No. 19 last month. She plays here at No. 28. She reached a career-high WTA ranking of No. 988 in March and is currently ranked at No. 1015.
- Pushkareva entered the girls' doubles here alongside Felitsata Dorofeeva-Rybas. As No. 3 seeds, the pair fell to No. 5 seeds Jana Kovackova/Katerina Zajickova in the quarterfinals on Thursday.
