

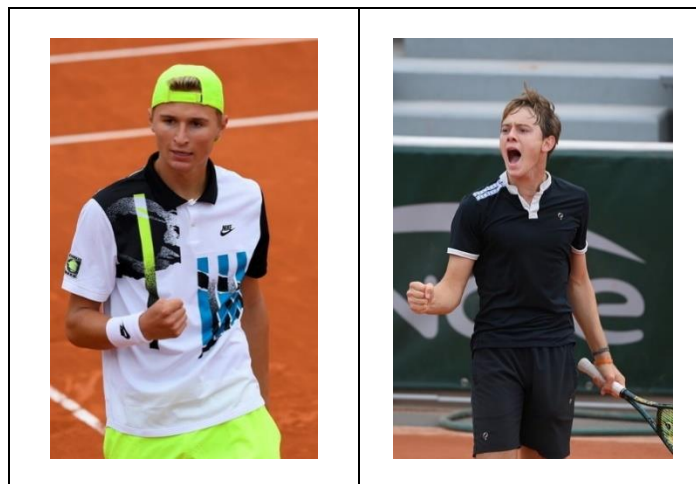

- **STRICKER** is bidding to become the first Swiss player to reach the boys' singles final at Roland Garros since 2003, when Stan Wawrinka won the junior title here. Compatriot Leandro Riedi is also bidding to reach the final here this year.
- If both Stricker and Riedi reach the final here, it will be the **first Grand Slam boys' singles final contested by 2 Swiss players**.
- Stricker and Riedi are both bidding to become the **first Swiss players to reach a Roland Garros junior singles final since 2016**, when Rebeka Masarova won the girls' singles title here.
- By reaching the semifinals here, Stricker has recorded his **best Grand Slam performance**. His previous best performances at the Grand Slams were reaching the quarterfinals at both the 2019 US Open (l. Cannon Kingsley) and the Australian Open this year (l. Harold Mayot).
- **Last year here**, on his Roland Garros debut, Stricker fell to Adrian Andreev in the 1st round. This is his 2nd appearance at Roland Garros and his 6th Grand Slam appearance overall.
- Stricker is contesting his **3rd junior event of the season**. Apart from his appearances here and at the Australian Open, he reached the 3rd round at J1 Traralgon (AUS) in January, falling to Matteo Gigante.
- Stricker's **best junior results** are reaching the semifinals at 2019 JA Osaka (JPN) (l. Mayot) and the quarterfinals at the 2019 US Open and the 2020 Australian Open. He has never won a title at a Grade A or Grade 1 event, but has won 2 titles at Grade 2-level.
- Stricker has **contested 6 events as a professional** – including 3 this year. His best result is reaching the quarterfinals on clay last month at M25 Klosters (SUI) (l. Holger Vitus Nodskov Rune).
- Stricker reached a **career-high junior ranking of No. 8** in February this year. He plays here at No. 10. He is ranked No. 1148 in the ATP rankings and No. 1801 in the ITF World Tennis Tour rankings.
- Stricker is coached by Sven Swinner.

- **TORRES** is bidding to become the first Argentinian player to reach a junior Grand Slam final since Sebastian Baez finished runner-up in the boys' singles here in 2018. Agustin Velotti, who won the boys' singles title here in 2010, is the last Argentinian player to win a junior Roland Garros title.
- By reaching the semifinals here, Torres has recorded his **best Grand Slam performance**. His previous best performances at the Grand Slams are reaching the 2nd round on his Grand Slam debut at 2019 Roland Garros (d. Zane Khan, l. Holger Vitus Nodskov Rune) and at the 2019 US Open (d. Kevin Chahoud, l. Aidan Mayo). This is his 4th Grand Slam appearance overall.
- Torres is contesting his **first junior event of the season**. He has played 3 professional events this year – all of which were in Argentina during February and March. Prior to coming here, his only victory, at any level, was reaching the 2nd round as a wild card at M25 Hurlingham (ARG) (d. Mateo Berta, l. Facundo Diaz Acosta).
- Torres' **best junior result** is finishing runner-up at JA Plantation (USA) (also known as the Orange Bowl) in 2019. He fell to compatriot Thiago Agustin Tirante in the final. He has reached the semifinals at 2 other Grade A events prior to coming here – at JA Merida (MEX) in 2018 (l. Santiago de la Fuente) and 2019 (l. Tirante).
- Torres has **contested 8 events as a professional**. His best result as a professional is reaching the quarterfinals at 2019 M15 Santiago (CHI) (l. Maximiliano Estevez).
- Torres reached a **career-high junior ranking of No. 14** in January this year. He plays here at No. 23. He is ranked No. 1279 in the ATP rankings and No. 1222 in the ITF World Tennis Tour rankings.
- Torres represented Argentina at the **2018 Junior Davis Cup Finals**. He won 2 of the 4 singles matches he contested as Argentina finished in 3rd place.
- Torres is coached by Mauro Aprile.

