#### On court today...

- Stefanos Tsitsipas and Nick Kyrgios will meet in a hotly-anticipated 3rd round clash in the final match of the day on No. 1 Court, with the pair looking to reach the round of 16 here after a 4-year and 6-year absence, respectively. It is the duo's 2nd meeting during the 2022 grass court season, with Kyrgios having won when they faced off in the 2nd round at Halle last month. Victory for Kyrgios today will be his 10th grass court win of the year and see him claim sole ownership of first place on the list for most Tour-level match-wins on grass this season, ahead of Matteo Berrettini – while Tsitsipas will equal Berrettini and Kyrgios at the top of the list if he wins today. The Australian leads the pair's overall head-to-head 3-1 but will need to defeat a Top 5 player at a Grand Slam for just the 2nd time on his 12th attempt if he is to further improve that record.
  
- Rafael Nadal and Richard Gasquet were born just 15 days apart in 1986 – and now the pair, who have known each other since their junior days, will attempt to become the 7th and 8th men in the Open Era to reach the round of 16 at Wimbledon aged 36 or older. Nadal faces Lorenzo Sonego on Centre Court today, while Gasquet is up against Botic van de Zandschulp on No. 2 Court. A win for Gasquet this afternoon – his 32nd here – would also see the veteran Frenchman equal Jo-Wilfried Tsonga's Open Era record for most Wimbledon match-wins by a Frenchman.
  
- Tommy Paul and Tim van Rijthoven have set the standard for Wimbledon debutants this year, with both reaching the round of 16 on their first appearances here. Two other Wimbledon first-timers – Jenson Brooksby and Alex Molcan – will attempt to join them in the last 16 today, with the pair playing back-to-back matches on No. 3 Court. Brooksby is first up against Cristian Garin before Molcan takes on No. 11 seed Taylor Fritz. Should both Brooksby and Molcan win, it will be the first time that 4 men have reached the last 16 on their Wimbledon debuts since 1973. Should just one of the pair win, it will be the first time that 3 men have reached the last 16 on their Wimbledon debuts since 1996.
  
- Jack Sock and Jason Kubler have won 5 matches each to make it to the 3rd round here, with the pair having both come through qualifying to reach the main draw this year. They meet today in the first match on Court 18, with the winner set to become the 29th qualifier to reach the round of 16 in the men's singles at Wimbledon in the Open Era – and the first since Ernests Gulbis in 2018. The match-up is the first meeting between qualifiers in the 3rd round or later in the men's singles at Wimbledon since 1985, when Ricardo Acuna defeated Robert Seguso in the round of 16.

## NO. 2 RAFAEL NADAL (ESP) v NO. 27 LORENZO SONEGO (ITA)

### Head-to-head: first meeting

Sonego is facing a lefthanded player for the 2nd straight round, having defeated Hugo Gaston in the 2nd round here on Thursday. He has a 2-2 win-loss record against lefthanders at the Grand Slams and a 15-9 win-loss record against lefthanders at Tour-level overall.

- Two-time Wimbledon champion **NADAL** is bidding to reach the round of 16 here for the 10th time. This is his 15th Wimbledon appearance and his 65th Grand Slam overall.
- Nadal is also bidding to **reach the round of 16 at a Grand Slam for the 53rd time**. He is in 3rd place on the Open Era list for most Grand Slam 3rd round appearances, behind Roger Federer and Novak Djokovic.

- At 36 years 37 days, Nadal is bidding to become the **6th-oldest man in the Open Era to reach the round of 16 at Wimbledon** – after Roger Federer, Pancho Gonzales, Ivo Karlovic, Niki Pilic and Ken Rosewall. (NB ages calculated at the end of the tournament)
- Nadal is bidding to record his **308th Grand Slam match-win**. By defeating Ricardas Berankis in the 2nd round here, he claimed sole ownership of 4th place on the all-time list for most Grand Slam singles match-wins, ahead of Martina Navratilova. He became the 5th player to record 300 Grand Slam singles match-wins at Roland Garros this year.

- Nadal advanced to the 3rd round here after defeating Francisco Cerundolo 64 63 36 64 in the 1st round on Tuesday and Ricardas Bernankis 64 64 46 63 in the 2nd round on Thursday.
- Nadal **withdrew from 2021 Wimbledon** due to fatigue. On his last appearance here, in 2019, he reached the semifinals before falling to Roger Federer in 4 sets. He is contesting his first tournament on grass since then here this fortnight.

- Nadal is bidding to win his **3rd Wimbledon title**. He defeated Federer to win his first Wimbledon title in 2008 and won the title for a 2nd time in 2010 (d. Tomas Berdych). He also reached the final here in 2006-07, losing to Federer on both occasions, and 2011 (l. Novak Djokovic).
- Nadal is bidding to become the **6th man in history to win the first 3 Grand Slam tournaments of the season** – after Jack Crawford (1933), Don Budge (1938), Lew Hoad (1956), Rod Laver (1962 and 1969) and Djokovic (2021). Of the 4 men who have previously won the opening 3 Grand Slam tournaments of the season, 2 (Budge and Laver) have gone on to win the Grand Slam, with Laver doing so in both 1962 and 1969.
- Nadal is bidding to win **Roland Garros and Wimbledon in the same year for the 3rd time** and equal Bjorn Borg's all-time record of 3 back-to-back men's singles titles in Paris and London. Borg achieved the feat in 3 consecutive years (1978-80), while Nadal won Roland Garros and Wimbledon back-to-back in 2008 and 2010.
- Nadal is bidding to win his **23rd Grand Slam title** and equal Serena Williams in 2nd place on the all-time list for most Grand Slam singles titles won. Margaret Court (24 Grand Slam singles titles) and Williams are the only players, men or women, to have won more Grand Slam singles titles than Nadal.
- Nadal is bidding to become **the oldest man in the Open Era to win the Wimbledon singles title**. Federer, who won the title here in 2017 aged 35 years 342 days, is the only man aged 35 or older to have won the Wimbledon title in the Open Era. (NB ages calculated at the end of the tournament)
- Nadal is also bidding to win his 9th Grand Slam title since turning 30 and claim sole ownership of the record for **most Grand Slam men's singles titles won after the age of 30 in the Open Era** – ahead of Djokovic, who has also won 8 Grand Slam titles since turning 30.
- Nadal claimed **sole ownership of the record for most Grand Slam men's singles titles**, ahead of Federer and Djokovic, by winning his 21st Grand Slam title at the Australian Open this year. He recovered from 0-2 down to defeat Daniil Medvedev in 5 sets in the final. It was his 2nd Australian Open title (having also defeated Federer to win the title in 2009) and saw him become the 2nd man in the Open Era to complete the career Grand Slam twice, after Djokovic.
- Nadal also won his **14th Roland Garros title** this season, defeating Casper Ruud in straight sets in the final. At 36 years 2 days, he became the oldest men's singles champion in the tournament's history.
- **Also in 2022**, Nadal won the titles at Melbourne (d. Maxime Cressy) and Acapulco (d. Cameron Norrie). He finished runner-up at Indian Wells-1000, with his defeat to Taylor Fritz in the final ending his 20-match winning streak, and reached the quarterfinals at Madrid-1000 (l. Carlos Alcaraz).
- Nadal **did not contest a Tour-level grass court event prior to coming here**. He is one of 16 players in the men's singles draw not to have played a grass court event prior to Wimbledon this season.
- Nadal is one of **5 lefthanders** to reach the 3rd round from the 22 who started in the men's singles here this year. He was the last lefthander to win the title here in 2010.
- Four of Nadal's **92 Tour-level titles** have come on grass. In addition to his 2 Wimbledon titles, he also won the titles at 2008 Queen's (d. Djokovic) and 2015 Stuttgart (d. Viktor Troicki).
- Nadal has a 7-4 win-loss record in **5-set matches** at Wimbledon and a 25-13 win-loss record in 5-set matches overall. He has won all 3 five-set matches he has contested this season, defeating both Denis Shapovalov and Medvedev in 5 sets at the Australian Open and defeating Felix Auger-Aliassime in 5 sets at Roland Garros.
- Nadal **became world No. 1 for the first time** in August 2008 and has been ranked at No. 1 for a total of 209 weeks. He is beginning his 873rd consecutive week in the Top 10 this week – a record for most consecutive weeks spent in the world's Top 10. He plays here at No. 4.
- Nadal is a 4-time **Davis Cup** champion. He made his debut in the competition in 2004, has a 37-5 Davis Cup win-loss record and was part of the Spanish teams which won the title in 2004, 2008, 2011 and 2019. He jointly holds the record for most Davis Cup titles among active players, alongside Feliciano Lopez. Spain will compete in Valencia alongside Canada, Serbia and Korea Republic in Group B at the 2022 Davis Cup Finals.
- Nadal is coached by Carlos Moya, who reached the round of 16 here in 2004, Francisco Roig and Marc Lopez.

