2026 WIMBLEDON QUAD WHEELCHAIR SINGLES FINAL NOTES Sunday 12 July

NO. 1 NIELS VINK (NED) v NO. 2 SAM SCHRODER (NED)

Head-to-head: Vink leads 30-15

A 46th meeting for Vink and Schroder, their 13th at a Grand Slam and 4th at Wimbledon. Vink has won 2 of their 3 meetings here – Schroder defeated Vink in the final in 2022, before Vink defeated Schroder in the final in both 2024 and 2025. Vink leads both the overall head-to-head (30-15) and their head-to-head at the Grand Slams (8-4).

This is the pair's 6th meeting on grass – but their first this year. Vink leads their head-to-head on grass 4-1. Since falling to Schroder in the final here in 2022, he defeated Schroder in the final at both the British Open Roehampton (GBR) and at Wimbledon in 2024 and 2025.

Of the pair's 45 previous meetings, 40 have come in the final of a tournament. Vink leads their head-to-head in finals 27-13, and 3-2 in finals in 2026. Vink won in the finals at Adelaide, the Australian Open and the Cajun Classic (USA), while Schroder won in the finals at both the Melbourne Wheelchair Open (AUS) and Iizuka (JPN) this year. The pair's last 32 meetings have come in the finals at tournaments.

Vink and Schroder have dominated the quad division since Dylan Alcott's retirement at the 2022 Australian Open. Including Wimbledon this year, one of the pair will have won the title at 16 of the 18 Grand Slam tournaments since the start of the 2022 season. Vink has won 9 Grand Slam titles in that time, while Schroder has won 6 titles.

Vink and Schroder are both former Wimbledon champions. Vink is bidding to become the 2nd player to win 4 or more Wimbledon wheelchair singles titles – after Diede de Groot, who has won the women's singles title here on 6 occasions. By winning his 3rd title here last year, he claimed sole ownership of the record for most Wimbledon quad wheelchair singles titles, ahead of 2-time champion Alcott.

Schroder is bidding to equal Alcott's tally of 2 quad wheelchair singles titles here. He will become one of 6 players to win multiple Wimbledon wheelchair singles titles if he wins today – alongside De Groot, Alcott, Vink, Tokito Oda and Stefan Olsson. Vink is bidding to win his 10th Grand Slam title and close the gap on Alcott at the top of the all-time list for most Grand Slam quad wheelchair singles titles. Schroder is bidding to win his 8th Grand Slam title and close the gap on Vink in 2nd place on the list.

Vink and Schroder are 2 of **3** Dutchmen to have won a Grand Slam wheelchair singles title – alongside Robin Ammerlaan, who won 3 Grand Slam men's wheelchair singles titles. Six Dutchwomen have won Grand Slam wheelchair singles titles.

Vink is bidding to record his 50th Grand Slam singles match-win and become the 4th player to record 50 Grand Slam quad wheelchair singles match-wins – after Alcott, David Wagner and Schroder. Prior to today, 10 players have recorded 50 or more Grand Slam match-wins across all wheelchair tennis categories – Vink and Oda are both bidding to record their 50th Grand Slam match-wins today.

- **VINK** is bidding to win his 4th consecutive Wimbledon title on his 5th appearance here. He is making his 20th Grand Slam appearance overall.
- Vink is bidding to become the **2nd player, in any category, to win 4 consecutive Wimbledon wheelchair singles titles** – after Diede de Groot, who won 4 consecutive women’s wheelchair singles titles here in 2021-24. He finished runner-up on his debut here in 2022 (I. Schroder), but has since won 3 consecutive titles here, defeating Heath Davidson in final in 2023 and defeating Schroder in the finals here in both 2024 and 2025.
- Vink is also bidding to win his 5th consecutive Grand Slam title and become the **2nd player to record a streak of 5 consecutive Grand Slam quad wheelchair singles titles** – after Dylan Alcott, who won 5 consecutive major titles on 2 occasions (2018-19 and 2020-21). He would become the 7th player to record a streak of 5 or more consecutive Grand Slam wheelchair singles titles.

NB 2017 was the first season when all four Grand Slam tournaments held men’s and women’s wheelchair singles events.
The quad wheelchair singles events have been held at all four Grand Slam tournaments since 2019.

- Vink is bidding to become the **4th player to win back-to-back wheelchair singles titles at Roland Garros and Wimbledon on multiple occasions** – after Alcott, De Groot and Oda. He is one of 2 players to have achieved the feat in quad wheelchair singles, alongside Alcott.

Players competing in Wimbledon wheelchair singles finals today in **bold**

- Vink is bidding to win his **10th Grand Slam singles title**. In addition to his 3 titles here, he also won the title at Roland Garros in 2022 (d. Schroder), 2023 (d. Schroder) and this year (d. Ahmet Kaplan), at the US Open in 2022 (d. Schroder) and 2025 (d. Schroder), and at the Australian Open this year (d. Schroder).
- Vink is contesting his **16th Grand Slam singles final**. In addition to his 9 Grand Slam singles titles, he also finished runner-up at the US Open in 2021 (I. Alcott) and 2023 (I. Schroder), at 2022 Wimbledon (I. Schroder), at the Australian Open in 2023 and 2025 (I. Schroder), and at 2025 Roland Garros (I. Guy Sasson).