- **RIEDI** is bidding to become the first Swiss player to reach the boys' singles final at Roland Garros since 2003, when Stan Wawrinka won the junior title here. Compatriot Dominic Stephan Stricker is also bidding to reach the final here this year.
- If both Riedi and Stricker reach the final here, it will be the **first Grand Slam boys' singles final contested by 2 Swiss players**.
- Riedi and Stricker are both bidding to become the **first Swiss players to reach a Roland Garros junior singles final since 2016**, when Rebeka Masarova won the girls' singles title here.
- Riedi is making his **Roland Garros debut** here this year. He is making his 4th appearance at a junior Grand Slam, with his previous best result at a Grand Slam coming at the Australian Open this year, where he reached the 3rd round (l. Karlis Ozolins).
- Riedi is contesting his **3rd junior event of the season**. Apart from his appearances here and at the Australian Open, he reached the quarterfinals at J1 Traralgon (AUS) in January, falling to Timo Legout.
- Riedi's **best junior results** are winning 2 titles at Grade 1-level – at 2019 J1 Charleroi-Marcinelle (FRA) (d. Alibek Kachmazov) and 2019 J1 Repentigny (CAN) (d. Valentin Royer).
- Riedi has **contested 4 events as a professional** – all of which have come this year. His best result is reaching the quarterfinals on clay last month at M25 Klosters (SUI) (l. Jesper de Jong). He also received a wild card into qualifying at Kitzbuhel, and reached the 2nd round of qualifying (d. Andrej Martin, l. Pierre-Hugues Herbert).
- Riedi reached a **career-high junior ranking of No. 7** in February this year. He plays here at No. 11. He is ranked No. 939 in the ATP rankings.
- Riedi is coached by Yves Allegro.

- **DEN OUDEN** is bidding to become the first Dutch player to reach a junior final at Roland Garros since 2005, when Antal van der Duijn finished runner-up to Marin Cilic.
- Den Ouden is also bidding to become the **first Dutch player to reach a junior Grand Slam final** since Arantxa Rus won the girls' singles title at the 2008 Australian Open. He would become the first Dutch player to reach a Grand Slam boys' singles final since Thiemo de Bakker won the title at 2006 Wimbledon.
- Den Ouden is making his **Grand Slam debut** here. He has never played an event at Grade A-level prior to this tournament.
- Den Ouden is contesting his **4th junior event of the season**. His best result this year is winning the title at J2 Tunis (TUN) (d. Diego Augusto Barreto Sanchez) in January. He contested his first event at Grade 1-level earlier this year, reaching the 3rd round at J1 Kazan (RUS) (l. Maks Kasnikowski)
- Den Ouden made his **professional debut** in the qualifying draw at M15 Alkmaar (NED) earlier this year. He reached the 2nd round of qualifying (d. Joris Hoogland, l. Robert Strombachs). It is the only professional event he has contested.
- Den Ouden reached a **career-high junior ranking of No. 43** in March this year. He plays here at No. 47. He does not currently have a professional ranking.
- Den Ouden is coached by Dennis van Scheppingen.