- **SONEGO** is bidding to reach the round of 16 here for the 2nd time and equal his best Grand Slam result. This is his 4th Wimbledon appearance and his 16th Grand Slam overall.
- Sonogo is bidding to become the **2nd Italian man in the Open Era to reach the round of 16 at Wimbledon on multiple occasions** – after Matteo Berrettini, who reached the round of 16 here in 2019 and 2021. With fellow Italian Jannik Sinner also through to the round of 16 here this year, it would be the 2nd time in the Open Era that multiple Italian men have reached the round of 16 at Wimbledon – after 2021, when Sonogo and Berrettini both reached the last 16 here.
- Sonogo advanced to the 3rd round here after defeating Denis Kudla 67(6) 63 75 46 62 in the 1st round on Tuesday and Hugo Gaston 76(4) 64 64 in the 2nd round on Thursday.
- Sonogo's **best Grand Slam result** is round of 16 on 2 occasions – including at Wimbledon last year, when he defeated Pedro Sousa, Daniel Elahi Galan and James Duckworth before falling to Roger Federer. He also reached the round of 16 at 2020 Roland Garros (l. Diego Schwartzman).
- **In Grand Slam play in 2022**, Sonogo reached the 3rd round in both the Australian Open (d. Sam Querrey and Oscar Otte, l. Miomir Kecmanovic) and Roland Garros (d. Peter Gojowczyk and Joao Sousa, l. Casper Ruud).
- **Prior to Wimbledon**, Sonogo reached the quarterfinals at Stuttgart, where he defeated Benoit Paire and Jan-Lennard Struff before falling to Matteo Berrettini. He also reached the 2nd round at Eastbourne (d. James Duckworth, l. Alex de Minaur), but fell to Kudla in the 1st round at Queen's.
- Sonogo's **best result in 2022** is reaching the semifinals at Buenos Aires (l. Schwartzman). He also reached the quarterfinals at Sydney (l. Aslan Karatsev), Cordoba (l. Albert Ramos-Vinolas) and Stuttgart.
- Sonogo is bidding to **defeat a Top 5 player for the 3rd time**. He has a 2-5 win-loss record against Top 5 players at Tour-level, with his 2 victories coming against No. 1 Novak Djokovic in the quarterfinals at 2020 Vienna and against No. 4 Dominic Thiem in the 3rd round at 2021 Rome-1000. He lost his only previous match against a Top 5 player at the Grand Slams – to No. 3 Federer in the 1st round at 2019 Roland Garros. The highest-ranked player he has defeated at the Grand Slams is No. 30 Taylor Fritz in the 3rd round at 2020 Roland Garros.
- Sonogo has **won 2 Tour-level titles** – including one on grass, at 2019 Antalya (d. Kecmanovic). He also won the title at 2021 Sardinia (d. Laslo Djere).
- Sonogo's 5-set victory against Kudla in the 1st round here was his first **5-set match** at Wimbledon and improved his win-loss record in 5-set matches to 3-2.
- Sonogo reached a **career-high ranking** of No. 21 in October 2021. He plays here at No. 54 – his lowest ranking since October 2019.
- Sonogo made his **Davis Cup** debut for Italy last year and has a 2-2 win-loss record in the competition. He fell to Filip Horansky in the only match he contested during Italy's victory over Slovakia in the 2022 Qualifiers in March. Italy will compete in Bologna alongside Croatia, Argentina and Sweden in Group A at the 2022 Davis Cup Finals.
- Sonogo is coached by Gipo Arbino.

## NO. 4 STEFANOS TSITSIPAS (GRE) v NICK KYRGIOS (AUS)

### Head-to-head: Kyrgios leads 3-1

A 5th Tour-level meeting between Tsitsipas and Kyrgios, their 2nd on grass but their first at a Grand Slam. Kyrgios leads the overall head-to-head and also won their only previous grass court meeting – in the 2nd round at Halle last month.

Tsitsipas and Kyrgios are both in the Top 5 on the list for most Tour-level grass court match-wins this season. Kyrgios will claim sole ownership of first place on the list, ahead of Matteo Berrettini, if he records his 10th Tour-level match-win on grass today. Tsitsipas will equal Berrettini and Kyrgios at the top of the list if he wins today.

- **TSITSIPAS** is bidding to reach the round of 16 here for the 2nd time and equal his best Wimbledon result. This is his 5th Wimbledon appearance and his 20th Grand Slam overall.
- Tsitsipas is bidding to become **the first Greek player, man or woman, to reach the last 16 at Wimbledon on multiple occasions**. He is one of 4 Greek players to have reached the round of 16 here – alongside Augustos Zerlendis (1920), Nicky Kalogeropoulos (1964) and Eleni Daniilidou (2002).
- Tsitsipas advanced to the 3rd round here after defeating qualifier Alexander Ritschard 76(1) 63 57 64 in the 1st round on Tuesday and Jordan Thompson 62 63 75 in the 2nd round on Thursday for his **first Wimbledon match-wins since 2018**.
- **Last year here**, as No. 3 seed, Tsitsipas fell to Frances Tiafoe in the 1st round. He also fell in the 1st round here in 2019 (l. Thomas Fabbiano).
- Tsitsipas' is bidding to **equal his best Wimbledon result**. In 2018 he defeated Gregoire Barrere, Jared Donaldson and Fabbiano before falling to John Isner in straight sets. He became the first Greek man to reach the last 16 at a Grand Slam since Nicky Kalogeropoulos at 1964 Wimbledon.
- At 23 years 332 days, Tsitsipas is bidding to become the **youngest Grand Slam men's singles champion** since Novak Djokovic won the title at the 2011 Australian Open aged 23 years 253 days. If he reaches the final here, he will become the youngest Wimbledon men's singles finalist since Nadal won the title here in 2008 aged 22 years 33 days. (NB ages calculated at the end of the tournament)