- Vink is **one of 6 players to have won the career ‘Golden Slam’ in wheelchair singles** – alongside Alcott (quad), De Groot (women’s), Oda (men’s), Shingo Kunieda (men’s), and Yui Kamiji, who completed the career Golden Slam by winning her first women’s singles title here on Saturday. He completed the career Golden Slam by winning his first title at the Australian Open this year.
- **Prior to Wimbledon this year**, Vink reached the semifinals at the British Open Roehampton (GBR), defeating Benjamin Wenzel and Leon Els before falling to Jin Woodman.
- Vink is bidding to win his **5th singles title of 2026**. In addition to his titles at the Australian Open and Roland Garros this year, he also won the titles at Adelaide (AUS) and the Cajun Classic (USA), defeating Schroder in the final at both events.
- Vink’s **other highlights in 2026** are finishing runner-up at the Melbourne Wheelchair Open (AUS) and Iizuka (JPN), falling to Schroder in the final at both events.
- Vink is bidding to win his **58th singles title** – and his 6th on grass. In addition to his titles here in 2023-25, he also won the titles at the British Open Roehampton (GBR) in 2024 and 2025.
- Vink is a **15-time Grand Slam doubles champion**. He won 9 Grand Slam doubles titles alongside Schroder, including at Wimbledon in 2022, 2023 and 2024. He has also won 6 Grand Slam doubles titles alongside Sasson, including at the last 5 Grand Slam tournaments. He and Sasson defeated Schroder/Woodman in the quad wheelchair doubles final here on Saturday.
- Vink won the **gold medal in quad singles at the Paris 2024 Paralympic Wheelchair Tennis Event**, where he defeated Schroder in the final to become the first Dutch player to win the quad singles gold medal at the Paralympics.
- Vink is a **4-time Paralympic medallist**. In addition to his gold medal in quad singles at Paris 2024, he also won the gold medal in quad doubles at Paris 2024 alongside Schroder. He also won the bronze medal in quad singles at Tokyo 2020, falling to Alcott in the semifinals before defeating Koji Sugeno in the bronze medal match, and partnered Schroder to win the gold medal in quad doubles at Tokyo 2020.
- Vink reached the **world No. 1 ranking** for the first time in December 2021. He has been ranked either No. 1 or No. 2 for all but 2 weeks since March 2022. He dropped to No. 2 for 5 weeks in April-May this year before returning to the top ranking in June.
- Vink is coached by Alex Gaspa.
- Lefthander **SCHRODER** is bidding to win his 2nd Wimbledon title on his 5th appearance in the final here.
- Schroder is bidding to win his **8th Grand Slam singles title**. He won his first title on his Grand Slam debut at the 2020 US Open (d. Dylan Alcott), when he became the first Dutch player to win a Grand Slam quad wheelchair singles title. He has since won the title at the Australian Open in 2022 (d. Alcott), 2023 (d. Vink), 2024 (d. Guy Sasson) and 2025 (d. Vink), at 2022 Wimbledon (d. Vink) and at the 2023 US Open (d. Vink).
- Schroder is contesting his **19th Grand Slam final**. In addition to his 7 Grand Slam title-victories, he has also finished runner-up at Roland Garros on 4 occasions, at Wimbledon on 3 occasions, and twice each at the Australian Open and the US Open. Prior to this event, he had reached the final at 3 of the last 4 Grand Slam tournaments – falling to Vink at Wimbledon and the US Open last year and at the Australian Open this year.
- **Elsewhere in Grand Slam play this year**, Schroder fell in the semifinals at Roland Garros (l. Ahmet Kaplan).
- **Prior to Wimbledon this year**, Schroder reached the semifinals at both Eastbourne (GBR) (l. Jin Woodman) and the British Open Roehampton (GBR) (l. Sasson).
- Schroder is bidding to win his **4th singles title of 2026**. His titles this year came at the Melbourne Wheelchair Open (AUS) (d. Vink), the Allianz Para Trophy (GER) (d. Sasson) and Iizuka (JPN) (d. Vink).
- Schroder’s **other highlights in 2026** are finishing runner-up at Adelaide (AUS), the Australian Open and the Cajun Classic (USA), falling to Vink in the final at all 3 events.

- Schroder is bidding to win his **41st singles title** – and his 2nd on grass, after winning the title here in 2022.
- Schroder is an **11-time Grand Slam doubles champion**. He won 9 Grand Slam doubles titles alongside Vink, including at Wimbledon in 2022, 2023 and 2024. He has also won one Grand Slam title with each of Andy Lapthorne and David Wagner. He and Woodman fell to Sasson/Vink in the quad wheelchair doubles final here on Saturday.
- Schroder won the **silver medal in quad singles at the Paralympic Tennis Event at Tokyo 2020 and Paris 2024**. He fell to Alcott in the final at Tokyo 2020 and to Vink in the final at Paris 2024.
- Schroder is a **4-time Paralympic medallist**. In addition to his 2 silver medals in quad singles, he also won the gold medal in quad doubles at Tokyo 2020 and Paris 2024, both alongside Vink.
- Schroder reached the **world No. 1 ranking** for the first time in February 2022. He has been ranked in the Top 2 since then, excluding one week in April 2025 and one week in June 2025. He held the No. 1 ranking for 5 weeks in April-May this year before dropping to No. 2 again in June.
- Schroder is coached by Geesina van de Kamp.
