WORLD JUNIOR TENNIS

The ITF World Junior Tennis Competition was launched in 1991 as an International Team Competition for players aged 14 and under. Teams from across the world compete in this event for a place in the Final where 16 boys teams and 16 girls teams compete for the title. The Finals were held in Japan from 1991 until 1998 and for the first six years was sponsored by the Nippon Telegraph and Telephone Corporation (NTT). The event moved to Prostejov, Czech Republic in 1999, which hosted the event for the 20th time in 2018.