- Tsitsipas' **best Grand Slam result** is reaching the final at 2021 Roland Garros, when he fell to Novak Djokovic in 5 sets despite holding a 2-0 lead. He became the first Greek player in history to reach a Grand Slam final and, aged 22 years 305 days, also became the youngest Grand Slam finalist since Andy Murray (22 years 261 days) at the 2010 Australian Open.
- **In Grand Slam play in 2022**, Tsitsipas reached the semifinals at the Australian Open (l. Daniil Medvedev) and the round of 16 at Roland Garros (l. Holger Rune).
- Tsitsipas' **best result in 2022** is winning the title at Monte Carlo-1000 (d. Alejandro Davidovich Fokina). He also finished runner-up at both Rotterdam (l. Felix Auger-Aliassime) and Rome-1000 (l. Djokovic) and reached the semifinals at Acapulco (l. Cameron Norrie) and Madrid-1000 (l. Alexander Zverev).
- Tsitsipas is bidding to record his **43rd Tour-level match-win in 2022**. He has recorded more Tour-level matches than any other player on Tour this season.
- Tsitsipas is bidding for record his **9th Tour-level grass court match-win in 2022**, which would see him in joint top place on the list for most Tour-level match-wins on grass this season, level with Matteo Berrettini and Kyrgios. Prior to this summer's grass court season Tsitsipas had won only 8 Tour-level matches on grass in his entire career.
- Prior to Wimbledon, Tsitsipas won his **first Tour-level grass court title** at Mallorca, defeating Roberto Bautista Agut in the final. Elsewhere on grass this season, he reached the quarterfinals at Stuttgart (after receiving a first round bye) (d. Dominic Stricker, l. Andy Murray) and the 2nd round at Halle (d. Benjamin Bonzi, l. Nick Kyrgios).
- Tsitsipas has won one of the **2 five-set matches** he has contested at Wimbledon, defeating Donaldson in 5 sets in the 2nd round in 2018 but falling to Fabbiano in 5 sets in the 1st round in 2019. He has an 8-6 win-loss record in 5-set matches at Tour-level overall.
- Tsitsipas reached a **career-high ranking** of No. 3 in August last year. He plays here at No. 5.
- Tsitsipas is a **former junior world No. 1**. His best Grand Slam singles results as a junior were reaching the semifinals at both Wimbledon (l. Denis Shapovalov) and the US Open (l. Felix Auger-Aliassime) in 2016. He also won the boys' doubles title alongside Kenneth Raisma at 2016 Wimbledon (d. Auger-Aliassime/Shapovalov).
- Tsitsipas made his **Davis Cup** debut for Greece at the 2019 Europe Group III event in Athens and has a 6-1 overall win-loss record in the competition. Greece will play away to Tunisia in a World Group II tie in September.
- Tsitsipas is coached by his father, Apostolos Tsitsipas.
- **KYRGIOS** is bidding to reach the round of 16 here for the 4th time – and the first time since 2016. This is his 8th Wimbledon appearance and his 30th Grand Slam overall.
- Kyrgios and fellow Australians Alex de Minaur and Jason Kubler are bidding to reach the round of 16 here today. If all 3 Australians win, it will be the **first time 3 Australian men have reached the round of 16 at a Grand Slam since 2002 Wimbledon** – when Wayne Arthurs, Lleyton Hewitt and Mark Philippoussis all reached the round of 16 here.
- If any of Kyrgios, De Minaur and Kubler win today, they will become the **first Australian man to reach the round of 16 at Wimbledon since 2016** – when Kyrgios and Bernard Tomic both reached the round of 16 here.
- Kyrgios advanced to the 3rd round here after defeating wild card Paul Jubb 36 61 75 67(3) 75 in the 1st round on Tuesday and No. 26 seed Filip Krajinovic 62 63 61 in the 2nd round on Thursday.
- **Last year here**, Kyrgios reached the 3rd round, defeating Ugo Humbert and Gianluca Mager before retiring with the score level at 62 16 against Felix Auger-Aliassime due to an abdominal injury.
- Kyrgios' **best Grand Slam result** is reaching the quarterfinals on 2 occasions – including on his Wimbledon debut in 2014 (l. Milos Raonic), when he became the first man to reach the last 8 on his Wimbledon debut since Florian Mayer in 2004. Ranked No. 144, he defeated world No. 1 Rafael Nadal in the round of 16 to become the lowest-ranked player to defeat a world No. 1 at a Grand Slam since No. 193 Andrei Olhovskiy defeated Jim Courier in the 3rd round at 1992 Wimbledon. He also reached the quarterfinals at the 2015 Australian Open (l. Andy Murray).
- **In Grand Slam play this year**, Kyrgios reached the 2nd round at the Australian Open (d. Liam Broady, l. Daniil Medvedev) but did not compete at Roland Garros.

- **Prior to Wimbledon**, Kyrgios reached the semifinals at Stuttgart (I. Murray) and as a wild card at Halle (I. Hubert Hurkacz). He also reached the 2nd round at Mallorca, where he defeated Laslo Djere in the 1st round before giving a walkover to Roberto Bautista Agut due to an abdominal injury.
- Kyrgios' **other highlights in 2022** are reaching the semifinals as a wild card at Houston (I. Reilly Opelka), the quarterfinals as a wild card at Indian Wells-1000 (I. Nadal) and the round of 16 as a wild card at Miami-1000 (I. Jannik Sinner). He missed the remainder of the clay court season after his semifinal finish at Houston in April, returning to action at Stuttgart earlier this month. He is contesting his 8th tournament of the season here.
- Kyrgios is bidding to **defeat a Top 5 player at a Grand Slam for the 2nd time**. He has a 1-10 win-loss record against Top 5 players at the Grand Slams, with his only victory coming against No. 1 Nadal in the round of 16 here in 2014. He has lost all 9 matches he has contested against Top 5 players at the Grand Slams since then.
- Kyrgios is also bidding to **end a 7-match losing streak against Top 5 players at Tour-level**. He has not defeated a Top 5 player at Tour-level since defeating No. 3 Alexander Zverev in the final at 2019 Mexico. He has an 11-24 win-loss record against Top 5 players at Tour-level overall.
- Kyrgios has won all 5 **five-set matches** he has contested at Wimbledon – including his 5-set victory against Jubb in the 1st round here this year. He has a 10-3 win-loss record in 5-set matches at Tour-level overall.
- Kyrgios has won **6 Tour-level singles titles** – most recently at 2019 Washington (d. Daniil Medvedev). All 6 of his titles have come on hard courts.
- Kyrgios reached a **career-high ranking** of No. 13 in October 2016. He re-entered the Top 50 following his semifinal finish at Halle earlier last month and plays here at No. 40 – his highest-ranking since August 2020.
- Kyrgios **won the 2022 Australian Open men's doubles title** as a wild card team alongside Thanasi Kokkinakis, with the pair defeating fellow Australians Matthew Ebden/Max Purcell in the final. They became the first all-Australian team to win a Grand Slam men's doubles title since Todd Woodbridge/Mark Woodforde at 2000 Wimbledon and the first wild card team in history to win the Australian Open men's doubles title.
- Kyrgios is a **2-time Wimbledon junior doubles champion**, winning the title in both 2012 (with Andrew Harris) and 2013 (with Kokkinakis). His best performance in the boys' singles here was reaching the quarterfinals in 2012 (I. Gianluigi Quinzi). He also won the 2012 Roland Garros boys' doubles title (with Harris) and the 2013 Australian Open boys' singles title (d. Kokkinakis) and reached the junior No. 1 ranking in January 2013.
- Kyrgios has played **Davis Cup** for Australia since 2013 and has an 11-6 overall win-loss record in the competition. Australia will compete in Hamburg alongside France, Germany and Belgium in Group C at the 2022 Davis Cup Finals.
- Kyrgios is currently without a permanent coach.

- **FRITZ** is bidding to reach the round of 16 here for the first time and equal his best Grand Slam result. This is his 6th Wimbledon appearance and his 24th Grand Slam overall.
- Fritz is one of 4 American men contesting 3rd round matches today – all of whom are bidding to join compatriots Tommy Paul and Frances Tiafoe in the round of 16 here. If all 4 American men win today, it will be the **first time that 6 American men have reached the round of 16 at Wimbledon since 1993**.

- Fritz advanced to the 2nd round here after defeating Lorenzo Musetti 64 64 63 in the 1st round on Tuesday and wild card Alastair Gray 63 76(3) 63 in the 2nd round on Thursday.
- By reaching the 3rd round here, Fritz has equalled his **best Wimbledon result**. He also reached the 3rd round here last year, when he defeated Brandon Nakashima and Steve Johnson before falling to Alexander Zverev.
- Fritz's **best Grand Slam result** is reaching the round of 16 at the Australian Open this year. As No. 20 seed, he defeated Maximilian Marterer, Frances Tiafoe and Roberto Bautista Agut before falling to Stefanos Tsitsipas.
- **Elsewhere at the Grand Slams this year**, Fritz reached in the 2nd round at Roland Garros (d. Santiago Fa Rodriguez Taverna, I. Bernabe Zapata Miralles).
- Fritz's **best result in 2022** is winning the title at Indian Wells-1000 (d. Rafael Nadal). It was his 2nd Tour-level title and his first at Masters-1000 level and saw him become the first American man to win at Indian Wells since Andre Agassi in 2001.
- Prior to Wimbledon, Fritz won his **3rd Tour-level title** at Eastbourne, defeating Maxime Cressy in the final. He lost his opening match at both 's-Hertogenbosch (l. Tim van Rijthoven) at Queen's (l. Jack Draper).
- Fritz's **other highlights in 2022** are reaching the quarterfinals at Dallas (l. Marcos Giron), Houston (l. Cristian Garin) and Monte Carlo-1000 (l. Alejandro Davidovich Fokina)

- Fritz is **one of 10 players competing here this year to have won multiple Tour-level titles on grass**. In addition to his title-victory at Eastbourne last week, he also won the title at Eastbourne in 2019 (d. Sam Querrey).
- Fritz is one of 8 American men to reach the 3rd round here from the 16 who began the main draw this year – **the highest number of American men to reach the 3rd round at a Grand Slam since the 1996 US Open**, when there were 8 American men in the 3rd round. It is the highest number of American men to reach the 3rd round at Wimbledon since 1995, when there were 9 American men in the 3rd round.
- Fritz is also one of 5 seeded American men to reach the 3rd round here from the 6 who began the main draw this year – **the highest number of American seeds to begin the men's singles at Wimbledon since 1993**, when there were also 6 seeded American men here. At No. 11, Fritz is the highest seeded American man at Wimbledon this year.
- Fritz has won one of the 2 **five-set matches** he has contested at Wimbledon, having defeated Johnson in 5 sets the 2nd round here last year but fallen to Zverev in 5 sets in the 2nd round here in 2018. He has a 7-7 win-loss record in 5-set matches at Tour-level overall.
- Fritz **broke the Top 20 for the first time** after his round of 16 finish at the Australian Open in January this year. He reached a career-high ranking of No. 13 in March and plays here one place lower at No. 14.
- Fritz is a **former junior world No. 1**. He was named 2015 ITF Junior World Champion after winning the boys' singles title at the 2015 US Open (d. Tommy Paul). He also finished as runner-up in the boys' singles at 2015 Roland Garros (l. Paul). His best result in the boys' singles here was reaching the semifinals in 2015 (l. Reilly Opelka).
- Fritz made his **Davis Cup** debut in 2019 and has a 3-1 win-loss record in the competition. He defeated Alejandro Gonzalez in straight sets during USA's victory over Colombia in the 2022 Qualifiers in March. USA will compete in Glasgow alongside Great Britain, Kazakhstan and Netherlands in Group D at the 2022 Davis Cup Finals.
- Both of Fritz's parents were professional tennis players. His mother, Kathy May, is a former Top 10 player.
- Fritz is coached by Michael Russell, Paul Annacone and David Nainkin.
- Lefthander **MOLCAN** is bidding to reach the round of 16 at a Grand Slam for the first time on his Wimbledon debut. This is his 4th Grand Slam overall.
- Molcan is bidding to become the **3rd Slovakian man in the Open Era to reach the round of 16 at Wimbledon** – after Miloslav Mecir (who reached the round of 16 here in 1986 and 1988) and Karol Kucera (1999).
- Molcan is also bidding to become the **6th Slovakian man in the Open Era to reach the round of 16 at a Grand Slam** – and the first since Martin Klizan reached the last 16 at the 2012 US Open. Dominik Hrbaty (9 Grand Slam round of 16 appearances), Mecir (8), Kucera (4), and Karol Beck and Klizan (both one) are the only Slovakian men to reach the round of 16 at a Grand Slam in the Open Era.
- Molcan and Jenson Brooksby are bidding to join fellow Wimbledon debutants Tommy Paul and Tim van Rijthoven in the round of 16 here. If both Brooksby and Molcan win today and reach the round of 16 here, it will be the **first time that 4 men have reached the round of 16 on their Wimbledon debuts since 1973** – when Bjorn Borg, Robert McKinley, Bernie Mitton and Hans-Jurgen Pohmann all reached the last 16 on their first appearances here.
- If one of Molcan or Brooksby win today and reach the round of 16 here, it will be the **first time that 3 men have reached the round of 16 on their Wimbledon debuts since 1996** – when Neville Godwin, Thomas Johansson and Alex Radulescu all reached the last 16 on their first appearances here.
- Molcan advanced to the 3rd round here after defeating Pedro Martinez 46 64 64 61 in the 1st round on Tuesday and Marcos Giron 63 62 64 in the 2nd round on Thursday for his **first Wimbledon match-wins**.
- By reaching the 3rd round here, Molcan has equalled his **best Grand Slam result**. He also reached the 3rd round as a qualifier on his Grand Slam debut at the 2021 US Open, when he defeated Cem Ilkel and Brandon Nakashima before falling to Diego Schwartzman.
- **In Grand Slam play this year**, Molcan reached the 2nd round at both the Australian Open (d. Roman Safiullin, l. Pablo Andujar) and Roland Garros (d. Federico Coria, l. Novak Djokovic).

- **Last year here**, Molcan fell in the final round of qualifying. He defeated Ernesto Escobedo and Damir Dzumhur before falling to Antoine Hoang. It was his first appearance in qualifying at a Grand Slam.
- Molcan's best results in 2022 are reaching his **2nd and 3rd Tour-level finals** at Marrakech (l. David Goffin) and Lyon (l. Cameron Norrie), respectively. He also reached the quarterfinals at Melbourne (l. Emil Ruusuvuori). At Challenger-level, he reached the quarterfinals at the Marbella Challenger (ESP) (l. Jaume Munar).
- **Prior to Wimbledon**, Molcan reached the 2nd round at Mallorca (d. Miomir Kecmanovic, l. Tallon Griekspoor) but fell in the 1st round at Halle (l. Griekspoor). His victory against Kecmanovic in the 1st round at Mallorca was his first Tour-level match-win on grass.
- Molcan is bidding to **defeat a Top 20 player for the 2nd time**. He has a 1-3 win-loss record against Top 20 players, with his only victory coming against No. 9 Felix Auger-Aliassime in the 2nd round at Marrakech this year. He lost his only previous match against a Top 20 player at the Grand Slams – to No. 1 Djokovic in the 2nd round at Roland Garros this year.
- Molcan **broke the Top 50 for the first time** after reaching the final at Marrakech in April this year. He reached a career-high ranking of No. 38 the same month. He plays here at No. 51.
- Molcan was a **good junior**, reaching a career-high junior ranking of No. 18 in March 2015. His best result in the boys' singles here was reaching the 2nd round in 2014 (d. Nicolas Alvarez, l. Johan Sebastien Tatlot).
- Molcan made his **Davis Cup** during Slovakia's World Group I victory over Chile in September 2021, but lost the only match he has contested in the competition to date, falling to Cristian Garin in the opening match of the tie. Slovakia will host Romania in a World Group I tie in September.
- Molcan is coached by Ladislav Simon.

## NO. 19 ALEX DE MINAUR (AUS) v (WC) LIAM BROADY (GBR)

### Head-to-head: De Minaur leads 1-0

A 2nd meeting for De Minaur and Broady – and their first at a Grand Slam. De Minaur won in straight sets when the pair met on grass in the 2nd round at Eastbourne last year.

De Minaur has never lost a Grand Slam match to a player ranked as low as No. 132 Broady. The lowest-ranked player to defeat De Minaur at the Grand Slams is No. 110 Marco Cecchinato in the 1st round at 2020 Roland Garros. The lowest-ranked player to defeat De Minaur at Wimbledon is No. 71 Steve Johnson in the 2nd round in 2019.

De Minaur is facing a wild card at a Grand Slam for the first time today. He has an 8-2 win-loss record against wild cards at Tour-level overall.

De Minaur is facing a lefthanded British player for the 2nd straight round. He defeated Jack Draper in his first match against a British player at Wimbledon in the 2nd round on Thursday. He has a 5-4 win-loss record against British players at Tour-level overall.

De Minaur has won 2 of his 5 previous matches against lefthanders at the Grand Slams – with his 2 victories coming against Bradley Klahn in the 1st round at 2019 Roland Garros and against Draper in the 2nd round here this year. He has a 14-13 win-loss record against lefthanders at Tour-level overall.

This is the 5th meeting between an Australian and a Brit in the men's singles here this year. The Australians lead the Brits 3-1 in men's matches at Wimbledon this year – Andy Murray defeated James Duckworth in the 1st round on Monday, before Jason Kubler defeated Daniel Evans and Nick Kyrgios defeated Paul Jubb in the 1st round on Tuesday, and De Minaur defeated Draper in the 2nd round on Thursday.

Australian players lead British players 53-28 in previous men's singles meetings between the 2 nations at Wimbledon in the Open Era. Australians also lead 100-83 in previous Grand Slam men's singles meetings between the 2 nations in the Open Era.

- De Minaur and fellow Australians Jason Kubler and Nick Kyrgios are bidding to reach the round of 16 here today. If all 3 Australians win, it will be the **first time 3 Australian men have reached the round of 16 at a Grand Slam since 2002 Wimbledon** – when Wayne Arthurs, Lleyton Hewitt and Mark Philippoussis all reached the round of 16 here.
- If any of De Minaur, Kubler and Kyrgios win today, they will become the **first Australian man to reach the round of 16 at Wimbledon since 2016** – when Kyrgios and Bernard Tomic both reached the round of 16 here.
- De Minaur and Kubler are bidding to become the **37th and 38th Australian men in the Open Era to reach the round of 16 at Wimbledon**. No Australian man has reached the round of 16 here since 2016. (NB Kyrgios is bidding to reach the round of 16 here for the 4th time)

- De Minaur advanced to the 2nd round here after defeating Hugo Dellien 61 63 75 in the 1st round on Tuesday and Jack Draper 57 76(0) 62 63 in the 2nd round on Wednesday.
- By reaching the 3rd round here, De Minaur has equalled his **best Wimbledon result**. He also reached the 3rd round on his debut here in 2018, when he defeated Marco Cecchinato and Pierre-Hugues Herbert before falling to Rafael Nadal. Last year here, De Minaur fell to Sebastian Korda in the 1st round.
- De Minaur's **best Grand Slam result** is reaching the quarterfinals at the 2020 US Open, where he fell to eventual champion Dominic Thiem in straight sets.
- **In Grand Slam play this year**, De Minaur reached the round of 16 at the Australian Open – where he defeated Lorenzo Musetti, Kamil Majchrzak and Pablo Andujar before falling to Jannik Sinner – but fell to Hugo Gaston in 5 sets in the 1st round at Roland Garros.
- De Minaur's **best results in 2022** are reaching the semifinals at Barcelona (l. Carlos Alcaraz) and Lyon (l. Alex Molcan) and the quarterfinals at Rotterdam (l. Stefanos Tsitsipas).
- **Prior to Wimbledon**, De Minaur reached the semifinals at Eastbourne (l. Taylor Fritz). He also reached the 2nd round at Queen's (d. Reilly Opelka, l. Alejandro Davidovich Fokina) but lost his opening match at 's-Hertogenbosch (l. Adrian Mannarino).
- De Minaur lost the only **5-set match** he has contested at Wimbledon – falling to Steve Johnson in 5 sets in the 2nd round in 2019. He has a 3-4 win-loss record in 5-set matches at Tour-level overall.
- De Minaur has won **5 Tour-level singles titles** – including one on grass, at 2021 Eastbourne (d. Lorenzo Sonego).
- De Minaur broke the Top 20 for the first time in October 2019 and reached a **career-high ranking** of No. 15 in June last year. He plays here at No. 27.
- De Minaur is a **former Wimbledon boys' singles finalist**. He reached the boys' singles final here in 2016 (l. Denis Shapovalov). He reached a career-high junior ranking of No. 2 in February 2016 and also reached the semifinals of the boys' singles at the 2015 US Open (l. Tommy Paul) and the 2016 Australian Open (l. Jurabek Karimov).
- De Minaur made his **Davis Cup** debut in 2018 and has a 7-5 win-loss record in the competition. He won both matches he contested during Australia's victory over Hungary in the 2022 Qualifiers in March. Australia will compete in Hamburg alongside France, Germany and Belgium in Group C at the 2022 Davis Cup Finals.
- De Minaur is coached by Adolfo Gutierrez.
- Wild card **BROADY** is bidding to reach the round of 16 at a Grand Slam for the first time. This is his 5th Wimbledon appearance and his 7th Grand Slam overall.
- If Broady wins today and joins fellow Brit Cameron Norrie in the round of 16 here, it will be the **first time that 2 British men have reached the round of 16 at Wimbledon since 2002** – when Tim Henman and Greg Rusedski both reached the last 16 here. It would also be the first time that 2 British men have reached the round of 16 at a Grand Slam since the 2017 Australian Open – when Daniel Evans and Andy Murray both reached the last 16.
- If Broady and fellow Brit Katie Boulter (who plays against Harmony Tan in a women's singles 3rd round match) both win today and join Norrie and Heather Watson in the round of 16 here, it will be the **first time that 4 British players have reached the round of 16 at a Grand Slam since 1975 Wimbledon** – when Lindsay Beaven, Glynis Coles, Graham Stilwell, Virginia Wade and Winnie Wooldridge all reached the last 16 here.
- If either Broady or Boulter win today and join Norrie and Watson in the round of 16 here, it will be the **first time that 3 British players have reached the round of 16 at Wimbledon since 1979** – when Wade, Mark Cox and Deborah Jevans all reached the last 16 here. It would also be the first time that 3 British players have reached the round of 16 at a Grand Slam since the 2017 Australian Open – when Evans, Murray and Johanna Konta all reached the last 16.
- Broady is bidding to become the **12th wild card to reach the round of 16 at Wimbledon in the Open Era** – and the 2nd wild card to reach the round of 16 here this year, after Tim van Rijthoven. Prior to Van Rijthoven, the last wild card to reach the round of 16 here was Denis Kudla in 2015.

- If Broady wins today and joins Van Rijthoven in the round of 16 here, it will be the **first time that 2 wild cards have reached the round of 16 at Wimbledon since 1990** – when Pat Cash and Mark Woodforde both reached the last 16 here as wild cards. It would also be the first time that 2 wild cards have reached the round of 16 at a Grand Slam since 2002 Roland Garros – when Arnaud di Pasquale and Paul-Henri Mathieu both reached the last 16 as wild cards.
- Broady advanced to the 3rd round here after defeating qualifier Lukas Klein 46 63 75 67(2) 63 in the 1st round on Tuesday and No. 12 seed Diego Schwartzman 62 46 06 76(6) 61 in the 2nd round on Thursday.
- By reaching the 2nd round here, Broady has equalled his **best Grand Slam result**. He has reached the 2nd round at a Grand Slam twice before – on his Grand Slam debut as a wild card here in both 2015 (d. Matosevic, l. David Goffin) and 2021 (d. Marco Cecchinato, l. Schwartzman).
- **In Grand Slam play this year**, Broady qualified for the main draw for the first time at the Australian Open, falling to Nick Kyrgios in the 1st round. He reached the 2nd round of qualifying at Roland Garros (d. Renzo Olivo, l. Geoffrey Blancaneaux).
- **Prior to Wimbledon**, Broady competed as a wild card at Queen's, falling to Marin Cilic in the 1st round. He also attempted to qualify at Eastbourne, reaching the 2nd round of qualifying (d. Hugo Gaston, l. John Millman). At Challenger-level on grass this year, he reached the quarterfinals at the Nottingham Challenger (GBR) – where he defeated Constant Lestienne and Otto Virtanen before falling to Jack Sock – and the 2nd round at the Surbiton Challenger (GBR) (d. Jay Clarke, l. Denis Kudla).
- Broady is bidding to record his **4th Tour-level match-win of 2022**. Prior to Wimbledon, his only Tour-level victory this season came in a 2nd round finish as a qualifier at Dallas (d. Peter Gojowczyk, l. Marcos Giron). He has lost in the 1st round on his 4 other Tour-level appearances this year – as a qualifier at the Australian Open, Delray Beach (l. Adrian Mannarino), Indian Wells-1000 (l. Miomir Kecmanovic) and Queen's.
- Broady's **best Challenger-level result in 2022** is reaching the semifinals at the Phoenix Challenger (USA) (l. Daniel Altmaier).
- Broady has won all 3 **five-set matches** he has contested at Tour-level. In addition to his 5-set victories in the opening 2 rounds here this year, he also defeated Marinko Matosevic in 5 sets in the 1st round here in 2015. He lost the only other 5-set match he has contested, at any level, falling to Gregoire Barrere in the final round of qualifying here in 2019.
- Broady is one of **6 lefthanders** through to the 3rd round from the 22 who started the men's singles draw here this year. Nadal was the last lefthander to win the title here in 2010.
- Broady reached a **career-high ranking** of No. 116 in February this year. He plays here at No. 132.
- Broady was ranked No. 2 in the ITF junior rankings in 2012. He finished **runner-up in the boys' singles at 2011 Wimbledon** (l. Luke Saville) and at the 2012 US Open (l. Filip Peliwo). He also won the 2010 Junior Wimbledon doubles title with Tom Farquharson and the 2012 Junior Australian Open doubles title with Joshua Ward-Hibbert.
- Broady is coached by David Sammel.

- Van de Zandschulp is bidding to become **the 10th Dutchman to reach the round of 16 at Wimbledon in the Open Era** – and the 2nd Dutchman to reach the last 16 here this year after Tim van Rijthoven. Prior to this year, the last Dutchman to reach the round of 16 here was Sjeng Schalken in 2004. Van de Zandschulp and Van Rijthoven are the first Dutch players to reach the 3rd round here since Igor Sijsling in 2013.
- If Van de Zandschulp wins today and joins Van Rijthoven in the round of 16 here, it will be the **first time that 2 Dutchmen have reached the round of 16 at a Grand Slam since 2002 Wimbledon** – when Schalken and Richard Krajicek both reached the round of 16.
- Van de Zandschulp advanced to the 3rd round here after defeating Feliciano Lopez 62 63 63 in the 1st round on Tuesday and Emil Ruusuvuori 36 61 64 64 in the 2nd round on Thursday.
- By reaching the 3rd round here, Van de Zandschulp has recorded his **best Wimbledon result**. On his only previous appearance here, as a lucky loser last year, he reached the 2nd round (d. Gregoire Barrere, l. Matteo Berrettini).
- Van de Zandschulp's **best Grand Slam result** is reaching the quarterfinals as a qualifier at the 2021 US Open. He defeated Carlos Taberner, Casper Ruud, Facundo Bagnis and Diego Schwartzman before falling to Daniil Medvedev in the last 8. He became the 3rd qualifier in the Open Era to reach the men's singles quarterfinals at the US Open – after Nicolas Escude (1999) and Gilles Muller (2008) – and the first Dutchman to reach the quarterfinals at a Grand Slam since Schalken at 2004 Wimbledon.
- By reaching the 3rd round here, Van de Zandschulp has **recorded a 3rd round finish (or better) at 4 consecutive Grand Slam events**. In addition to his quarterfinal finish at the 2021 US Open, he reached the 3rd round at both the Australian Open (l. Medvedev) and Roland Garros (l. Rafael Nadal) this year.
- **Prior to Wimbledon**, Van de Zandschulp reached his first Tour-level semifinal on grass at Queen's, where he defeated Paul Jubb, Grigor Dimitrov and Alejandro Davidovich Fokina before falling to Matteo Berrettini. He fell in the 1st round at both 's-Hertogenbosch (l. Ruusuvuori) and Mallorca (l. Marcos Giron).
- Van de Zandschulp's best result in 2022 is reaching his **first Tour-level final** at Munich, where he retired due to illness during the first set against Holger Rune. His other highlights this year are reaching the quarterfinals at Melbourne (l. Dimitrov) and Marrakech (l. Alex Molcan).
- Van de Zandschulp is bidding to record his **7th Tour-level match-win on grass**. Prior to coming here this year, his only previous Tour-level victories on grass came in his 2nd round finish at Wimbledon last year and in his semifinal finish at Queen's last month.

- Van de Zandschulp has a 3-1 win-loss record in **5-set matches**. He has recorded 2 successful comebacks from 0-2 down – against Hubert Hurkacz in the 1st round at 2021 Roland Garros last year and against Taberner in the 1st round at the 2021 US Open last year.
- Van de Zandschulp broke the Top 50 for the first time in January this year. He plays here at a **career-high ranking** of No. 25.
- Van de Zandschulp made his **Davis Cup** debut for Netherlands in 2019 and has a 2-1 win-loss record in the competition. He won the only match he contested during Netherlands' victory over Canada in the 2022 Qualifiers in March, defeating Alexis Galarneau in straight sets. Netherlands will compete in Glasgow alongside USA, Great Britain and Kazakhstan in Group D at the 2022 Davis Cup Finals.
- Van de Zandschulp is coached by Peter Lucassen.
- **GASQUET** is bidding to reach the round of 16 here for the 8th time – and for the first time since 2016. This is his 16th Wimbledon appearance and 67th Grand Slam overall.
- Gasquet is bidding to reach the last 16 at Wimbledon for the 8th time and extend his **Open Era record for the most Wimbledon round of 16 appearances by a Frenchman** – ahead of Jo-Wilfried Tsonga (6 Wimbledon round of 16 appearances), and Guy Forget, Henri Leconte and Cedric Pioline (all 5).
- Gasquet is bidding to reach the last 16 at a Grand Slam for the 23rd time. He is in **2nd place on the Open Era list for most Grand Slam round of 16 appearances by a Frenchman** – behind Tsonga, who has reached the round of 16 at the Grand Slams on 25 occasions.
- At 36 years 22 days, Gasquet is bidding to become the **7th man in the Open Era to reach the round of 16 at Wimbledon aged 36 or older** – after Mark Cox, Roger Federer, Pancho Gonzales, Ivo Karlovic, Niki Pilic and Ken Rosewall. (NB Rafael Nadal, who is 15 days older than Gasquet, is also bidding to reach the round of 16 here this year; ages calculated at the end of the tournament)
- Gasquet is bidding to record his 32nd Wimbledon match-win and equal Tsonga's **Open Era record Wimbledon match-wins by a Frenchman**. By winning his opening match here, he became the 7th active male player to record 30 match-wins at Wimbledon.
- Gasquet is bidding to record his 114th Grand Slam match-win. He is in **3rd place on the Open Era list for most Grand Slam match-wins by a Frenchman** – behind Tsonga (121) and Gael Monfils (118).
- Gasquet advanced to the 3rd round here after defeating Joao Sousa 76(7) 62 46 46 63 in the 1st round on Tuesday and Mackenzie McDonald 63 36 64 63 in the 2nd round on Thursday.
- **Last year here**, Gasquet defeated Yuichi Sugita in the 1st round for his first Wimbledon match-win since 2016 before falling to Federer in the 2nd round.
- Gasquet's **best Grand Slam result** is reaching the semifinals on 3 occasions – including twice at Wimbledon, in 2007 (l. Federer) and 2015 (l. Djokovic). He also reached the semifinals at the 2013 US Open (l. Rafael Nadal).

- Gasquet has won **15 Tour-level titles** – including 3 on grass, at Nottingham in 2005 (d. Max Mirnyi) and 2006 (d. Jonas Bjorkman), and at 2018 's-Hertogenbosch (d. Jeremy Chardy).
- Gasquet's 5-set victory against Sousa in the 1st round here was the first **5-set match** he has contested since defeating Thanasi Kokkinakis in 5 sets in the 1st round at the 2015 US Open. He has a 4-3 win-loss record in 5-set matches at Wimbledon and a 12-13 win-loss record in 5-set matches at Tour-level overall.

- Gasquet is a **former Top 10 player**, having reached a career-high ranking of No. 7 in July 2007. He dropped to No. 87 in November last year – his lowest ranking since April 2005 – but plays here at No. 69.
- Gasquet was a **successful junior**. He ended the 2002 season as junior world No. 1 after winning the boys' singles titles at Roland Garros (d. Laurent Recouderc) and the US Open (d. Marcos Baghdatis), and finishing runner-up in the boys' singles at the Australian Open (l. Todd Reid). He never contested the junior event at Wimbledon.
- Gasquet has played **Davis Cup** since 2005 and has an 18-13 overall win-loss record in the competition. He was a member of France's winning team in 2017, winning the doubles match in the final against Belgium alongside Pierre-Hugues Herbert. He was also a member of the team which finished as runners-up to Switzerland in 2014. France will compete in Hamburg alongside Germany, Belgium and Australia in Group C at the 2022 Davis Cup Finals.
- Gasquet is coached by Julien Cassaingé.

- Brooksby advanced to the 3rd round here after defeating qualifier Mikhail Kukushkin 63 62 63 in the 1st round on Tuesday and Benjamin Bonzi 76(3) 75 63 in the 2nd round on Thursday for his **first Wimbledon match-wins**.
- Brooksby's **best Grand Slam result** is reaching the round of 16 as a wild card at the 2021 US Open, where he defeated Mikael Ymer, Taylor Fritz and Aslan Karatsev before falling to Novak Djokovic. Aged 20 years 321 days, he became the youngest American man to reach the round of 16 at the US Open since Andy Roddick (19 years 10 days) in 2001.

- Sock advanced to the 3rd round here after defeating qualifier Bernabe Zapata Miralles 76(6) 64 64 in the 1st round on Tuesday and Maxime Cressy 64 64 36 76(1) in a 2nd round match that began on Thursday and was completed on Friday. His victories in the opening 2 rounds here were his **first Wimbledon match-wins since 2017**.
- As No. 14 seed, Sock defeated Andrea Collarini (ARG) 64 62, Constant Lestienne (FRA) 63 75 and No. 21 seed Hugo Grenier (FRA) 75 75 64 in the **3 rounds of Wimbledon qualifying**. It was his first appearance in qualifying here since 2013.

- By reaching the 3rd round here, Sock has equalled **best Wimbledon result**. He also reached the 3rd round here in 2016 when, as No. 27 seed, he defeated Ernests Gulbis and Robin Haase before falling to Milos Raonic.
- Sock's **best Grand Slam result** is reaching the round of 16 on 2 occasions – at 2015 Roland Garros (l. Rafael Nadal) and at the 2016 US Open (l. Jo-Wilfried Tsonga).
- Sock is making his **first Wimbledon appearance** since 2018, when he fell to Matteo Berrettini in the 1st round.
- **In Grand Slam play this year**, Sock fell to Daniel Masur in the 1st round of qualifying at Roland Garros. He did not compete in qualifying at the Australian Open.
- Sock is bidding to record his **6th Tour-level match-win of 2022**. Prior to Wimbledon, his only Tour-level match-wins this season came in 2nd round finishes as a wild card at Dallas (d. Oscar Otte, l. Taylor Fritz), Delray Beach (d. Daniel Altmaier, l. Reilly Opelka) and Indian Wells-1000 (d. Juan Manuel Cerundolo, l. Stefanos Tsitsipas).
- **Prior to Wimbledon**, Sock reached the final at the Ilkley Challenger (GBR) (l. Zizou Bergs) and the semifinals at the Nottingham Challenger (GBR) (l. Daniel Evans).
- Also in 2022, Sock **won his 4th career Challenger title** at Savannah (USA) (d. Christian Harrison). His other highlights at Challenger-level this year are reaching the quarterfinals at the Columbus Challenger (USA) (l. Dominic Stricker) and the Sarasota Challenger (USA) (l. Denis Kudla).
- Sock's **best Tour-level results on grass** are reaching the semifinals at Newport in both 2014 (l. Lleyton Hewitt) and 2015 (l. Ivo Karlovic).
- Sock is one of 8 American men to reach the 3rd round here from the 16 who began the main draw this year – **the highest number of American men to reach the 3rd round at a Grand Slam since the 1996 US Open**, when there were 8 American men in the 3rd round. It is the highest number of American men to reach the 3rd round at Wimbledon since 1995, when there were 9 American men in the 3rd round.
- Sock lost both **5-set matches** he has contested at Wimbledon – falling to Sebastian Ofner in the 2nd round in 2017 and to Berrettini in the 1st round in 2018. He has a 6-5 win-loss record in 5-set matches at Tour-level overall.
- Sock is a **former Top 10 player**, having reached a career-high ranking of No. 8 in November 2017. He dropped outside the Top 100 in October 2018 and was unranked between October 2019 and February 2020. He plays here at No. 103.
- Sock **won the US Open boys' singles title** as a wild card in 2010 (d. Kudla). He contested just 5 events during his junior career and never competed in the junior tournament at Wimbledon.
- Sock is coached by Robby Ginepri, who reached the round of 16 here in 2004.
- Qualifier **KUBLER** is bidding to reach the round of 16 at a Grand Slam for the first time. This is his 2nd Wimbledon appearance and his 7th Grand Slam overall.
- Kubler and fellow Australians Alex de Minaur and Nick Kyrgios are bidding to reach the round of 16 here today. If all 3 Australians win, it will be the **first time 3 Australian men have reached the round of 16 at a Grand Slam since 2002 Wimbledon** – when Wayne Arthurs, Lleyton Hewitt and Mark Philippoussis all reached the round of 16 here.
- If any of Kubler, De Minaur and Kyrgios win today, they will become the **first Australian man to reach the round of 16 at Wimbledon since 2016** – when Kyrgios and Bernard Tomic both reached the round of 16 here.
- Kubler and De Minaur are bidding to become the **37th and 38th Australian men in the Open Era to reach the round of 16 at Wimbledon**. No Australian man has reached the round of 16 here since 2016. (NB Kyrgios is bidding to reach the round of 16 here for the 4th time)
- Kubler advanced to the 3rd round here after defeating No. 28 seed Daniel Evans 61 64 63 in the 1st round on Tuesday and qualifier Dennis Novak 63 64 64 in a 2nd round match that began on Thursday and was completed on Friday. His victories in the opening 2 rounds here were his **first Tour-level match-wins on grass**.
- As No. 2 seed, Kubler defeated Cem Ilkel (TUR) 36 75 62, Thiago Tirante (ARG) 63 36 75 and No. 24 seed Elias Ymer (SWE) 63 62 64 in the **3 rounds of Wimbledon qualifying**. It was the 2nd time he has successfully qualified

for the main draw here on his 4th attempt and the 3rd time he has successfully qualified for the main draw at a Grand Slam on his 12th attempt.

- By reaching the 3rd round here, Kubler has recorded his **best Grand Slam result**. His previous best result at the Grand Slams was reaching the 2nd round on 2 occasions – as a wild card at the 2018 US Open (d. Roberto Bautista Agut, I. Taylor Fritz) and as a qualifier at Roland Garros this year (d. Denis Kudla, I. Cameron Norrie).
- **Also in Grand Slam play this year**, Kubler reached the 2nd round of qualifying at the Australian Open (d. Lorenzo Giustino, I. Tomas Martin Etcheverry). His appearance at Roland Garros this year was his first Grand Slam appearance since the 2019 Australian Open.
- **On his only previous main draw appearance here**, as a qualifier in 2018, Kubler fell to Guido Pella in the 1st round. He was ranked too low to enter Wimbledon qualifying in 2021.
- Kubler is **contesting his 2nd Tour-level event this year**. His only appearance at Tour-level in 2022 came in his 2nd round finish at Roland Garros.
- Kubler has **played mostly at Challenger-level in 2022**. His best result is winning his 7th Challenger title at Little Rock (USA) (d. Wu Tung-Lin). He also finished runner-up at the Orlando Challenger (USA) (I. Wu Yibing) and reached the semifinals at the Zagreb Challenger (CRO) (I. Filip Misolic). He has also won 2 ITF World Tennis Tour titles this season – in consecutive M25 events at Canberra (AUS) in March-April, defeating Tristan Schoolkate in the final at the first event and defeating Omar Jasika in the final at the 2nd event.
- Kubler is bidding to record his **7th Tour-level match-win**. In addition to his 2 victories here this year and his 2nd round finishes at both the 2018 US Open and Roland Garros this year, his only previous victories at Tour-level came in 2nd round finishes as a qualifier at 2014 Dusseldorf (d. Alessandro Giannessi, I. Denis Istomin) and as a wild card at 2021 Melbourne II (d. Lorenzo Sonego, I. Ricardas Berankis).
- Kubler is **contesting his 2nd Tour-level grass court event**. His only previous Tour-level appearance on grass came here in 2018. His best result on grass, at any level, prior to Wimbledon this year was reaching the semifinals at the 2018 Ilkley Challenger (GBR) (I. Oscar Otte). He did not contest a grass court event this season prior to appearing in qualifying here.
- Kubler reached a career-high ranking of No. 91 in October 2018. He plays here at No. 99.
- Kubler was a **successful junior**. He became junior world No. 1 in May 2010 and was a member of the Australian team which defeated Great Britain to win the 2009 Junior Davis Cup. He also reached the semifinals of the boys' singles at 2011 Wimbledon (I. Liam Broady).
- Kubler has a **hereditary knee condition** that results in a weakened meniscus around the joints. He underwent multiple surgeries in his early teens. He played almost exclusively on clay between September 2012 and June 2015 to strengthen his knee.
- Kubler is coached by Desmond Tyson.
